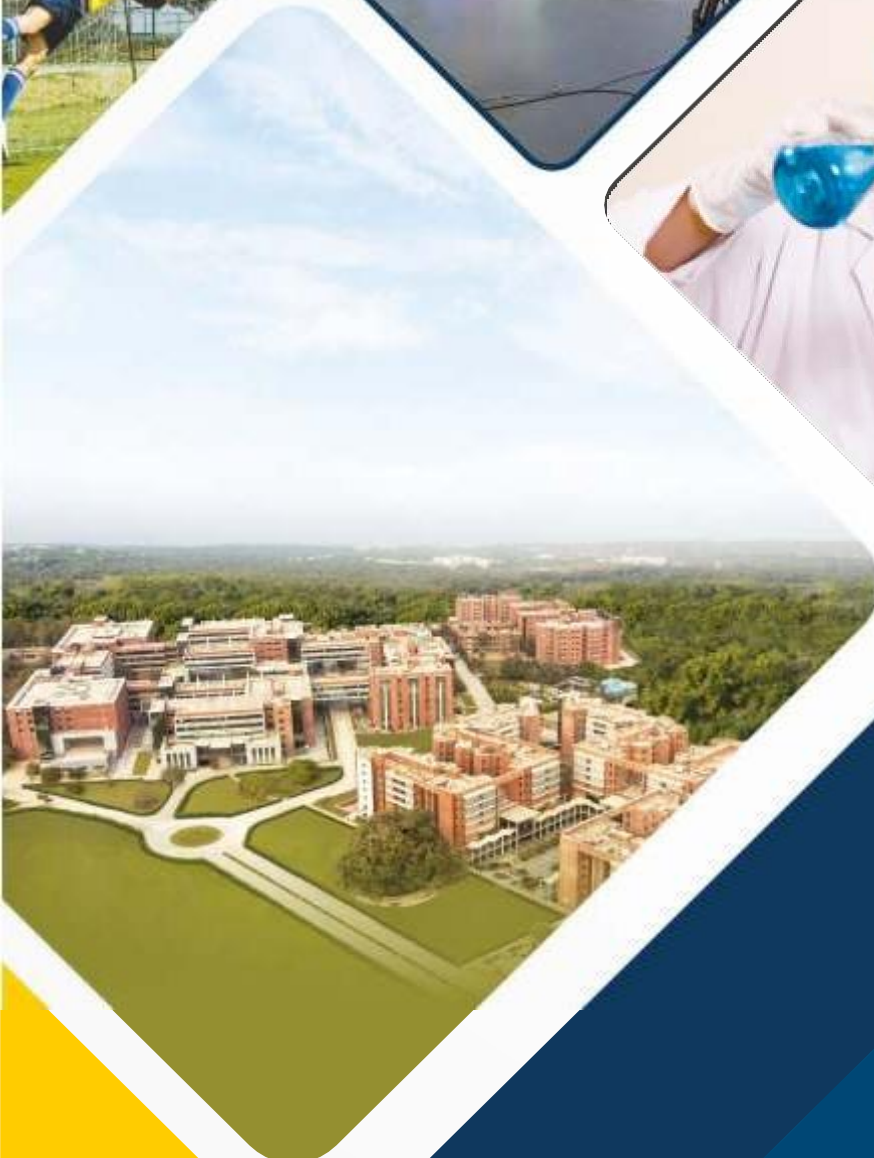

The following is the day wise detailed programme of Orientation 2021

Day1: Wednesday -September1, 2021

The eminent panellists of the discussion included Mr. Anil Bhasin, President, Havells India Ltd (Superannuated) Motivational Speaker and life Coach and Guide; Mr.Ashutosh Chadha, Director and Country head , Government affairs & Public Policy, Microsoft ; Mr.Sharad Gupta , Director -Corporate Communications & Brand Strategy, Vice President & Head - Innovation Labs, Escorts Limited ; Dr.SamirKapur, Director - Adfactors PR .The panel discussion encompassed the numerous characteristics and traits a student should cultivate in themselves to be prepare themselves for a successful future in the corporate.

Mr. Anil Bhasin shared his journey from failure to success, from starting a job in sales at a salary of Rs.1000 per month to becoming the President of Havells the fastest growing multinational in India. He emphasized the fact that the major contributors in success of a person are his or her positive attitude, acceptance and adapting change and belief in God. He also added that another significant factor of success is the efficient communication and networking.

Addressing the students Mr. Ashutosh Chadha highlighted the characteristics which are of utmost necessity in achieving success in the corporate and professional phase of life. He emphasized that attributes like teamwork, trust, ethics, dependability and leadership play a significant role in our professional life. He added that "No step, no task is small, Enjoy it and work with full dedication".

Mr. Sharad Gupta enlightened the students by sharing his rich experience of 21 years. He shared with the students that the entry to the corporate is a result of the level of the student's exposure to the corporate trends and insights of the current scenario. Mr. Manoj Sahani, Director CRC, thanked the eminent experts from the industry for sharing their experiences and motivating the students to think big and dream big to achieve their goals in life. The post lunch session commenced with psychometric profiling session organised by Amity School of Behavioural and Allied Sciences and Amity Institute of Clinical Psychology.

Prof (Dr.) Rajesh Nair, Director, Amity School of Behavioural and Allied Sciences (AIBAS) discussed the need for psychometric profiling for the students for understanding the different kinds of roles that they can play in organisations and also to determine suitable career paths for them. Psychometric profiling helps to discover one's own strengths and weaknesses and helps in better understanding and handling of various mental health issues that may often arise in individuals, Prof (Dr) Nair added. Dr. Nair also explained Psychometric Profiling tools -- Optimism Index Assessment and the Self-Esteem Assessment -- used as part of the assessment for the purposes of aptitude testing and personality testing.

The session co-ordinators, Dr Vikas Sharma, Head, Amity Institute of Clinical Psychology (AICP) and Dr. Anupama Srivastava, Associate Professor, AIBAS encouraged the students to take the Psychometric Profiling as a self-awareness exercise that would help them improve themselves by working on their weaknesses.

The session on psychometric profiling was followed by a workshop on soft skills and etiquettes conducted by Dr Reena Nigam, Head, Amity Skills Institute. Dr. Nigam spoke about the importance of skilling in the current times by referring to the 'Skill India Mission' and Prime Minister Narendra Modi's emphasis on skilling the nation. She started the workshop with the 3 C's of etiquettes namely, Consideration, Custom and Common Sense. She asked the students to be considerate to the needs of one and all, follow the customs of the place or event where one is located and apply common sense based on our surroundings and prevailing conditions. She encouraged the students to make these the Gospel of their campus lives. Dr. Nigam also apprised the participants of the various UG and PG courses under the Amity Skills Institute that they can enrol themselves in for acquiring a specified skill set.

Day2: Thursday-September3, 2021

The second day of Orientation Programme 2021 started with a presentation encompassing the overview on academic delivery and teaching learning at AUH by Prof. (Dr.) Bhavana Adhikari, Deputy Dean -Academics. Accentuating the core philosophy and vision of the research-driven Amity University, her presentation highlighted the 3 I's of academics -- Innovation, Industry integration & Internationalization -- and the 6 C's of student-centric academic framework (Choice, Collaboration, Communication, Critical Thinking, Creativity & Change) adopted by AUH. Prof. Adhikari provided the freshers essential understanding of the entire teaching-learning framework including highlights on academic programs and types of courses (major, minor & skill tracks), Choice-Based Credit System and credit requirements for different programs, various approaches of learning (blended, hybrid, flexi), MOOCs, facilities of highly rich & well-equipped central library and its digital resources, Amizone portal and other student services offered by the University.

Prof. (Dr) Adhikari also introduced the 12 Centres of Excellence of AUH, the leading centres for studies which promote expertise, intellectual discourses, and industry-collaborated R&D in diversified areas: BRICS Studies, Financial Analytics, Ocean Atmospheric Science and Technology, Robotics, Stem Cell Research, Innovation in Education, Social Business, Linguistic Studies, Child Rights & Development, Affordable Innovation and Genomics & Proteomics.

The next session evinced keenness and motivating ambience, in which Prof. (Dr.) Padmakali Banerjee, Hon'ble Pro Vice Chancellor & Dean (Academics), Head Quality and accreditation introduced the Deans, Hols and HoDs of various schools. Quoting the insightful words of Albert Einstein, "Information is not knowledge" at the outset, Prof. (Dr) Banerjee infused among freshers a sense of inspiration to acquire, process and create knowledge. She also highlighted and lauded the

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recent achievements and innovations by various schools and departments of AUH. The introduction and interaction session allowed new students to receive words of motivation and blessings to perform and leap ahead as successful and proud Amitians. The session was concluded by Dr Banerjee wishing the students best wishes for their academic journey at AUH.

The session was followed by an expert talk on 'Mental Health & Wellbeing of Students in Covid Era' by Dr. BrahmdEEP Sindhu, Chief Medical Officer, Palwal (Govt. of Haryana). Dr Sindhu commenced the session acknowledging the environment of uncertainties, stress, and issues of mental health which prevailed among students for last one and half year due to COVID19 pandemic. Citing the incident of a fire accident that happened years back in a coaching centre in Gujarat, Dr. Sindhu emphasized upon the need to stay stress-free to act and perform in challenging situations. He talked about the various factors which causes stress and anxiety to students, i.e. high expectation of parents, peer pressure, relationship issues, intrapersonal challenges, overexposure to screen, reduced social interaction, sleep deprivation etc., while sharing the disappointing facts and figures of WHO on adolescent mental health. In order to deal with mental illness, Dr Sindhu emphasized upon the preventive and remedial approach of "Psycho-social support" and recommended a set of good practices to be followed by students for staying mentally fit: incorporate physical activities (sports, yoga), meditation in daily routine, prefer outdoor games over online games, reduce exposure to screen, nutrition-centric meals,

fine-tune daily routine striking a balance between studies, nutrition and physical activities, practice group activities, have adequate sleep etc. Dr. Sindhu concluded his talk urging the students to live a healthy lifestyle to ensure their mental wellbeing.

In the following session, Dr. Anil Kumar Yadav, Deputy Director IQAC, apprised the students with Amizone, the online portal of Amity University as one-point access to all the academic and student-related services. His brief presentation guided students on how to access and perform various tasks, i.e. registration on portal, opting for various value-added and minor track courses, view attendance, examination related information and notices of events, payment of fee, filling of faculty feedback, uploading documents, etc. Dr. Yadav also detailed students about the effective use of LMS for getting benefitted by additional learning resources. Moreover, he also briefed the students about the use of Microsoft Teams, which the AUH is providing to its students as the online platform to attend online lectures, access learning materials and assignments, perform learning related chats and discussion.

The post lunch session was organised in respective schools. It began with an interactive session with the Hol, HoDs and faculty members. The freshers were also given briefing on their programs and curriculum. This was followed by an ice breaking session organised in respective schools. The details of the activity conducted by institutes/ schools is mentioned as under:

AMITY BUSINESS SCHOOL

This was an introductory session for the 1st semester students of BBA, MBA, and BA Economics. Students were asked to introduce themselves and then choose a number between 1 to 90. After the selection of the number, they got a question, and they were asked to answer the question. Questions were related to childhood memories, good/bad experiences, and imaginary situations. The main objective of the session was to make the students comfortable, and they also got a chance to know their classmates and faculties. All the students and faculty members participated and enjoyed the session. **Ice Breaking Activities-** Introduction of Students Number Game Activity

AMITY COLLEGE OF COMMERCE

The event of ice breaking was the first interactive session of the Orientation 2021, which was organised by the institute to welcome the freshers into the ACC family. The event was hosted by Tanushree Dayal, a student of B. Com (H) III semester. The interactive session started with the activity named 'WE KNOW ALL', which saw an excellent participation by all the freshers. It was followed by an activity named 'FAKE IT TILL YOU MAKE IT' where the freshers were motivated to share three statements about themselves, and their peers had to pick the fake statement among the three statements shared. This event witnessed active participation from both the students and the faculties.

The Ice breaking activity concluded with a cultural presentation which was contributed by the senior students of the

AMITY SCHOOL OF LANGUAGES

Prof. U N Singh, Dean Faculty of Arts, welcomed the students and in an interactive way highlighted them the innovative nature of Amity students citing examples of alumni. The session was primarily meant for helping the students to shed their hesitation and get acquainted with the department-and through it the university- in a fun way. For this purpose, various games/activities were organised online: i) "Gist with a twist": the aim of this exercise was to get an introduction of the students along with their hobbies and future goals. 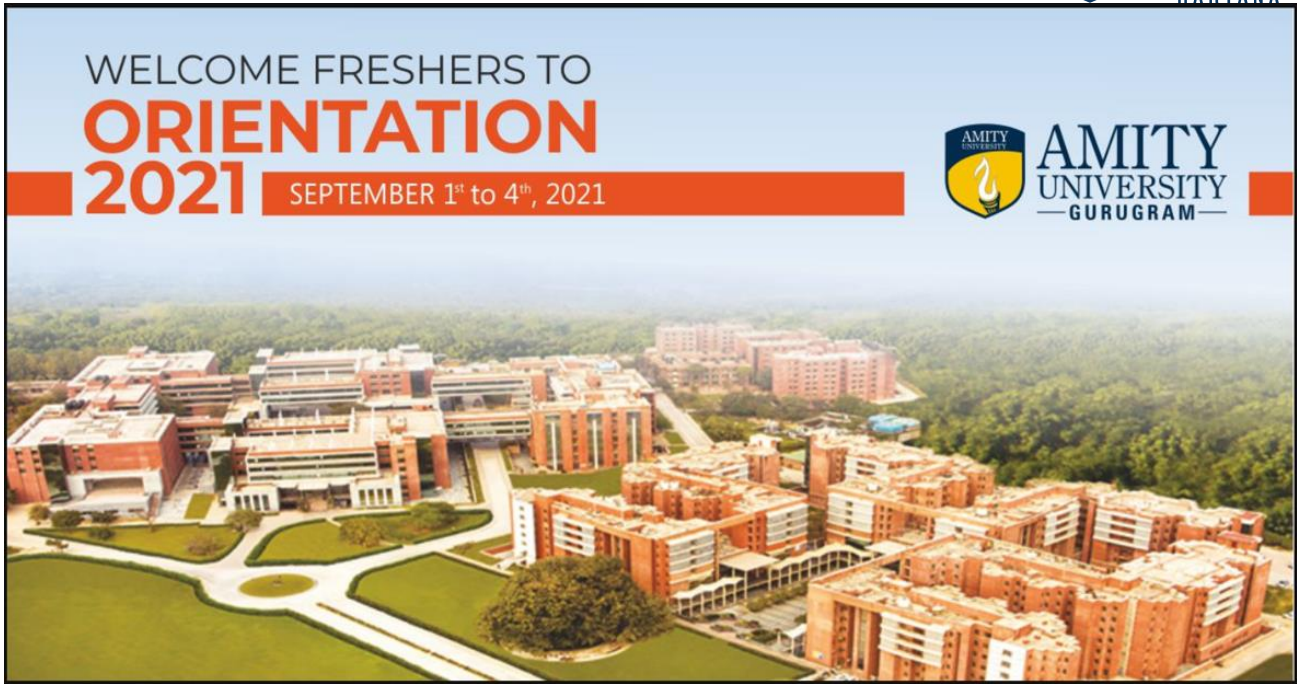

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Day3: Friday-September3, 2021

The third day of orientation commenced with a brief presentation by Dr Ravi Manuja, Registrar, AUH about the functioning of the university and various rules and regulations. He welcomed the students and discussed the importance of submitting their eligibility documents on time. He shared that the Registrar office would facilitate issuance of different important certificates, like bonafide certificates, migration certificates, transcripts, fee paid certificate for tax rebate etc. He informed the students about the grievance redressal system available on Amizone. Dr Manuja also apprised the new entrants of different scholarships available for students such as on-admission scholarship, merit cum means scholarship and merit scholarship. He further stated that students need to maintain their CGPA to avail the scholarship. He also highlighted that Amity University Haryana is a ragging-free campus. He discussed important features of Amizone for parents like checking for notices, academic calendar, fee receipts etc. There was a brief mention of facilities in the campus like ATM, dosa plaza and other cafeterias, ambulance and medical assistance and medical insurance, gym and various sports facilities. Dr Manuja concluded by advising students to work tirelessly to make their life meaningful.

This was followed by Dr ML Bansal, Controller of Examination who welcomed and congratulated students for their admission to the university. He shared the details related to examination pattern, criteria for attaining different divisions and importance of maintaining attendance above at least 75% to avoid getting debarred. He further shared that during the pandemic, examinations were conducted in online mode in multiple choice question and open book pattern on Amizone. Dr Bansal also discussed important guidelines related to examinations and concluded by saying that the only key to success is hard work.

The program proceeded with a very interesting and inspiring talk by Mr Subhash Jagota, CEO, Global Business solutions. MrJagota shared many interesting anecdotes to inspire the budding professionals to work with sincerity and perseverance. He cited the example of honorable Dr Ashok Chauhan and shared his professional journey as he is a role model for many. MrJagota stated that only graduation is not enough and shared a mix of important qualities students must focus on which included positive attitude towards life, learning a skill, execution of knowledge and being passionate to become a competent person. MrJagota concluded by motivating students to identify their strengths and further strengthen them. Students had great responses and shared that the session was inspiring for them.

The orientation program was then taken forward by Dr Gunjan M Sanjeev, Vice President, RBEF (Amity Group), Director, International Affairs. Dr Gunjan talked about various opportunities provided to the students through Study Abroad Program and shared about AUH's collaborations and linkages across the world. She also mentioned about the Distinguished Global Indian Speaker series, international exposure during Covid times, MoUs with international universities like Florida international university, USA, Tokyo/ Teikyo University Japan, University of Texas etc and shared some pictures from diverse activities in association with international universities. She further spoke about International Programs offered by the University -- Study Abroad Program-locations, 3 continent, Global study Program. The session concluded with Dr Gunjan actively responding to students' queries regarding the Study Abroad Program.

Mr Manoj Sahni, Director, CRC, Amity University Haryana, gave a brief overview of Corporate Resource Center. He highlighted the various activities and trainings conducted by CRC for the benefit of students. MrSahni also shared that during the previous year there were almost 370 companies that associated for placements despite the pandemic, including various leading MNCs and Fortune-500 companies. He shared an overview of top recruiters, students placed, responses from recruiters and alumni engagement.

The third day of Orientation 2021 resumed after a brief lunch break with 'Goal Setting' and 'Alumni Interaction' sessions being organised at the institutional level.

AMITY COLLEGE OF COMMERCE

The 3rd day of the Orientation 2021 was highlighted with the expert talk by Dr. Manmeet Bali Nag who share her words of wisdom on goal settings. The event commenced with the auspicious lamp lighting ceremony followed by the welcome address by Mr. Shiv Swaroop Jha. Dr Nag shared with us insights on setting a road map to achieve our dreams by setting attainable goals and later evaluating them on the satisfaction scale as this would motivate us to work harder to achieve our dreams.

This event was followed by alumni interaction where as many as 10 alumni joined the session to share their experiences of their journey in Amity University Haryana.

AMITY INSTITUTE OF BIOTECHNOLOGY

The goal setting session focussed on familiarising the freshers with their course and what all it covers. Dr. Amresh Prakash and Dr. Shakir Bilal gave an overview on what are the technical skills that make data science students ready for the industry. Dr. Prakash emphasized on the importance of learning programming languages and statistical analysis, while Dr. Bilal explained the various tools employed in data science. Dr. Kaustav Bandyopadhyay shared an in-depth presentation on the applications of biotechnology and how widespread it is in our everyday lives. Dr. Bandyopadhyay also talked about the jobs available to biotechnology graduates at different levels and the steps to take to excel in your studies at Amity University.

The freshers also got a chance to interact with a few alumni - Dikshpreet Raina, Amrita Singh, Shashank Saxena, Vishrut Singhal, and Priya Sherawat. They got to understand what experiences they had along with what the freshers can expect to look forward to in AUH. Alumni shared their path after graduation and the tips to succeed in the industry.

AMITY SCHOOL OF COMMUNICATION

The online Orientation programme for the newly admitted UG and PG students in ASCO, continued on 3 September 2021, with a session on 'Goal setting'. The session started with a brief presentation by Ms. Esha Jainiti. While explaining the agenda of goal setting, she pointed towards every important aspect and directions to achieve it. Ms. Jainiti spoke about 'SMARTER' goals. She suggested students that the goal must be specific, measurable, actionable, realistic, time bound, emerging and reviewed. She told the students that 'just day dreaming can't help to achieve our goals, and the students must have their short term and long-term goals'. The Deputy Director also directed the attention of the students towards the six important parts of one's goal achieving journey, i.e., career, health, hobbies, personal growth, relationships and contribution towards society. A 'Poster making competition' was also organized in which all the students were directed to make the poster on the topic 'Reflecting your Goals and Life'. The session proceeded with an alumni interaction. Both the alumni shared their journey at Amity University/They expressed their knowledge and the challenges they faced. They advised the young minds to be confident enough to reach their goal. The students got an opportunity to clear their doubts and the session ended with best wishes and on a positive note by both the alumni. The alumni expressed their gratitude towards their teachers.

AMITY INSTITUTE OF BEHAVIOURAL AND ALLIED SCIENCES

The goal setting session started with a warm welcome message from the coordinator of the event Dr. Nidhi Verma. The first part was thought provoking session on the basics of Goal setting and goal accomplishments followed by some activities on different software like menti.com, google jam board and chat boxes and online submission of forms. Participants exhibited keen interest in performing on activities on different platforms. There were three activities, Goal setting (I) where they wrote their SMART GOALS and Goal Setting (II) where they understood about SEOT i.e (Strategies, Efforts, Optimiser & Tinker) all in document shared with them. By the end of the session all such activities helped them to get a clear vision of their goals and strategies to achieve the goals. The session was concluded by showing some video clips to the students by Dr. Priyanka followed by question answer round in which Dr. Rajesh Nair shared his words of wisdom to clarify some doubts of the students.

In order to provide a platform for the freshers to interact with the passed out students an alumni interaction was organised. The alumni addressed the freshers about their field of expertise and took their queries. Ms. Dapinder Kaur talked about national and international opportunities in Psychology and address students questions about study abroad programme while Ms. Nimisha Bhatnagar presented and discussed about the opportunities of Psychology in corporate sector and also answered questions related to studying abroad. Ms. Shinasa Shahid talked about the roles and responsibilities of counselling psychologist and clinical psychologist. AMITY MEDICAL SCHOOL

Wishika Yadav, Ms. Jesbin Johnson and Avinash Kumar along with other present alumni shared their wonderful experience at Amity and guided students about job opportunities of public health field.

AMITY SCHOOL OF ARCHITECTURE AND PLANNING

The main aim behind goal setting session was to guide the students for attaining specialisation in a particular domain of Planning. Numerous research area/agenda pertaining to urban and regional planning were presented by Dr. Dreshore, Associate Professor, Amity School of Architecture and Planning for the freshers. The presentation has attempted to elaborate various infrastructure challenges faced by the Indian cities and suggested solutions for the same. Another presentation on 'Importance of Geographical Information System in Planning' was given by Ms. Kumudhanwantri. She discussed the usage of GIS software in several realm of Planning and highlighted several online sources of spatial data. The participants interacted and participated enthusiastically with the faculties and raised their query related to goal setting. The session was quite successful and knowledgeable for the new students.

Two Alumni, Mr. Anirudh and Mr. Rohit (Programme- M.Plan, Batch 2018-2020) joined the session for sharing their learning experiences with Amity School of Architecture and Planning, Amity University Haryana. Mr. Anirudh is running his own Architecture firm. Mr. Anirudh has shared his memories associated with field visit held for Dehradun city and Farukhnagar Block, Gurugram. He has shared few experiences on hostel life and academic life during his stay at Amity campus, Gurgaon. He has motivated fresher students to do hard work to achieve their desired goals. Mr. Rohit is working as Planning Assistant at Municipal Corporation Gurugram. He shared his field and office experiences with the students. He also talked about the role and responsibilities assigned to him by the Corporation. In the end, freshers asked few questions to Alumni related to their current job experiences.


AMITY SCHOOL OF HOSPITALITY



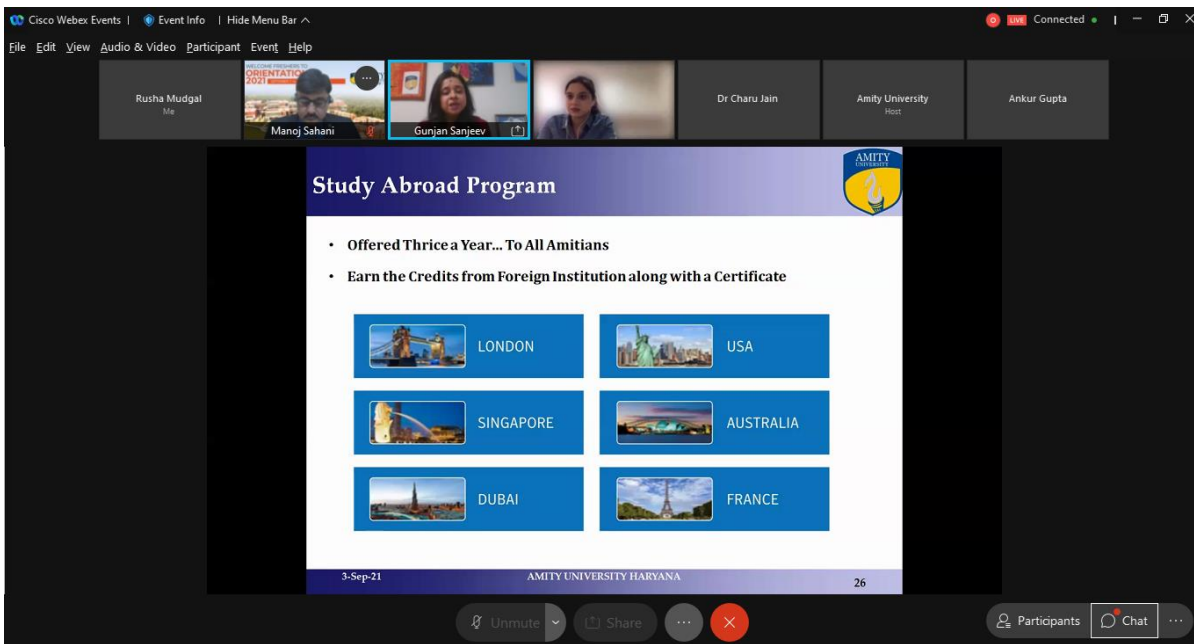

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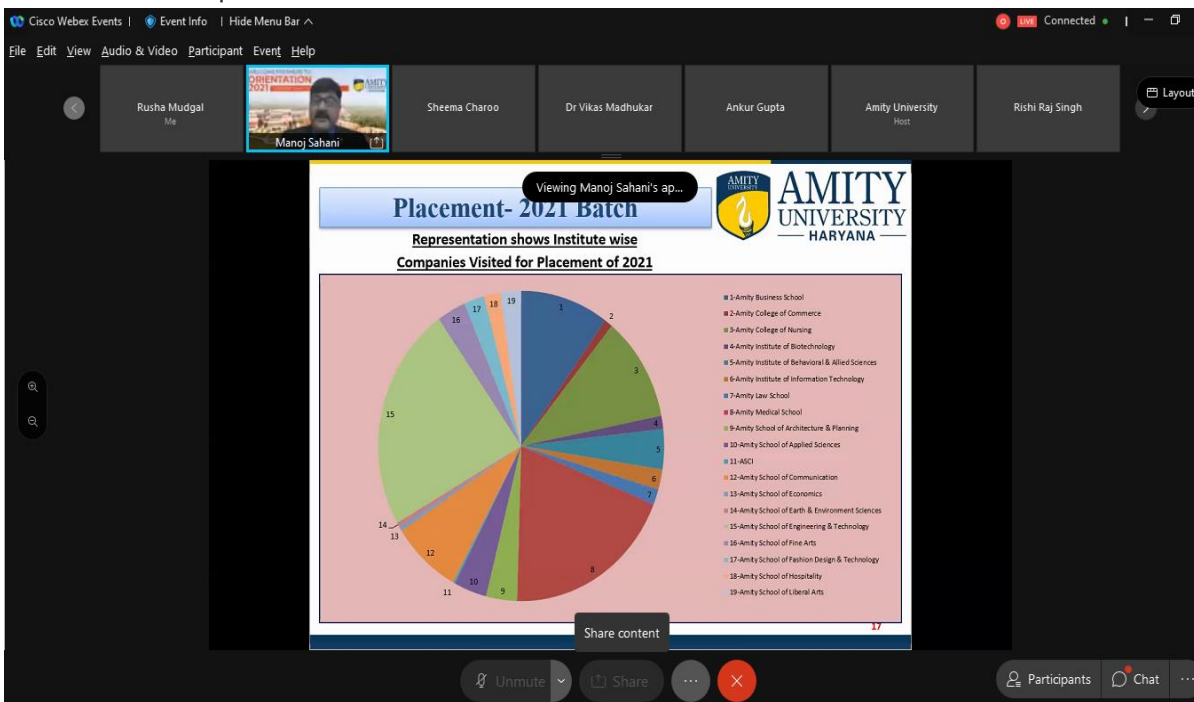

Day4: Saturday-September4, 2021

The fourth and final day of Orientation program 2021 commenced with the presentation by Maj. Gen G. S. Bal, Dean, Student welfare. The session was followed by a panel discussion on "Career Aspirations and Future of Work" by distinguished industry experts which comprised of Ms. Kisha Gupta (an alumna of AUH & Director, Marketing & Head-Global Academic Relations, Infosys), Mr. Vikas Gupta (Founder & Chairman, VFN Group) and Mr. Ajay Agrawal (Director & Head - Customer Delivery HWSD India - Operations, Nokia). Their discussion accentuated the fact of changing business systems and changing working models in the post-pandemic era and the need of job aspirants to modulate and prepare themselves to embrace the changes. The participating industry experts unanimously recommended the AUH freshers to focus on upskilling, networking, imbibing learnings from their respective courses, and strengthening their potentials by making the most of their student life at AUH. The panel discussion witnessed rapt attention and interest of the freshers who actively participated in the Q&A after the session.

It was followed by an aptly involving workshop on "Design Thinking", delivered by Ms. Ekta Rohan Jafri, Design Director, IBM Interactive Experience. Talking about the '4 Dots' or four lessons and 'O.R.M.' (i.e. Observe, Reflect, Make) which train to focus on intrinsic goals, motivations and other emotional quotients of user, Ms. Jafri brought to light the behavioural aspects of user and innovative strategies to successfully design thinking.

The vote of thanks for the pre-lunch session of the final day of Orientation program 2021 was proposed by Mr Manoj Sahani, Director CRC and Head - Industry Integration, AUH. Mr. Sahani also wished the freshers great learning experience at AUH and successful future career.

In the post lunch session, expert talks by eminent industry professionals were organised in respective departments. The talks were organised with an objective to provide a platform to the freshers to interact with the professionals.

AMITY SCHOOL OF LANGUAGES

Mr. Aniket Vaibhav started the session with a brief introduction of the speaker Prof. (Dr.) UN Singh. He started his lecture about the scope and expectations of language learning titled “Making it new or innovating our own beliefs” he divided his lecture in three parts: 1. Linguistic Landscape, 2. Language Utility: Language Based Region Formation, 3. The challenges.

He elaborated on the birth of new nation-states post-war that led to the need for multilingualism in those nation-states. He underlined the prejudices in these nation-states between languages and how that transformed into linguistic conflicts and language struggles in India. Dr. Singh presented the data to showcase the huge range of linguistic diversity of India and its scriptal complexities. He talked about the 8th schedule which he called ‘a language policy instrument’ and about New Education Policy 2020. He drew upon the different linguistic models of communication such as the Karl-Ludvig Buhler, Roman Jakobson Model and the Malinovsky Model, to explain to the students, the process of communication.

He also pointed out the fact that 90% of world languages are slowly going to go extinct and with them the entire cultures and vestiges of traditions will die as well. Therefore, Dr. Singh emphasized the need for the students and experts of languages to share the responsibility of studying and preserving the linguistic diversity of the world. He called upon the need for innovation on part of the language specialists and asked the students to exercise critical thinking and innovation. Mr. Aniket thanked Dr. Singh for this rich and enlightening session. There were no further questions from the students and hence the session came to an end.

AMITY BUSINESS SCHOOL

With a view that an interaction with top brass of the industry always motivates and encourages students, an insightful session of expert talk was organised wherein as guest speaker Mr. Sandeep Chaudhry, Managing Director at Tecumseh Products India Pvt Ltd, New Delhi addressed the new students on the topic, “Campus to Corporate: Are you ready for the exciting Journey” to help them update the latest trends in the industry. The session was coordinated and moderated by Dr. Rishi Manrai, Assistant Professor, Amity Business School.

The session gave them opportunity to connect with media industry expert Ms. Sarvapriya Sangwan. The dignitaries present in the meeting were Director ASCO, Dr. Manish Verma, Dr. Pooja Rana, Dr. Preeti Singh. The industry expert for the session, Ms. Sarvapriya Sangwan is a renowned journalist, popular in the field of grass root reporting. She is currently working with BBC as a YouTube editor for Indian languages. Ms. Sangwan is best known for her reporting during the 2014 Lok Sabha elections along with famous NDTV journalist, Mr. Ravish Kumar. During the session, Ms. Sangwan interacted with the students and shared her thoughts, experience, and her journey with them. She spoke about the challenges faced by the media persons during the pandemic in collecting, validating, preparing and analysing the news reports. Ms. Sangwan also raised her concerns towards the decreasing number of students in this field, their fears and employment challenges, and the problem of fake news and sources attribution. She briefed the students about the required skillset

and things they need to keep in mind while reporting. 'Journalism is a continuous learning process', with these words Ms. Sarvapriya Sangwan concluded her talk. The session concluded with a vote of thanks by Dr. Pooja Rana. The online Orientation Programme for the newly admitted BSc Animation students, continued on 4th September 2021 with an industry expert talk session to introduce them to UX/UI by industry expert Mr. Vishu Aggarwal. The dignitaries present in the meeting were Dr. Manish Verma, Director, ASCO, Ms. Esha Jainiti, Deputy Director ASCO, faculty members including Mr. Deepak Dhariwal and Dr. Sam. V. Rao. Mr. Vishu Aggarwal is a Multimedia Specialist, Corporate Trainer and Consultant having an experience of over 12 years with Graphic and Web Designing, UX/UI, 3D Animation, Virtual Reality, Game Design, Instructional Design and Digital Marketing. He had also conducted trainings and consultancy for Corporates like KPMG, Cape Gemini India, Indian Air Force, HBO (USA), WHO (New Delhi) and many others. He is also certified in Adobe expert in In Design, Adobe associate in Visual Communication, Digital Marketer and Instructor and many others. During the session, Mr. Vishu gave an introduction of UX / UI, talked about its importance in industries and in daily life. He has also discussed about the solutions and interventions required by the city. At the end, there was a question answer session where M. Scope of ethics was also highlighted and his talk was very informative in moulding the minds of the audience. He also spoke about roles, responsibilities, and ethics of each discipline and how it needs to be put in practice. All lines of academics, research and clinical were discussed in depth and each discipline's ethical guidelines were also viewed into. Many queries, questions and doubts by students were addressed. The session was very interactive as students took active participation. The speaker was very accommodating in taking up all the queries and giving his expert insights for all of them.

AMITY SCHOOL OF FINE ARTS

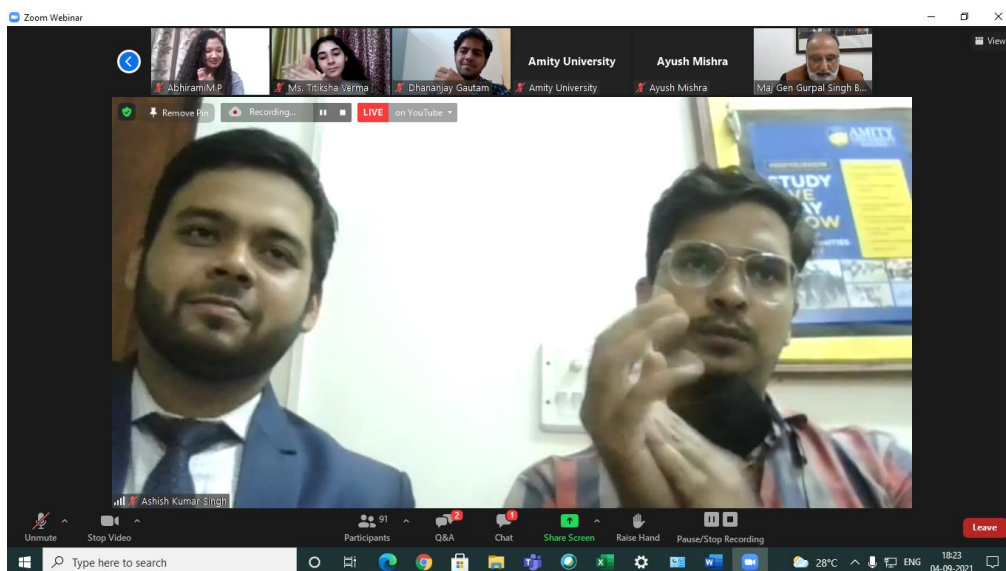
Amity School of Fine Arts (AID) organized Art talk for the first-year students of Amity School of Fine Arts on the topic of

FEEDBACK ANALYSIS

The Orientation Programme (OP) at AUH was aimed at familiarizing students with the academic framework, campus environment, students' activities and overall philosophy of Amity and providing direction to them to make their easy integration with the University. The OP has included the expert sessions from corporate and motivational leaders to ignite the potential of newly admitted students. The 'goal setting workshop' by institutions were directed to help students in identifying their career and life goals. At the end of the OP, a structured feedback of students is taken to assess the quality and outcome of various sessions conducted during the OP.

The feedback form consisted twelve questions pertaining to various aspects of OP such as ease of online platform, understanding about mission and leadership, academic framework, events, activities, Amity advantage and overall experience during OP.

It is heartening to note enthusiastic participation of newly admitted students in various sessions during the OP and their feedback was very encouraging. The feedback undoubtedly indicated that students were very happy and satisfied with the program. More than 95 per cent students reported that inaugural session was very inspiring and provided them an understanding about the vision and leadership of the University and they felt an integral part of University. Again, 95 per cent of responding students admitted that they were adequately familiarize with their institutions and various sessions conducted by the respective institutions were exciting, specifically 'goal setting' session, which was very well aligned with students' expectations. 90 to 95 percent students have rated highest about the quality of various sessions, on a scale of 5, five being the highest and 1 is lowest. Almost 100 per cent respondents have rated overall experience from good to wow, which signifies that effectiveness of OP in achieving its stated objectives.

3.1 General Introduction of the Event

PhD Orientation Programme was organised on March 11, 2022 from 10:00 am onwards in a hybrid mode. The programme was attended by 51 scholars (42 scholars attended in offline mode while 9 scholars joined virtually).

3.2 Objectives of the Event

The PhD orientation programme was organised with an objective to formally welcome the PhD batch (Jan 2022) and to apprise them of the PhD programme requirements.

3.3 Brief about the address/talk of speakers

Welcoming the scholars to the Amity family, Prof (Dr) Padmakali Banerjee, Pro Vice Chancellor & Dean Academics, AUH inspired them to undertake world-class research and contribute to the already existing knowledge repository. She motivated the scholars to fill in the glaring research gap that is widening due to only a small percentage of students pursuing research as a career option. Prof Banerjee also advised the researchers to adopt ethical approach while undertaking research. The Pro Vice Chancellor concluded her address by advising the newly inducted research scholars to work on their listening skills in order to become great researchers.

Prof (Dr) Vikas Madhukar, Deputy Pro Vice Chancellor & Director (ABS) briefed the newly inducted research scholars about the PhD programme offered by the university. He highlighted the programme's 'self-regulated' quality and advised the scholars to finish their PhD in a timely and efficient manner. He stressed on the importance of skills like time management, scholar adaptability and dealing with pressure.

Prof. (Dr) Rajendra Prasad, Dean Faculty of Science, Engineering and Technology, Director, AIISH and AIB expressed great joy at witnessing the robust gathering of research scholars and encouraged them to explore the AUH campus, visit the various labs and experience other world-class facilities in the premises. Dr Prasad encouraged the scholars to fully utilize the state-of-art infrastructure for research and development at the campus.

Prof (Dr) Udaya Narayana Singh, Dean, Faculty of Arts & Humanities, Chair-Professor, Amity Centre for Linguistic Studies (ACLIS) encouraged scholars to frame their research questions carefully and most importantly, be ready to challenge pre-existing notions, theories and rehash them from time to time. He elaborated on the 'newness' that a researcher must add on to the literature that already exists in one's research area. In Arts and Humanities research, it's important to ask philosophical questions, even though their answers may not always be achievable, stressed Prof. Singh.

This was followed by words of encouragement from the directors and Hols of different schools.

Deputy Dean Academics, AUH, Prof (Dr) Bhavana Adhikari elaborated on the expectations from the research scholars. She briefed them about the details regarding programme registration, attendance and the compulsory coursework to be completed by all the scholars. Stressing on the importance of time management, a point underscored by other distinguished speakers as well, she encouraged scholars to write at least two pages of their thesis every day. Also, she encouraged scholars to "eat, drink and sleep their topic," meaning that they stay connected to their thesis and its research enquiries on a consistent basis.

The last speaker of the day, Prof (Dr) Pooja Rana, PhD Coordinator, AUH, apprised the research scholars about crucial points related to the procedures and processes of the PhD programme offered at AUH. All in all, she shared information regarding allotment of PhD Supervisor, completion of Coursework, related guidelines, period of registration for Full-time and Part-time scholars along with provision for extension, cancellation of PhD registration and guidelines regarding submission of PhD thesis.
