He had also worked as an Associate Professor in the Centre for International Relations, Central University of Jharkhand, Ranchi. He served as a professor and was the Head of Department of Political Science at the Central University of Haryana, Mahendergarh. He pursued his academic research in higher studies viz. MA, MPhil and Ph.D. in International Relations from School of International Studies, Jawaharlal Nehru University, New Delhi. As the part of his administrative experiences, he served as the Dean of School of Arts, Humanities and Social Science, and was the Chief Proctor at the Central University of Haryana, Mahendergarh. He was the member of Executive Council as well as of Academic Council of the Central University of Haryana, Mahendergarh. Currently, he is a member of the University Court representing Learned Professions and Special Interests at North-Eastern Hill University, Shillong also.

Prof. Kumar's major fields of academic interest are International Relations and Area Studies – Politics, Society and culture of South Asia, Central Asia, Indo-Pacific and South East Asia. In 1987 she moved to Delhi and taught in various colleges of Delhi University before finally settling down as Associate Professor, Department of Political Science, in the present college. She is a well-known author of books on Gandhi, *Gandhi, the Master Communicator*(based on her doctoral thesis, which is a recommended reading for media schools) and books for undergraduate students, *Reading Gandhi* (English) and *गाँधी अध्ययन*,(Hindi) –the latter two, running into third edition now. Her other publications include *Pakistan and the Muslim World* (co-authored with Prof. Surendra Chopra), one of the 22 world languages authorized translation of Prof. Glenn Paige's *Nonkilling Global Political Science* into Hindi as *राजनीति का हिंसामुक्त स्वरूप* and several articles on India's foreign policy, international

relations and Gandhian philosophy in various books, journals and newspapers. Dr. Chadda has been involved in various co-curricular activities of the college in the capacity of Student Union Advisor, Cultural Committee Convener, Co-Convener of Satark, the consumer club of the college and Gandhi Study Circle over the years. Presently she is actively involved in activities involving career counselling as the convener of Kaizen, the Career Counselling Club of the College.
