

PREFACE

Learning should stimulate and sustain the child's interest and should be a joy. We have designed a syllabus that enables the child to acquire language competency, a systematic organisation of ideas, to develop his / her creative imagination and independent thinking.

Through this new thematic / integrated approach, the child explores his / her environment in greater depth.

In the thematic approach, a concept does not end with the lesson. The child looks at it from all aspects – the scientific, the ecological and from the point of view of social studies. The child studies his environment and understands it as best as he can. He investigates, explores and observes. Science and Social Studies cease to be separate entities. The child understands that they are inter-related. One cannot exist without the other.

Making Maths a part of this means that Maths is no longer boring numbers. It is used in everyday life. Numbers become real and meaningful.

Language skills are learnt as the child learns to master the above mentioned concepts.

OBJECTIVES ACHIEVED

PERSONALITY :

A lot of emphasis is laid on personality development of every child :

1. We have inculcated good Indian Moral Values.
2. Helped children to bring up their hidden skills, by encouraging them to take part in various activities.
3. Gained confidence in public speaking. Children are helped to develop communication skill.
4. Positive social behaviour.

Teachers coach them to deal with daily situations and develop a spirit of Amity towards all classmates.

5. Time management is taught by encouraging children to finish work in a stipulated period of time.

ENGLISH :

1. The children would have learnt about 35 new words per month from the Word Bank. This expanded vocabulary would help them in expressing themselves clearly while speaking and writing.
2. They would have also learnt to make short simple sentences with correct usage of grammar.
3. They would be able to do paragraph writing (approximately 10 lines) on any given topic with the help of clue words. They learn to pen down their real life experiences.

4. They would have learnt to use the dictionary.
5. The story writing would help them to think in a sequential manner and also help in improving their creativity.
6. They would learn to recite poems with the correct intonation and pronunciation.
7. The children would learn the importance of neat presentation with emphasis on correct formation of letters and correct spacing between words.
8. The children should be able to comprehend the instruction given and follow them correctly.

MATHEMATICS :

1. The students are now able to discover the world of numbers and number concepts till 1000.
2. The children have achieved mathematical skills which they can use to solve problem sums in addition, subtraction and multiplication and prepare them for future academic pursuits.
3. The children have also built a strong mathematical vocabulary and have had meaningful sensory experience by using the Jodo Gyan Kit.
4. The concepts of various operations like addition, subtraction, multiplication have become clear with 3-digit numbers only. They are also able to do mental maths sums quickly.
5. They can read time and learn to use money in real life situations and identify the notes and coins.
6. Tables upto 10 have been learnt.
7. They know about length span, foot span to measure length and also know how heavy objects are.

Geometry :

1. The children are able to recognize 3-dimensional figures and plane figures.
2. They are now able to measure and draw line segments of the given length.
