
MINDS IN MOTION AT AISV1-MUN





Astronomy Session







Students of classes I to V participated in an interactive

where they were briefed about the idea of rocket as a space vehicle and its working principles. The working principle i.e., Newton's third law of motion was introduced and demonstrated to them through a balloon rocket and car. They were also introduced to the concept of 'satellites' in a very innovative manner. Children explored how satellites unfold a new page of the universe including our own planet. Students investigated how they make our lives simpler as they have a wide range of applications from ship navigation to watching TV at home. They acted as 'chief engineers' on a space mission and assembled mini satellites with defined parts!

The young learners were further introduced to the possibility of existence of life on Mars. They were told about the Rovers that have been to Mars before and were introduced to Mars Curiosity Rover. The students then made their own model of Curiosity Rover and learned about its working through fun activities.

Keeping their scientific approach alive, students realized that even as simple and as omnipresent thing like air can be used as a fuel to launch rockets which can fly to great heights and lengths. They learnt about the power and magic of air pressure through hands-on activities. Later they constructed their own stomp rockets and launched them in a friendly competition on the same concept of air pressure.



Inter Class Science Quiz





An Inter-Class Science Quiz was organized for students of classes VI-VIII. The objective of this Science Quiz was to provide students an exposure to recent developments in the field of Science and to inculcate the virtues of team spirit and competitiveness. The quiz comprised of 6 rounds namely: Conceptual round, Numerical round, Video identification round, Google doodle round, Latest in Science and the Rapid Fire round. Out of five participating teams, Team A was declared the winner team and the winning participants were: Vinayak Shukla (VI-A), Pranav Raj (VII-A), Arnav Hakeem (VIII-A).

Inter House Relay Races



The School ground got enlivened with the zeal and zest displayed at the 'Inter House Relay Races' for students of classes VII and VIII. Teams comprising four boys and four girls for 100 x 4 M Relay Race and one boy and one girl for 100 M Race were

selected from each house and each class. Students participated with full enthusiasm and sportsman spirit. There was a thrilling atmosphere and the students performed to the best of their ability.









Students of class VI to VIII participated in Astronomy Session on October 16,2019. In Module 1 named as Club Kalpana the following activities were done:

Introduction of Jantar Mantar as an ancient observatory, why was it built and the history behind it. A detailed explanation was given to identify various Yantras at Jantar Mantar and how to create a model of Jantar Mantar. They were made to understand the working of various instruments by measuring Alt-Az through Ram Yantra and time through samrat yantra.

In Module 2 named as Krittika the following activities were done:

Astronomer's Tools (Club Kit) was given to the students. Kit material and its working was explained to the members. The students were made to identify the purpose of the material and how it aided in pursuing Science. Directions were given for understanding the concept of coordinates in our celestial system, to identify reference techniques to locate objects in space and to create a celestial grid and a sky map. Students constructed a Sky Map for both the hemispheres based on the understanding of the celestial grid.

Cyber Security Session

The school hosted the Global Cyber Day organized by KMPG. In this event, the resource person Mr. Rohan Shankar from KPMG conducted a session for students of Class XI on Cyber Security and Safety. During the session, the resource person efficiently highlighted the need and ways to make us safe while working on the internet. He also emphasized on the difference between fake app and authentic apps and

elaborated the concept of app permission in smartphones. Awareness about phishing and vishing attack, cyber scams and uploading of sensitive information on social media were also discussed. Overall, it was a very informative and a much needed session in today's digital world.





WORLD MENTAL HEALTH DAY. 'Leading a Happier Life'





On the occasion of World Mental Health Day, the school organised an interactive session for students of class IX on the topic Mental Health where the resource person was Dr. Sandip Roy.

The session included several activities and discussions; focusing on imparting a better understanding of different emotions, ways to manage different sentiments in different circumstances and ways to empathize with others.

The problem of depression is a form of mental illness which was addressed. According to the ,resource person ,it is natural to experience all types of emotions with emotional ups and downs, unpredictable moods and strong feelings, but managing and expressing emotions in a more controlled way is important. The root cause of all the mental illnesses is the inability to manage emotions. Dr. Sandip Roy averred that if a student learns to cope with emotions, he /she will be able to keep stress levels under control and will stay positive, mindful, productive, cheerful and happy.


