

Workshop On Gender Sensitization And Women Empowerment

Amity School Of Languages organized a two day workshop on "**Gender Sensitization And Women Empowerment**" from **14**th **to 15**th **November 2017**. The workshop was facilitated by **Dr. Ni Putu Tirka Widanti**, Chair for Master of Administrations Science, Postgraduate Program, Ngurah Rai University,Indonesia. Dr. Widanti has also been appointed as Professor Adjunct, Amity School of languages, Amity University Gurgaon.

The workshop was conducted in three sessions spread over two days. The first session started with formal felicitation of Dr. Widanti by Dr. Sanjay Kr. Jha, Director Amity School of Liberal Arts and Prof. Ashok Tiku, Head of Department, Amity School of Languages. The welcome address was given by Prof. Ashok Tiku in which he briefly summarized the credentials of Dr. Widanti. It was followed by the key note address of Dr. Widanti where she introduced her country Indonesia in general and Bali in particular. A video screening of the theme of workshop was also done. The video showcased representation of Balinese women and gave a brief overview of the actual situation of women in Bali.

The second session was on Gender, Society and Women's role:Un-learning Gender and Redefining Female Role in Changing Milieu. this session talked about the Concept of Gender while differentiating gender from the sex. The differences based on biological features and social construct in terms of gender and sex in our society were discussed at large. Based on these differences, it was tried to demarcate the defined role of Women, actual and ideal. The case study of Bali and India were taken up and a comparison was drawn. It was further tried to highlight the core issues involving gender sensitization in both the countries. Few videos were screened to show different aspects of gender sensitization and the audience were given the activity to chart out core issues regarding the condition of women in their respective regions. Most of the issues raised by the audience were similar and pertinent.

The third session was on "Millennium Development Goal in gender mainstreaming". Dr. Widanti gave an overview of MDG in south Asian countries based on the different parameters like health and education. The role of women education in Women empowerment and knowledge based economy in Bali and India were compared. Furthermore, Women health and empowerment consisting Women access to health care and other MDG goal related to health in rhetoric and ground realities were discussed. This session also included valuable feedback from the audience based on the two days of discussion on this sensitive issue. was left open for Q/A round. The last 15 mins were given exclusively to the student participants to come forward and share their views on this issue. The session ended with the vote of thanks by prof. Ashok Tiku where he thanked Dr. Widanti for conducting such an interesting workshop and he put forward his willingness to work further to enhance the cooperation between India and Indonesia by organizing more of such intellectual exchange. Prof. Tiku also thanked the conveners of this workshop, Mr. Kunal Anand and Ms. Mansi. He also thanked Dr. Suvro for managing the affairs of Dr. Widanti while her stay in AUG.

After the session, a brief meeting took place between the guest and hon'ble PVC Dr. Padmakali Bannerji. The meeting ended on the positive note that the prospect of further collaboration shall be explored and AUG can work towards starting Study Abroad Program (SAP) in Bali and in turn offer India immersion program for Balinese students. It was further suggested that students of hospitality and tourism can be send to Bali for their internship and field trip. The PVC's office will send an invite to Dr. Widanti for the Congress of Mental Health to be organized in AUG in February 2018.



We would like to acknowledge the presence of Mr. Pal, Sarpanch representative who helped us in deciding venue and make necessary arrangements for the events.





1st group:3-5years group


- Interactive sessions were held in which they learned to express their thoughts freely.

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ANNUAL FUNCTION (2017):


On 16th November 2017

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

The activity was organized on 4th February 2016 by department of Dietetics and Applied nutrition involving faculty Dr. Luxita Sharma along with students of BDAN 4th semester, MDAN 2nd semester and MDAN 4th semester. The activity involved a community visit to Padha village, Haryana, for a Health checkup. In this study 30 subjects were included of age 20 to 32 year. After the subjects were selected, the collection of data was done using standardized questionnaire which consist of personal details, physical health, medical history, and clinical symptoms. For assessing food habits, a 24 hour recall method was used and dietary information was taken. All the subjects were made to fill the questionnaire before the intervention was started and after their intervention following for a month.

The villagers became aware of their health and nutritional status and came to know about the various healthy food options to be included in the diet. Nutrition education was given to make villagers aware of healthy habits. Students learned about the process of survey and data collection in the community and gained practical experience related to nutritional counseling. Hence, the camp was successful for students as well as villagers, imparting knowledge of nutrition and diet.

Outcome of the activity:

This community visit was organized on 13th February 2015 by department of Dietetics and Applied nutrition involving faculty Dr. Luxita Sharma and students of BDAN 2nd & 4th semester and MDAN 2nd semester. In the first visit students came back with the duly filled questionnaire and later brief analysis was done to understand malnutrition in the community. It was found that malnutrition was present among the children of the villagers. Despite they disclosed that they eat healthy and local food, even then prevalence of malnutrition was seen. The signs of malnutrition were very much prevalent as their head circumference was not in the required range. The height and weight was below the normal range. It was found that 80 percent of the children were suffering from under nutrition and underweight.

So students had an interaction with the mothers of the children and were advised about the health of their children. They were told that the growth of their children was not proper and they need to give proper diet and nourishment to their children. They were educated about the importance of nutrition at early age is important for proper growth and development. Total 51 patients were counseled by the students of Dietetics and Applied Nutrition in the second community visit. This community visit was fruitful for students as

well as for the village people. As students got practical exposure and knowledge about working in a community while villagers got nutrition education which will help in reducing prevalence of malnutrition, hence a symbiotic relationship was established among students and community.

The activity involved a community visit to Padha village, Haryana, to evaluate nutritional status of local school children. The students gave nutrition education and told about the healthy food options the local children need to include in their diet.


At first students found out the problems persistent among the villagers in terms of their health and deficiency disorders. A standardized questionnaire made by students was filled by our students by asking face to face questions about their medical history, eating habits and the food options available to them. It was found that the villagers were eating food locally available and they were unaware about many food products available in the markets. Since this was initial stage and first camp, this made it challenging in finding the problem regarding the diseases persistent among them. The villagers were not very friendly and the information was not given properly as felt during the session, but students tried to build rapport and break the ice. Overall the session helped the students to understand the process of data collection in community. It also helped them to polish their communication skills.



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

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Report on

Diabetes Awareness Program organized on the World Diabetes Day, November 14, 2014

Introduction:-

The World Diabetes Day, is a global awareness campaign which is observed on November 14 every year in over 160 different countries. It was jointly introduced by the World Health Organization and International Diabetes Federation in 1991 in response to the alarming rise of diabetes around the world.

The campaign engages millions of people worldwide in diabetes advocacy and awareness and draws attention to important issues related to it and keeps diabetes in public spotlight.

Diabetes is a global problem having over 350 million people suffering from it. In 2012 an estimated 1.5 million deaths were attributed to Diabetes. Diabetes is a silent killer and it is projected that by 2030 it will be the 7th leading cause of death. It affects all ages and all ethnic groups around the world.

In India Diabetes is fast gaining the status of a potential epidemic with more than 62 million of its population diabetic. It is being known as the Diabetic Capital of the World with the highest number of people suffering from diabetes followed by China and the USA in second and third place respectively. About one third of the Diabetics don't even know that they are suffering from it. Undiagnosed and untreated Diabetes leads to complications like blindness, kidney disorders, Hypertension, Diabetic ulcers, osteopathy, heart attacks, strokes and many more.

With the above facts in mind that it was decided to organize Diabetes Awareness Programme, under the aegis of Amity Medical School by the Department of Hospital Administration for the benefit of our faculty, staff and students.Dr. Sandeep Kharb, Consultant Endocrinologist, Paras Hospital, one of our partner hospitals in Gurgaon was invited to deliver a guest lecture on the subject.

Arrangements were also made for the faculties, staff and the students to have their Random Blood Glucose levels tested by a team of 4 technicians from Paras Hospital and also for vision examination conducted by the Department of Optometry, AMS, AUH.

Details of the program:-

The program was held in Auditorium A Block (as per the attached Program schedule) Random Blood Glucose level testing & Vision Examination was done in B Block, ground floor, Rear Foyer (Photographs attached herewith)

Time: 10.30 AM to 12.30 PM.

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Objectives

- To inform and educate faculty, staff and students about diabetes, its implications and motivate them to adopt at healthy lifestyle.
- To screen for high blood glucose level and visual acuity amongst students, faculty and staff.

Conduct of the Program

The program commenced with the networking tea for the guests and senior faculty members.

By 10.30 AM the Auditorium had about 20 faculty members and around 250 students. The Program began with the Opening Remarks by Maj Gen (Dr) Mahavir Singh, HOI, AMS & Dean, Faculty of Health and Allied Sciences. He stressed upon the fact that Diabetes is a lifestyle disease & we need to change our lifestyles to overcome the problem.

Dr Sandeep Kharb, MD, DNB presently Consultant Endocrinologist, Paras Hospital, Gurgaon delivered the guest lecture on the subject. He talked about various types of Diabetes like Type I, Type II, Gestational Diabetes& how and why these occur. He spoke on the burden of disease, its risk factors, complications & treatment and also stressed upon whom to screen for diabetes. He advocated adoption of healthy lifestyle, which included regular exercises, yoga and healthy nutrition practices. His talk evoked lot of interest among the audience which was evident from the questions raised by them during the Question – Answer Session.

A question answer session followed, wherein the questions of audience were answered by Maj Gen (Dr) Mahavir Singh and Dr Sandeep Kharb. A large number of questions were asked by the faculty as well as students which were answered lucidly.

All the people having high random blood glucose level were advised individually to have their blood glucose level tested in a Pathological Laboratory to confirm the readings. 52 people got their vision examined, out which 35 have been advised to attend Optometry Clinic for a detailed examination.

The program ended with a vote of thanks proposed by Prof (Dr) Harish Satia, HOD, Hospital Administration followed by tea with the higher officials.

Highlights of the Event:

A day long, Life Saving Training Programme was conducted at AUH. The training programme covered several aspects of emergencies where swift actions can save lives.

1. Felicitation of the speakers by Deputy Vice Chancellor:

After the organizing team introduced the guests, Maj Gen B.S. Suhag formally welcomed the guests and felicitated the team with mementos and shawls. In his inaugural address, he dwelt upon the enormity of the problem of people losing their lives for lack of immediate life-saving assistance.



2. Session 1: Safety code, Concept of First Aid, Recovery and Revival etc

Brig. Malik discussed about First Aid – Recovery and Revival and its principles. Then, Ms ShrutiAdhav put some light on prioritization of safety, how to conduct initial assessment and its general rules.

Later, Brig Malik discussed about the basics of anatomy and physiology of Respiratory system, Skeletal system, circulatory system and nervous system.

The lecture was followed by a Tea Break.



3. Session 2: Cardiopulmonary Resuscitation (CPR) – Theory Demo and practice:

A detailed presentation on Cardio Pulmonary Resuscitation (CPR) including live demonstration of the technique evoked huge interest.

The technique of CPR was thoroughly demonstrated by the team which evoked huge interest among audience. The participants performed CPR under the guidance of the trainers and were very enthusiastic to learn the techniques. Majority of the participants were doing it for the first time in their lives.



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4. Session 3: Respiratory and circulatory system, choking, loss of consciousness, shock, bleeding (internal & external), drowning etc

After the lunch break, the team discussed the emergencies of Heart Attack, Choking (with a special focus on infants), Stroke, drowning, internal & external bleeding and shock. The presentation was designed in a manner that a common person could easily understand. Participants were also made to practice how to make and apply a pressure bandage to stop bleeding, how to deal with a patient of burns, road accidents, and other such emergencies.



5. Session 4: Head / Neck / Spinal injuries and other emergencies:

After a quick tea break, the team threw some light on fractures and dislocations. The various immobilization techniques for fractures and dislocations were also demonstrated and practiced by the participants. Participants also learnt how to lift a patient having fractures, including various types of Carriage for victims – one, two and three rescuer carriage. The team also highlighted the first aid management of Poisoning, Snake bites and Seizures.

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6. First Aider's Oath

Presentations were followed by a questionnaire which was answered by the participants. And at the end of the sessions, all the participants took an oath to help those requiring emergency help.

7. Vote of thanks:

The program was concluded with Vote of thanks by Prof (Dr) HarishSatia, Head of the Dept. of Hospital Administration, Amity Medical School.



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Outcome of the Event:

A total of 123 participants, inclusive of 68 faculty and 55 staff members attended.

It's been a very useful programme for the participants and it has been very well received. It helped people to understand various types of emergencies they may encounter in life and how to deal with those emergencies to save lives as well as to give necessary first aid till the time medical help gets available.

By attending the workshop, the participants would be able to:

- recognize life-threatening situations & take appropriate actions.
- offer vital assistance before any Paramedic/ambulance arrives
- provide single-person **CPR** on an adult, child and baby
- be a workplace First Responder

Outcome of the Event:

- c) <u>Benefit to society in terms of Health & hygiene</u>: It is crucial to be well aware of the health status of our mouth and take preventive or curative steps at the right time. In view of that total 249 students / Staff / Faculty and their family members participated and benefitted from Free Dental Health Check up.
- d) <u>Benefit to society in terms of Education</u>: To drive awareness about dental health, a lecture was also delivered on dental hygiene in which students, faculty and staff participated in large numbers and learnt about healthy dental practices.

Analysis of Findings

- Out of 249people who availed free dental health check-up, 42 (17%) were faculty and their family members, 167 (67%) were students and 40 (16%)were staff members.
- 43 (17%) were suffering from tooth decay problems for which they were advised Filling, RCT and Tooth Extraction on case to case basis.
- 91 (36%) were suffering from either plaque /calculus / stains for which Scaling or polishing was advised.
- While 48 (19%) were suffering from both the problems.
- Braces were recommended to 20 (8%) for irregular teeth and Dentures & Implants were suggested to 30 (12%).
