At the outset, the Chairperson welcomed all the members and special invitees. He then welcomed Dr Sanjay Goyal Director ABS, CRC and Dean Industry Integration and Professor Dr TamilSelvi A, Principal ACON who have recently joined and are now associated with the Academic Council and hoped that they will greatly contribute to the University in general and the Council in specific.

The Chairperson emphasized the importance of the Academic Council in deciding the all-important academic activities of the University. He also mentioned that Academic Council is also to oversee the level of academic delivery and also whether various outcome inputs are in consonance with the target set by the University.

The Chairperson stated about the current important event coming up i.e, 5th Convocation Scheduled on 2nd February 2019 and stated that it is a matter of great honor and privilege for the AUH fraternity that Dr R A Mashelkar, FRS FREng, FIChemE, a prominent personality in area of Science and Technology and a former Director General of the Council of Scientific & Industrial Research & the President of Global Research Alliance who had been conferred Padma Vibhushan, Padma Bhushan, Padma Shri, Gomant Vibhushan Award having

consented to grace the Convocation and confirmation from few more eminent personalities are expected.

The Council further authorized the Hon'ble Chancellor & Hon'ble Vice Chancellor to approve any other such Dignitaries of National and International repute who would also be awarded Doctorate degrees (Honoris Causa)/ Hon'y Professor at the forthcoming Convocation 2019.

The Chairperson congratulated Dr Rajendra Prasad for his nomination as President of Society of Biological Chemists, India for next two years which is HQ at Bangalore. He also conveyed the good news of ASAS under Dr A K Yadav having been awarded a grant of Rupees One Crore under FIST program of SERB, DST.

Amity School of Applied Sciences (ASAS) has been awarded the DST-FIST 2018 in Physical Sciences for the proposal entitled "Nanotechnology for Healthcare and Environment - Exploring New Horizons" encompassing Swastha Bharat and Swachh Bharat missions of Government of India. Under the project, researchers of ASAS will focus on applications of novel nanomaterials particularly in the field of healthcare and environment with specific emphasis on Drug delivery, Antimicrobial property and cytotoxicity, Biosensors, Energy storage, Water purification and Computer simulation/analysis.

The Chairperson also informed about the sanction of Rupees Five Crore by Hon'ble Chancellor towards Centralized Instrumentation Research facility (CIRF) under Dr Rajendra Prasad. He was of the view that the existing research facilities in ASAS and AUH labs including CIRF will get a significant boost with the addition of instruments under FIST-AMITY sponsored grants.

Thereafter the Hon'ble Chairman requested the Member Secretary to take up the Agenda Items for discussion: -

(b) Action taken on the Minutes of the Seventeenth Meeting of Academic Council.

The Member Secretary asked Prof (Dr) A K Raghav to update everyone in respect of the Patent Cell which was constituted by Hon'ble Chairman in the last meeting with the following members:

Dr Ashok Raghav Dr Atul Thakur Dr Arvind Chhabra Dr U.N. Singh Shri Atul Jain

Prof (Dr) A K Raghav informed that no meeting has been held till date, however the academic council was briefed about the patent activities at AUH. The council was informed by Dr Arvind Chhabra that in order to educate AUH faculty about intellectual property rights (IPR) and encourage them to get their novel ideas patented, Dr. Shaleen Raizada, MD & CEO of Sanshadow Consultants Pvt Ltd is coming to AUH every Wednesday. Dr. Chhabra has been tasked to coordinate interaction of Dr. Raizada with AUH faculty, at the University level. Within a few weeks of this engagement, more than 33 ideas have been discussed with Dr Raizada, out of which 20 have been converted into patent applications. The Chairperson is personally involved, on a regular basis, in encouraging more AUH faculty to interact with Dr. Raizada to further promote this interaction and increase patent applications from AUH."

The Chairperson stated that we should aim for a Bench Mark of 101 Patents to be filed by AUH by end of this Calendar Year.

The Member Secretary prayed to the house for ratifying the minutes and the action taken report of the Seventeenth Academic Council meeting. The same were ratified by the members of the Academic Council.

The Chairperson then invited Members of the AC to apprise the august gathering of the works undertaken by their respective departments.

Prof Ashok Tiku of ASL shared that Amity School of languages, AUH has been sanctioned the One Asian Community Project to promote awareness about Asia by the ONE ASIA FOUNDATION, JAPAN. The Sanctioned amount is US \$75000 and the first year grant of US \$25,000 has been received at AUH. The course will begin from 08 Feb 2019 and will consist of 14 sessions attended by 40 students and 5 staff members from AUH. Regional experts from both India and outside will visit ASL to deliver the lectures. Course coordinator for the project is Dr Santosh Gupta.

The course titled "One-Asian Community Theory" aims to help undergraduate students, graduate students and researcher to gain better inderstanding of the

culture, society and religion of East Asia, South East Asia and South Asia and consider how they are relevant for understanding the modern transformation in contemporary period. By the end of the semester, participants would have obtained knowledge of socio-cultural forms in Asia, expanded their understanding over East Asia, South East Asia and South Asia, and developed their skill to communicate their argument in formal English. Thus, the topic titled "One-Asian Community Theory" is very new for Indian students and it has been designed to promote the notion of Asian community which appears to be the core objective of One Asia Foundation.

He also stated that scholarship would be awarded to excellent students who attend and pass the examination held at the end of the course.

ASL has also been granted 3 million WON (Korean) by Korean Foundation for promoting Korean language. The book grant is for procuring books from South Korea from the catalogue supplied by the Foundation. Books have been selected and should reach ASL within a month.

The Chairperson, informed the august gathering about the Mediating Multilingualism MOU Project initiated by Prof (Dr) U N Singh which is an India-Scotland Initiative of UK. Eight Universities in Scotland and Ireland had formed a Consortium called 'Soillse' – which began as a research collaboration between the University of the Highlands and Islands (UHI) and other Scottish universities engaged in the Language Revival research with reference to Gaelic. He felt that this MOU, when implemented, will have a good and effective module of learning.

Dr S K Jha, Director, ASLA shared his anxiety with reference to inadequate hours being accessible to faculty members for research to which Pro VC and Dr Rajendra Prasad suggested that with the backing of Ph.D. scholars the departments can think of offloading work loads of faculties who are keen on research. In addition, there has been a pragmatic shift in our policy for long term gains to reinforce Research, Projects and Patents at AUH by enrolling full time Ph.D. scholars and even the faculty intake bar has been enhanced by appointing faculties with Ph.Ds. only. The Hon'ble VC asked Dr Jha to share the work load and name of faculties who are keen to take up research.

Dr M L Bansal, COE gave the detailed data of the UG, PG and Ph.D Graduands who would be conferred degrees along with total of Medals, Awards and Trophies to be conferred during the forthcoming 5th Convocation as appended and shared vide Appx 'B'. He also shared the work load being handled by Secrecy section of

the Exam Department wherein they handle 2000 Question papers for 1000 subjects per semester.

Introduction:

The University is aimed at recruiting and admitting students who have the potential to and who are most able to benefit from the University's learning, teaching and research environment, regardless of background. The University aims to establish an inclusive culture which welcomes and ensures equality of opportunity for applicants of all ethnicities, family structures, genders, nationalities, races, religious or philosophic beliefs, and socio-economic backgrounds.

The University supports a range of activities and initiatives aimed at widening access and fostering the University's inclusive culture,

The admission process of Amity University Haryana is fully digital, online, automated and student centric which is supported by an efficient Information Technology platform, in-house developed by Amity called AMIZONE.

Some of the key aspects of Admissions are as below:

- University website providing all information about programmes and all other aspects of University
- Submitting Online Application Form

Three new programmes were introduced in emerging area of technology such as Business Analytics, Data Sciences and Pharmacy at UG and PG level.

About 50 per cent of students' admitted are from Haryana & Delhi NCR and rest are widely distributed across country from about 25 States and Union Territories. Apart from students admitted from India, Foreign students also took admissions from various countries such as Afghanistan, Bangladesh, Bhutan, Congo, Egypt, Nepal and Yemen

To encourage and motivate meritorious students, University offers 'merit-based scholarship' of 100 per cent, 50 per cent and 20 per cent based on the academic performance of students in previous class(es). About 500 students were offered merit-based scholarship including 10 per cent scholarship which is offered to Amity alumni.

At the outset, the Chairman greeted all the members of the Council, the Special Invitees and the representative of DGHE Dr Sushila Kumari.

The Chairman stated that prior to starting the AC meeting he would like to introduce leading structural Biologist of International repute to the august gathering who are with us today to address a high impact Seminar at AUH. He then welcomed Prof (Dr) T P Singh, Distinguished Professor at AIIMS, himself a leading structural Biologist Scientist and complimented him for his distinguished contributions to medical education. Thereafter Prof (Dr) T P Singh introduced the visiting scientists as follows:

- (a) Prof (Dr) Peter E. Wright is a scientist, an NMR spectroscopist and a Professor, Department of Integrative Structural and Computational Biology at the Scripps Research Institute, La Jolla, California USA. He is Editor-in-Chief of the Journal of Molecular Biology.
- (b) Prof (Dr) Jane Dyson also Professor at the same Department as Prof Wright who is the Editor in Chief of Bio-physical Journal.
- (c) Prof Peter Tompa, Professor of Biochemistry, VIB SBRC, Brussels, Belgium.

The members of the Academic Council warmly greeted Professor Singh and the distinguished visiting scientists. The Chairman while expressing his delight at the august presence of the visiting scientists, remarked that in todays bioscience led scientific revolution, we are looking at miraculous solutions to monumental problems such as waste water treatment, solid waste recycle and conversion of useful fuel and nutrients for agricultural use, creating abundance of energy and for cleaning the atmospheric air besides a formidable support to major advancement of medical sciences to assure immunity from deadly diseases and viruses. We need to, thus pay a great deal of attention to targeting our research in bio sciences towards solving these monumental challenges.

The above visiting scientists each made a brief presentation on their thoughts on current advances in structural biology and environmental health.

Members of the Council applauded the vision and thoughts shared by the distinguished visitors.

According to him, wherever the faculty has to pay for publishing their articles, they should be reimbursed at least 50% of cost subject to the article gaining reasonable impact. He also warned that authors (faculty) should also be careful before publishing their papers by making payment because many of these Journals are not genuine or recognized.

Prof Archana Shukla, Dean, Faculty of Arts mentioned that in the area of Psychology, even the top most Journals may not have much impact factor and this must be kept in mind while extending the cost reimbursement facility to the faculty.

Prof. J P Dudeja was apprehensive about the authenticity of online Journals which charges money for publishing papers.

The Chairman (Vice Chancellor) mentioned that there are basically three kinds of Journals which are published in the world:

- (i) Highly Reputed Journals
- ii) International Journals of repute

It was decided that 30th September of each year will be the cutoff date for submission of the result of the qualifying examination failing which the provisional admission shall stand cancelled.

The Chairperson made a suggestion that the marketing team should be able to get more students through Education Fairs as quite a good number of Fairs are being attended by the team. He observed that although AUH has participated in 41 fairs, the number of students admitted through these fairs was too low. Director (Admissions) responded by saying that there is only one Amity Stall for all the Amity Universities and the stellar role is played by NOIDA. This is the reason that even with a good footfall the number of students taking admission is less.

Prof Rajendra Prasad suggested that the advertisements for admission should highlight the individual Institutions/schools of AUH so that the students are informed in detail about the salient features of the University as also the Institution concerned. This is expected to generate further interest among the students desirous of seeking admission at the University.

As this will be a part of University /Institution branding, the Pro Vice Chancellor commented that apart from external branding, some kind of internal branding will also be essential.

Prof Anek Pal Gupta suggested that PG / UG course on Mechatronics may be introduced from the coming session which was accepted by the council.

The Pro Vice Chancellor mentioned that Pharma industries are also interested to set up centers at the campus. The Chairperson was of the opinion that this is welcome news but this can be done only after AUH has carried out some ground work.

The discussion continued regarding setting up of various Testing Centers at AUH campus to facilitate the institutional R&D activities and finally it was decided to establish the following Centers:

- "Test House for Lighting". This has to be set up before the next Academic Council meeting. Prof Dudeja will be the Advisor. It will be mentored by Maj Gen V.K. Narang and coordinated by Dr Priti Singh.
- "Fluid Power Systems Laboratory". The major activity of this laboratory will be to test &develop low horsepower pumps (Up to 1hp). Prof A.K. Raghav will steer this lab to establish and manufacture the pump.
- "Food & Nutrition Testing Center". This center will be mentored by Maj Gen (Dr)
 Mahavir Singh and activities coordinated by Dr Luxita Sharma.

The Chairperson mentioned that through these laboratories and testing centers, we shall usher a renewed interest in research and innovation at the University and shall attract industrial consultancy.

Item No AC 11.4: To approve syllabi of B.Ed. and six other programs to be introduced in the academic session 2016-17.

The Pro Vice Chancellor briefed the Council about the current status of the B.Ed. program. She informed the Council that an expert team of NCTE will be visiting the University on February 2, 2016 in connection with according permission for launching the courses during the coming academic session.

She further informed the Council that:

- The Registrar, AUH has already submitted a draft Syllabi and Curriculum details to DGHE on January 15, 2016. This will be updated and resent after more work is carried out on the same.
- 8000 books have been procured and are expected to reach the campus soon for setting up the Library.
- 3. Infrastructure areas have been identified and will be spruced up in next two days.

She informed the Council that apart from B.Ed., six more programs have also been applied for in connection with the study of Education at AUH. This, she suggested, is a challenge for us to take

The meeting was presided over by the Vice Chancellor and attended by the Members as per list enclosed.

Item No AC 9.1: To welcome Prof (Dr) P.B. Sharma, Chairman Academic Council

At the outset, the Secretary requested the Pro Vice Chancellor to kindly welcome the new Chairman of the Academic Council. Since he had taken over as Vice Chancellor after which no academic Council meeting was held, it was necessary to go through this formal process to request him to chair the meeting from now onwards.

Pro Vice Chancellor, in her brief address welcomed the new chairman of the Academic Council and hoped that under his guidance the Academic Council will be able to function in absolute cohesion for furtherance of the objectives of the University.

The Chairman/ Vice Chancellor, in his welcome speech, mentioned that he was very happy to be at the Amity University, Haryana as the Vice Chancellor. He emphasized that improving the quality of education, cultivation of knowledge and research should be the focal point of the University. According to him the university must pursue three aspects a) Dissemination of knowledge b) Research c) Innovation. The university should also be able to accept new challenges in academic pursuit through the students as also faculty. Collective cooperation between the institutes/ schools are very important but more important than that is the employability of our students after they graduate from the University. For the last part, he felt that the teaching methodology must improve to keep pace with the 21st century.

Finally he spoke about his dream to take AUH to a new height by working together as a team. His speech was widely applauded by all the members present.

Item No 9.2: a) Confirmation of Minutes of the Meeting of the Academic Council held on April 29, 2014

and

b) Action taken on the Minutes of the Eighth Meeting

The Secretary /Registrar then sought the approval of the Academic Council in respect of the Minutes of the 8th meeting of the Academic Council. After a brief discussion, the Minutes was confirmed by the Council. At this juncture, Dr J P Dudeja intervened to say that as per discussion mentioned in the minutes of the last meeting vide clause no 8.7, the equipment was received from Pune, experiments carried out and two research papers have emanated out of this experiment which will be presented in a forthcoming National seminar in Varanasi.

Prof Kiran Devendra suggested that creating awareness about the environmental hazard and its implications are most important. Chairman / Vice Chancellor interjected to mention that while it is very important to create awareness, it is also important to follow a scientific process to redeem such hazards to the extent possible. PVC added that our School of Earth and Environmental Sciences is already working in this direction.

The Action taken points were also approved after Dr J P Dudeja highlighted about the low admission in his institute and repeated his request to accord more publicity to his Department to run courses in the next admission cycle.

Item no AC 9.3: To report the Constitution of Board of Studies

The item was discussed in detail. The minutes of the BOS of AIB, ASET, AMS (Health and Allied Science), and ASLA were submitted for approval. ABS will hold its meeting in near future. After a brief discussion, the minutes were approved.

The Chairman / Vice Chancellor mentioned that BOS is a very important organ of the University and its recommendations on various aspects of academics play a crucial role in academic matters (Course introduction, curriculum revision, syllabi and its revision etc.) of the University. He was of the opinion that BOS must be strengthened to the maximum for improvement of academics. He also emphasized that three external experts must comprise the BOS (one from industry & two from academia). After a brief discussion on the subject, the following decisions were taken:

a) The Minutes of the meeting of the BOS of AIB, ASET, ASLA and AMS (Allied Health Sciences) were approved. However, the item in the minutes of ASET on





Lateral Entry was discussed but not approved with the remarks of the Chairman that the decision is deferred.

- b) The name of the Experts of all the Board of Studies (Five in Number) will be approved by the next academic Council. All the Chairpersons of the respective BOS's may send the names to the Registrar with copy to the Vice Chancellor
- c) The matter related to the creation of Adjunct faculty was discussed and it was approved that this activity will be promoted at AUH to create inter institutional cooperation and inter disciplinary activities. Pro Vice Chancellor remarked that the concept is already in vogue at the University and needs only to be formalized.
- d) Prof A.K. Raghav will prepare a concept paper on the subject above and HOIs will take a decision on the names of the faculty who can be officially shown as adjunct faculty to other institutes/schools (other than their parent Institute).

Item No AC 9.4: Academic Progress Report

The Pro Vice Chancellor presented the Academic Progress report of the University till October, 2014. In her presentation she highlighted the New Programs introduced, new minor tracks introduced, popular minor tracks, academic initiatives, new program details etc. A brief on her presentation is indicated below:

The Chairman/ Vice Chancellor, while appreciating the report and its content, remarked that:

- All such data must be shared with all HOIs who in turn will share the same with other faculties. This will create large connectivity and awareness about the activities being carried out at the AUH.
- A brief report on all the events taking place at any Institute/school must be forwarded to the Registrar with photos etc. This must be done within 48 hrs. of the completion of the event.
- M.Tech, weekend course must be critically analyzed and augmented as the student's strength is very low, whereas, in many other universities this course is very popular. He also mentioned that the Faculty of AUH will be receiving Honorarium for taking up M.Tech weekend programs.

Item No AC 9.5: To ratify syllabi of programs introduced in 2014

The syllabi for all the newly introduced programs were ratified by the Academic Council. Registrar informed that the documents will now be sent to the Dept. Of Education, Govt of Haryana for their information.

Item No AC 9.6: Discussion on the Admission process for 2015-16

Director. Admission presented the admission process as envisaged by the admission section for the 2015-16 cycle. In the process, he also briefed the members of the council with demographic data on Institute wise students strength, state wise students strength etc. As per his data 1673 students have paid fees so far, out of which 75 are international students from 16 countries.

It was seen that the admission in Engineering and Biotechnology has reduced drastically which is a great concern. The reduction in Engineering courses was 35%, which was made note by the members. Vice Chancellor also made it clear that admission of only 36 students through spot counseling of JEE was also not a very good number. This area needs fresh thinking to increase JEE cleared students.

After a prolonged discussion, the Council decided that to improve the admission during next admission cycle (2015) following measures need to be taken:

- · Create Better Visibility
- Create Student Brand Ambassadors.
- Academic Rigor must be in place
- Vigorous Marketing of the University
- Improvement in the quality of the education
- Update the website
- Create excitement and enthusiasm among the students (especially engineering students)
- Enforce strong discipline

PVC was of the view that discipline may not be always enforced through suspension/expulsion but Mentoring &Counseling by the faculty constantly will help the students to a large extent.

Director, Admission ended his presentation by making certain suggestions which, he felt could improve admission. These included a) Liberalized Scholarship scheme, b) Facilitate for Educational Loan) use of referral etc.

The Chairman/Vice Chancellor mentioned to the members that the data on which programs to be introduced in 2015 and which are to be dropped from the present courses must be consolidated by the HOIs and sent to his office by the afternoon of October 30th for consolidation. He also suggested that all programs to be introduced must be meaningful and appropriate for the future of students. He was also of the opinion that a leaflet may be prepared by all the Institutes/schools which may be handed over to all the students by the marketing team during their foray to the schools and education fairs.

Item No AC9.7: IQAC Status Report

Secretary /Registrar briefed the council about the feedback that have been received from IQAC section. The Chairman / Vice Chancellor suggested that this is an important issue and a special meeting of the Academic Council may be convened during the third week of November, 2014.


