



EDUCATIONAL VISIT TO DISTRICT JAIL, GURUGRAM, HARYANA



With a view to apprise and sensitize the students about the factual position of convicts in Prisons and Prison Reforms, a visit was organized by Amity Law School in consultation with Director General Police and Director General Prisons, to the District Jail, Gurugram on 6th September 2018. A total of 50 students of 5th, 7th, and 9th Semesters accompanied by Mr. Pranshul Pathak, Coordinator ALS and Mr. Amit Kumar, Assistant Professor visited the Jail, which is situated in Bhondsi. The jail is established in an area of 50 acres with a capacity of 2500 inmates and presently it houses 2382 inmates comprising of both male and female inmates. On arrival, Mr. Jai Kishan Chillar, Superintendent of Prison, welcomed the students and the faculty. The Jail has separate wards for male and female inmates and their recreational areas are also established separately.

Firstly, the students were shown the visiting area where the inmates could meet their relatives for a maximum duration of 15 minutes and could communicate via an intercom phone. After that, the students were introduced to a cashless procedure through which the inmate's relatives could transfer money to their accounts up to a maximum limit of Rs. 6000 per month.

Thereafter, the Superintendent of Prison students and informed them about the other developmental programmes being run apprised the students that the activities, skills prepare the inmates for a better life outside will bring a positive change in them. The also informed that India Vision Foundation



addressed the activities and in the Jail. He and education the prison and students were (IVF), an NGO

formed by Ms. Kiran Bedi, conducts recreational activities for the reformation of the inmates, with a view to provide them with vocational skills, to help them in integrating back into the society once they are released. This also helps them to earn a living for themselves. The organisation conducts various recreational activities and provides them the opportunity to:

- Read, write, learn and complete their education
- Make painting and sculptures
- Take musical instrument classes sponsored by Sony Pictures
- Take a diploma in hairdressing, makeup, and other salon management courses sponsored by VLCC
- Complete web designing course (including MS Office and Tally)



After completing these courses, they are provided with a certificate of appreciation which can help them with their employment in future.

There is a well-established Khadi Factory in the male ward where they make Khadi thread to be sold to make clothes from. Alongside there is also a sewing and stitching workshop where the inmates make kurtas and handbags. This talent was appreciated in a fashion show organised in Mumbai which was attended by known dignitaries like Zeenat Aman and Pooja Bedi and enhanced by 13 models. The women's ward has a special factory established for manufacturing sanitary pads with the help of Rotary Club, Lioness Club and Sampoorna Club.



The factory has the latest machineries and the extra pads are later distributed free of cost in various prisons of Haryana.

The inmates also performed two beautiful songs for the students expressing their guilt and the kind of reformation that is provided to them by the prison authorities in collaboration with IVF. The students were briefed about the Phoenix Software, developed by one of the inmates, that is being used by the prison authorities to keep a record of the inmates by the Superintendent of Prison Office. The software contains even the minute details of the inmates regarding their meeting session, phone call session and also the things purchased by them from the prison canteen. The SP informed the students that the software is very secure and has received recognition from Haryana Police and Ministry of Home Affairs.

OUTCOME

This jail visit was a very good experience for the students as it is very important for them, as budding lawyers, to understand the system properly and to know the mentality of the people who commit offences. As a result of this, it is evident that the reformative theory is being properly used by the Haryana Police in order to bring a change in the psychology of the inmates and make them a better person to survive in the society.

3. BRIEF REPORT:

Students reached the old age home by college bus provided by the university at 9:30 am. The visit started with the welcome and brief introduction about the old age home by the sister incharge, Ms. Jaise Maria. Tau Devi lal old age home is NGO run old age home and is launched in 2010. It is registered under Indian Red cross society and managed by Registered Society (St Josephs Service Society & Sister of the Destitute). There were total 30 destitute women present in the old age home who were taken care by 2 sisters and 3 staff. Most of the women were mentally challenged whereas 2 were physically challenged as well. She told that these women are above 40 years and are brought by police from various hospitals, railway stations, bus stands, etc. to the old age home. The admission is free and is solely based on the charity and donations from public. The home provides recreational facilities to the residents and they follow a set schedule daily. Later she took students to a tour of the old age home in groups to show the physical facilities. There were 2 dormitories, dining hall, 2 Bathrooms, Kitchen, a multipurpose hall and a medical room. She told that a physician and psychiatrist from civil hospital visit once every week for the checkup of the residents and are called in emergency also.

After the introduction she told students to interact with the residents as it is their activity and leisure time. At first all students said a prayer with the residents, then they sang songs and danced with them. One hour later, they served some snacks which was arranged by the faculty members and students and enjoyed them with the residents.

They played some games and donated some woolen clothes, eatables and a cash amount of Rs. 3000/- to Sister Jaise Maria for the residents. Then they bid goodbye to them and left old age home at 12 noon



- To alert school children from physical abuse, trafficking.





BRIEF REPORT:



A blood donation camp was organized at Amity University Haryana by Amity college of Nursing and Amity Medical School (Dept. of MLT) in collaboration with Delhi Rotary Club on 08 and 09 November 2017. It was held in the B Block Foyer. All the preparations such as registration, arrangement of beds, Refreshments, certification, blood collection procedure etc. were made. A team of doctors and nurses came from the Delhi Rotary Club. Maj Gen (Dr.) Mahavir Singh, Director and Dean, AMS inaugurated the blood donation camp. Donated blood would be used for saving the lives of the injured and the sick.

The blood donation camp started at 10 am both days and closed at 3:30pm. Donors were accompanied by their friends. One of the faculty Mrs. Ruma Chaudhury also addressed the audience that the blood donation does not weaken the donors. The recovery takes place very soon. She talked about facts/ myths/ Blood Groups related information.

The whole process started at Registration desk where the volunteers were given a form to fill up their details by ACON and AMS students. Also, the ACON students took weight and measure Blood Pressure and Pulse of the volunteers. After that, the screened donors went to doctors where they were asked few questions for screening and then their Haemoglobin was assessed. Once found fit, they were then send to collect blood collection bag at a desk where a student volunteer helped the donor to cots where blood was collected by rotary staff. ACON students assisted them and with refreshment to the donors. Once blood was taken, a bandaid was placed on the site and student was given certificate.

On 8th November, total 262 volunteers were registered. Among them 68 were rejected with various reasons viz. Low blood pressure, low haemoglobin.194 volunteers donated the blood.


On 9th November, 205 registrations were made, 71 cases were rejected due to same reasons and 134 volunteers donated the blood.

To coincide with the-Indian Law Day celebrations and to honor the 207 eminent members of the Constituent Assembly who are considered the founding fathers of the Constitution of India ,Amity Law School, a constituent of Amity University Gurgoan organized a Debate competition, Constitutional Quiz, Poster Making competition and at Seminar Hall Block A, on 26TH November 2015
