

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KARGIL VIJAY DIWAS, 2021



Introduction

SAAHAS, the defense and social help club of Amity University, Haryana organized a remarkable event on the occasion of the 22nd Kargil Vijay Diwas, i.e., 26th July 2021, from 11:00am to 1:00pm. The event was organized on a virtual platform at a grand level inviting participants from different universities and schools. The event had over 240 participants and it was a proud moment for team SAAHAS to have had such a magnificent participation. The webinar was significant in two respects; Kargil Vijay Diwas being celebrated for the first time at AUG and the inauguration of the Saahas Club.

<u>Aim</u>

The aim of the webinar was to evoke the patriotic spirit of the faculty, staff and students, as also to give them a historical perspective of the Kargil War.

<u>Scope</u>

The scope of the webinar was to cover: -

- (a) Strategic importance of Kargil.
- (b) Events leading up to the Kargil war.
- (c) A personal account of the war or Lt Gen (Dr) K Himalay Singh, experienced as the Bn Cdr of 27 Rajput for the Capture of pt 5770.
- (d) Pay homage to the martyrs.

The guest of honor was LT GEN (DR) K HIMALAY SINGH, a decorated soldier awarded with the PVSM, UYSM, AVSM, YSM. It was an honor and privilege to listen to account of the war a national hero of his stature. His words, indeed, filled us all with the feeling of patriotism and motivated the youth to work more towards nation building. His words still resonate in our ears "it's not only the soldiers who fight the war, but the whole nation, who supports them".



The event was hosted by MAJ. GEN. GURPAL SINGH BAL, Dean of students' welfare, Amity University Haryana. Followed by an address by respected PROF. (DR.) PB SHARMA, Vice Chancellor, Amity University Haryana, Respected MAJ. GEN. BS SUHAG, DY Vice Chancellor, Amity University Haryana, and MAJ GEN PK SHARMA, Director, Amity Law School. Dr Vikas Madhukar, Dy Pro Vice Chancellor Amity University Haryana was in attendance. Dr Ranjana Kothari, Dy DSW actively assisted in making the event a success.

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Maj Gen GS Bal recounted a detailed historical perspective of the events leading upto the Kargil War. He recounted the accession of J&K to the Indian Union by Maharaja Hari Singh and the 1947 war for Kashmir fought between India and Pakistan. Thereafter, the aftermath of the

1971 war and signing of the Shimla Accord. The transition of the AGPL to LOC. The period of peace between 1971 and 1988 followed by the beginning of an era of militancy in J&K. Bringing out the strategic importance of the NH-1 and Kargil, he further recounted the devious manner in which Pak troops in the garb of militants tried to cut off NH-1. The war that followed to regain lost territory was one of the most fiercely fought battles claiming the lives of 572 Indian Soldiers.



Respected VC in his address to the students paid homage to the fallen soldiers and stated that the cost of freedom is met by the blood shed by our soldiers. He added that students must try and emulate the patriotism and sacrifices made by soldiers, it is due to their commitment and fearless actions that we feel safe in the confines of our homes.

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Our guest of honour **Lt Gen Himalay Singh**, gave a blow-by-blow account of the capture of pt 5770 by his Battalion, the 27 Rajputs.



The immaculate planning and fearless execution led to the capture of the Pakistani post located at 18500 ft. He further recounted as to how the post was reorganized after the capture. Lt Gen Himalay revealed that the Pakistani authorities refused to take back the dead soldiers. Eventually the Pakistani soldiers in the tradition of the Indian Army were given a burial with full military honors.

Answering questions of the students he stated that our resources for intelligence gathering and detection were vastly improved, and the repeat of a Kargil like situation was a remote possibility. Responding to one of the students he recounted his career in the Indian Army as most satisfying and enriching experience. He encouraged students to give a serious

thought towards a career in the Indian Armed Forces, to serve the Nation with dignity and honor and to experience the adventures of life far beyond the comprehension of most.



Maj Gen PK Sharma speaking elegantly, emphasized the lessons learnt from the Kargil War. He stated that we needed to be "Atma Nirbhar" in developing our own weaponry so that we don't go begging for arms and ammunition during crisis situations that may occur

almost anytime. Concluding his talk Maj Gen Sharma was of the opinion that our nation and in particular our youth needed to adopt a proactive rather than a reactive attitude. We must preempt our enemy rather than waiting for him to take the initiative. The Balkot strike was one such example.

Thanking the participants in particular Lt Gen K Himalay Singh, Maj Gen GS Bal Concluded the webinar by saying –

"Our flag does not fly because the winds blows it, it flies with the very last breath of each soldier who died protecting it"

INDEPENDENCE DAY CELEBRATION <u>15 AUGUST, 2021</u>

- 1. Amity University, Haryana, celebrated 75th Independence Day on 15 August 2021 at the hostel plaza with gaiety and enthusiasm. It was attended by a large number of faculty, staff and their children. Some hostellers (Ph D Scholars and JRF students) were also present for the celebration.
- 2. The program commenced with flag hoisting. Hon'ble Vice Chancellor, Dr P B Sharma unfurled the national flag and delivered his Indendence Day address. Paying homage to the martyrs, the VC stated that freedom comes with a cost, the sons of mother India have spilt their blood to gain us the freedom that we enjoy today. The India of our dreams will take shape with the collective effort and wisdom of its citizens. Further he emphasized upon the secular fiber of India. India draws its strength from "unity in diversity". He futher added that let not diversity become a tool of manipulation by the divisive forces that may try to divide us on the lines of our ethnic. cultural and religious identities.
- 3. The DSW , Maj Gen G S Bal, was thereafter invited to address the august gathering. Recollecting the sacrifices made by our freedom fighters and soldiers who were martyred during the freedom struggle and the 1947-48 , 1962, 1965,1971 and the recent 1999 Kargil wars, he requested the audience to rise and honour those who had died by maintaining a 2 min silence . He reminded the audience of the fundamental rights and fundamental duties enshrined in our constitution. While our countrymen have in the past raised their voices aginst the violation of fundamental rights , the fundamental duties needed to be more seriously acted upon by our citizens ,to make India a better place to live in. In the end he emphasized that students while enjoying the screen presence of **reel heros** , must study and embibe personality and character traits form the lives and sacrifices of our **real heros**.
- 4. Patriotic songs sung by Mr Asok and Dr Sunita raised the patriotic spirits of the audience. A poetic narration by Marshal Subedar Rakam Singh was also well received by the audience.
- 5. The program was concluded with the vote of thanks delivered by Dy Dir Hostels, Col Vijay singh. Thereafter refreshments were offered to those prenet at the venue.




Illustration on Indian Geology

### Day 1, 21 Feb 2021

## <u>Session 1</u> "Astrophotonic Spectrographs" Distinguished Lecture by Dr. Pradip Gatkine NASA Hubble Fellow California Institute of Technology (Caltech)

The invited talk on "Astrophotonic Spectrographs" which was a part of National Science Day celebration was formally open by Dr. Anurag Sharma. Our HoI Prof. AK Yadav extended warm welcome to the speaker Dr. Pradip Gatkine. A formal introduction of the speaker was given by Dr. Supreet. Dr. Pradip Gatkine is a NASA Hubble Fellow at California Institute of Technology. He did his PhD and MS in Astronomy from University of Maryland College Park, B.Tech. in Mechanical Engineering from IIT Bombay.


Dr. Gatkine has received many prestigious fellowships. David & Ellen Lee Prize Postdoctoral Fellowship, MIT Kavli Fellowship, NASA Earth and Space Science Fellowship, Board of Visitors Outstanding Graduate Student Award for research excellence, Andrew S. Wilson Prize for Excellence in Research • Outstanding Graduate Assistant Award, are just few of them.

Dr. Pradip started the talk by explaining what are exoplanets, how are they observed in the universe. He discussed how photonics plays powerful role as next generation of astronomical instruments breaking the barriers of mass, volume and cost. He also discussed the ongoing improvements in this field which include innovative photonic technologies such as cascade AWGs, waveguide Bragg-Gratings, Photonic spectro-interferometer. He also explained how these applications enable new and exciting science to explore exoplanets. He also explained the astrophotonics also benefits also stream like Biophotonics, Atmosphere and climate studies, earth sensing etc.

The talk was very interesting and intriguing and success of the event was measured by the interaction of students with the speaker. Students ask their questions about parallel universe, existence of life on other planets, about the waveguides and career opportunities in this field etc. Queries were welcomed and answered by Dr. Pradip.





#### **12.1** General Introduction of the Event

An expert lecture session organised by Dr. Suvro Parui, Assistant Professor (Chinese).

The keynote speaker invited was Amb. Anil Trigunayat, President MICCIA, former Indian Ambassador to Jordan, Libya, and Malta. The honourable Ambassador's lecture was titled: "Wither China in the Current Global Disorder"

The objectives of the talk were to understand the reasons and consequences of China's actions on the world order. How the world especially China's main rival US is affected by China's rise and steps it takes to counter it and maintain its supremacy. How China's actions effect India as a neighbour and how India can best manage the China factor.

#### 12.3 Brief about the address/talk of speakers

Speaking from his rich experience and deep understanding about the world order, the lecture delivered by Amb. Anil Trigunayat was very insightful and detailed. He explained about the challenges China faces as it strives to become the next superpower and how the West is looking at it. China has developed as a country since it understood that it was advancement in technology that would take it forward, however its rise has also caused China to have problems with other superpowers and almost all its neighbours. He sighted the example of the Winter Olympics hosted by China this year, where most of the world leaders were found missing.

Amb. Anil Trigunayat talks about the Pandemic, global recession, greater border controls and increasing govt control, climate change as a major concern, and major trust deficit in the world order today.

He speaks about how China doesn't want to create war but creates public opinion warfare, psychological warfare, legal warfare causing people to doubt their own countries. Thus, holding political power itself, influence foreign decision makers and how hey look at China.

China is a major challenge for most of the liberal world, esp. India. China does not consider India as an equal, culturally or otherwise. So, it uses its might to constrain India, India needs to make efforts to deal with such a challenge. The honourable Ambassador proposes that the way to face such a challenge is that all international agreements must be adhered to. Border issues must be handled efficiently and observed strictly, as it is unacceptable to do business as usual if the border is in unrest.

Each country has its own set of aspirations but a balance and management are essential with dialogue and communication. Civilised nations like India and China must take the longer view.

Hegemonic attitude disturbs successful partnerships.

## 12.4 'Take Homes' for the Guest and Attendees

The "Take Homes" for the Attendees was a clearer understanding of the international dynamics with reference to China and its relevance towards India.

His detailed lecture helped attendees understand China's goal toward becoming the next superpower and how that effects the rest of the world order especially India. He also proposed ideas about the way these challenges may be addressed.



**15.1** General Introduction of the Event

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1. Every year India celebrates the making and adopting of its Constitution, on 26 November. In keeping with that and like previous years, Amity Law School, in collaboration with We The People Abhiyan, an NGO, with whom we an Ongoing MOU, organised a Webinar on "Making of the Indian Constitution", at 3:00 PM on 24 November 2021.


2. The Event was held on Zoom and Live streamed on YouTube. It was attended by nearly 120 participants, including all Faculty Members of Amity Law School and a large number of our students. 3. A total of 389 Members representing diverse fields and religions were initially involved in drafting the Constitution, which number, after Partition, was reduced to 299. In addition to each Article, they discussed a few very important aspect like, who should get Right to Vote and what should be the language of the Constitution. An interesting discussion ensued whether the Preamble should start with "We the People swear by God" or "swear by Goddess". It was decided not to include any but only state "We The People".

4. A Quiz was organised for the Participants which basically related to our present day conduct. The House was then open to Question Answers and views were also sought from


the Participants on the issue, "Have you ever felt excluded from a decision that impacted you?".



# Report

Two-day National Conference on NEP: 2020 Human Values and Indian knowledge System was organized by Amity Academic Staff College & Amity School of Sanskrit and Indic Studies, Amity School of Liberal Arts, Amity University, Haryana. The programmed was sponsored by Indian Council of Philosophical Research (ICPR). The programmed was held on 23 and 24 November 2021.

## **Inaugural Session**

Day one of the National Conference's Program started with a beautiful Sanskrit rendition by Dr Supriya Sanju.

Opening remarks were delivered by Dr. Sanjana Vij, program Director, Amity Academic Staff College, Amity University, Haryana: Attainment of Highest Education is not merely getting information but learning to balance harmony with existence, she said recalling the famous words of Rabindranath Tagore. She also expressed gratitude towards Indian Council of Philosophical Research and others for joining the inaugural session. Education should be a set of belief systems that guides our attitude...and helps us to grow and develop a better perspective for becoming a better human being. In todays fast changing technological world, full of stress, conflict, lack of ethics like integrity and trust, it is very important that we have to learn to be humane. In our ancient days people rose to greater heights in their career but were aware of human values. In our Indian Education System happiness quotient was an important part which is lacking in the present day education system...Indian knowledge System of our past needs to be revisited, she added. Scientific temperament, research and development is to be integrated in our education system. NEP is in the right direction, according to her. We have to attain a correct balance between modern and ancient values and should aim at becoming problem solvers. Dr.

Sanjana also added that education should be directed towards how to learn to be spiritualistic, peaceful and happy and not only materialism should be our aim of education.

**COME ADDRESS:** Dr. Sanjay K. Jha: Director Amity School of Liberal Arts welcomed all the guests who had joined the online Inaugural session. Chairperson of ICPR Ramesh Chandra Sinha was welcomed by Dr. Jha. Rajyogini Brama Kumari Asha Didi, Professor Ramesh Kumar Pandey, Dr. Shashi Bala, Dr. Anamik Sah, Dinesh Chandra Sastri were also welcomed by Dr. S K Jha. Our honourable VC Dr. P B Sharma and Pro-VC Dr. Padmakali Banerjee of Amity University, Haryana were also welcomed by Dr. Jha. He also welcomed Rear Admiral KK Pandey, director HR and Dr Sanjana Vij, programme coordinator.

Dr S K Jha started by saying that need for becoming a better human being and creation of a better society through better education is to be highlighted in through the NEP 2020. He likened the human values with Sanatan Dharma as he feels its both prescriptive and proscriptive religion and is purely universal. Universal because its values are not confined to any particular religion but to all other religions. It rather pertains to the whole humankind. According to Dr. Jha, the NEP conference is being very timely held as education is gradually losing its purpose and becoming merely a source of information. Purpose of education should be to liberate us uman beings from negativity and sufferings. 'Savidyaya' liberates us from mental and physical sufferings, he stressed. Today's education he feels rather aggravates our sufferings because survival and success has gained the centre stage.

Recalling the words of P B Sharma VC he said, purpose of education should not be to create an army of degree holders but people who can co-exist with nature in a sustainable way and take care of nature as well. Education system of today's teaches us only how to fill our bellies and not how to live and coexist in harmony with people and our surroundings.

NEP 2020 is a very rational approach and teaches us better communication for being a better human being. According to him, there already is immense potential in our traditional education system which is full of human values, but to heal our broken society what is required is "collective efforts". Like a marriage that works better with co-ordination, he explained.

**THEMATIC ADDRESS** was given by Pro-Vice Chancellor Prof. Padmakali Banerjee, Amity University Haryana.

Dr. Banerjee began by congratulating the team for taking up such a great and relevant topic, i.e NEP2020. According to her, the emphasis on ethical values and reasoning in the NEP 2020 that is also a part of our ancient learning system is already being focused upon by Amity University, Haryana. In Behavioral Science every student that passes from Amity is taught these human values, she added.

She asked the audience to draw their attention to our ancient texts like Bagwatgita to understand the human values better. They teach us that spirituality is all about leading a good life. Even the teachings of Shankaracharya and Swami Vivekananda teach us about how one can lead a good life. In any human being's life two things are important at the end..1)whether they had a happy life. and 2) whether they will attain moksha or enlightenment. Attainment of these two aims is of utmost importance to any person, she added.

Our effort and aim should be to make India into a hub of knowledge, based on the teachings of our ancient texts like vedas and vedantas. These teachings should be included in our curriculum. Towards Registrar

this end, Amity School of Liberal Arts, Amity University, Haryana has also established an outreach centre like the School of Sanskrit and Indic Studies for this purpose. So, that people from various backgrounds can contribute towards a wholistic, value based. education. How does a university include all these value-based teachings and ethics in their curriculum for future, that should be the focus of our education system, added Prof. Banerjee.

**KEYNOTE ADDRESS**: Vice-Chancellor Professor P B Sharma: Amity University, Haryana.

Professor Sharma laid stress on Human values and what do they mean for humanity and how it can be inculcated in our lifestyle. According to him, now is the opportune time with NEP 2020. "We can look back at our rich treasure of heritage hidden in our scriptures and vedas which needs to be inculcated well in our knowledge system.

Seriously we should focus on how human values can be integrated in our education system...so that our students are able to follow them lifelong. Now, our education system lacks all these values and has become only a means to earn more and more money.

We have lost our path in the current age, where young go after career prospects and materialistic gains. Need is to focus on how we can use education to make us a better human being capable of taking good care of our nature. Education should be such that before dying we should have that satisfaction that we have helped in creating a better earth, as compared to what we had received at the time of our birth.

Today in front of our country we have both challenge and opportunity to spread our old Indian knowledge system to the world outside. Indian knowledge system has to be understood well and deeply. Our ancestors have said that knowledge is revealed only to those who have a pure heart and only they can receive true knowledge who have an inspired mind. Only such people are capable of receiving the true knowledge, added Prof. Sharma.

"karmanyevadika raste maa faleshu kadachana, nirvighnam kurumedeva maa faleshu kadachana"..re recited.

Education and degrees should not become means for minting money or to simply exploit nature. In Indian Knowledge System people with capabilitiesy should not bow before others..Indian knowledge system taught us that those who make a dedicated effort to serve society was a part of our education system. It teaches us to serve with truth...Satyamev Jayate..Personal integrity, harmony with nature and people, sustainability all these should be our guiding light to retain the beauty of nature...we should treat the whole world as a family..knowledge is not a monopoly of few but a universal possession, he stressed. It is important to inculcate all these values so that one is able to take care of nature. It is important that we redesign a new world, so that over consumption is checked so that it is not at the cost of our mother nature. Prof. Sharma emphasized on the importance of sustainable existence. "Human Value is something that can be practiced with pleasure and posessed with pride" till the last breath of our existence, added Prof. Sharma.

**GUEST OF HONOUR** Prof. Ramesh Kumar Pandey VC, Shri Lal Bahadur Shastri National Sanskrit University, New Delhi was the Guest of Honour. "Our Indian Knowledge System is known for 'gyan' knowledge and 'vigyan' science." said Prof. Pandey. Our teachers gave us knowledge that helped us build our character...Veda created the world full of knowledge! In Gurukul, our teachers during the 'dikshanta Registrar

samaroh' used to give order that truth, and dharma be followed. He added that our Prime Minister's idea in NEP is that we should all become global citizens. Education would only mean education for animals, if the teachings are not able to guide us towards freedom from lack of knowledge and wisdom. Udhisthira asks Yaksha and receives the answer that one who takes no loan and stays in their own house are truly happy human beings. so it is easy to remain happy. Rishis have given us knowledge for which we should be grateful. Our knowledge system has created a path already and we have to go forward with that knowledge.

Human beings should seek true knowledge.

Gurus should give 'gyan parampara' to students, or proper path to be followed by students. Knowledge of vedas would make us a better person. Be it teachers or students, in the NEP we should try to follow the path of truth. With belief 'shraddha' and 'vishwas' will make our country a guide for rest of the world.

GUEST OF HONOUR SHASHI BALA, Dean Centre for Indology, Bharatiya Vidya Bhawan, New Delhi

NEP aims at preparing students to become ideal students, ideal human beings and citizens. We should maintain a world more livable full of ethics and philosophy. Our forefathers were richly respected...'shresthis' or traders were respectfully received all through the world. Indian culture was dominating the hearts of the world...nature has been exploited for money. We in the past worshipped religion...it was "naturalistic". Exploitation of nature has caused more unhappiness, betrayal, treachery, misery. Our greed has fed 'paap'/wrongdoing. She emphasized on Collective approach, ideals of togetherness, freedom from confrontation and coordination and harmony for all. Sense of oneness will create harmony, according to Dr Bala. Cooperation and hard work is the key to success in any organisation. like Krishna who did not gain anything in Mahabharata but lastly the larger goal was the victory of adharma over dharma. The leader in any organisation should be like krishna who is a strategist, problem solver, with strong decision making capacity. We can create a capsule that can help our students in future. Highest level of achievement is reached by those who live a life of balance and ethics. Life lived like this becomes a happy one. Indian authors do not teach and understand our ethos,...books by foreign authors should not be allowed to be taught in Indian Universities, beacuse they do not understand our society well. Employer and employee should enter the office with pure mind and speech. Consciousness depends on 'man' i.e mind. So we as human beings should ponder over how we can derive maximum from our forefathers' vaues and ethics.

THEMATIC ADDRESS by Professor DINESH CHANDRA SHASTRI, director Haryana Sanskrit Academy.

NEP 2020: Through the use of 10 to 15 sanskrit shlokas good information can be sent to the students..so that special books will not be required if we take sanskrit shlokas and teach good values to our students. We sould teach the students from the very beginning simple values like to speak the truth, and not to eye others wealth and women. The fact that Vedas have never changed shows its resilience. Jahaan Niti ki shiksha deta hai Barat, vahaan Nnaitik shiksha ka kya kaam hai" ...was his key words.

**THEMATIC ADDRESS** by Rajyogini Brahma Kumari ASHA DIDI director, Om Shanti Retreat Centre, Vilaspur, Haryana. We pray that God please take us from darkness to light and from untruth towards truth. i.e "andhkar se prakash ki or, asatya se satya ki or", that should be the purpose of education.

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when we were kids , our elders were not that educated but had knowledge..the foundation of our life with an invisible energy that still fills up our lives, making us more peaceful in todays world. The basic difference between a human and a devil is character and values. Gurukul...were princes as children used to go and after completion of examination , they entered their kingdom...Sukumar's guru tortured him , was made to do difficult work. Prince had to work in really bad conditions. When raja's mantris came to take him, the guru did not send him back...He said the education was still incomplete. Prince was made to suffer even more. Guru said tomorrow when he sits on the seat of rajas, he should feel that his unjustified actions could have a bad impact on commoners. he should have to understand that. Even for us it is true. We have to cherish the values that our teachers have given ..."values are never taught but caught". According to her, at times top class students come to us but are depressed over others doing well, this shows inner weakness. "vidya se abhimaan nai ana chahiye," she added.

Inner power is needed to deal and accept things as they are...Why is depression increasing? Divorce for example whic was unheard of in our society is gradually becoming very common. The inner strength of Atma is weakening...lessons of our past needs to be revived and implemented in our lives. ACCEPTANCE, APPRECIATION. introversion and introspection, deep silence is necessary for our students....to start the class with two minutes of silence so that students can recapitulate the learning of the class. Positivity is another thing to be imbibed to keep us happy as "life is a celebration". Innovations and creativity can enhance your happiness quotient. Spirituality is knowing how to live life!!!!

**THEMATIC ADDRESS** by Dr. Anamik Shah, President Indian Society of Chemist and Biologist, Lucknow, Former VC and Trustee of Gujarat Vidyapeeth.

The challenge before NEP is whether what we are going to inculcate, truth non-violence, compassion, communal harmony are non-negotiable in any country.

When we talk about ethics and morality is NEP equipped to deal with this?, he asked.

**INAUGURAL ADDRESS** by Chief Guest, Professor Ramesh Chandra Sinha, Chairman Indian Council of Philosophical Research (ICPR)

Education is the accumulation of information only it entails cultivation of values in life. NEP lays great emphasis on ethical values because in global world a post modern world...the paradigm shift has taken place from the Marxist Philosophy. the New Education Policy has great vision of PM i.e of how values are important in educational life. Pitiable condition in education. Earlier Ministry of Human Resource Development which has now become Ministry of Education. A right decision, where philosophy and values have been righlty emphasized.

In this technological age, a person or nation who are too advanced in this lopsided development, development of resources as well as human beings and values. If one does not catch up with technology, they are considered to be poor. In this NEP values have been given due importance. Education system should be developed in such a way that it inculcates technology with values. In the global world technology is important which should be linked with values. NEP 2020 has given enough opportunity for 'Indianness' to stay rooted in our glorious past. NEP does not deride the English language but pays due importance to Hindi as well.

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It was followed by a Book launch ceremony by Prof Uday Narayan Singh, Dean Faculty of Arts, Amity University and Rajarshi Singh.."The other India, View from Below."

## **TECHNICAL SESSION ( DAY 1)**


Session I: At the outset Dr. Sunil Kumar Mishra, Associate Professor, Amity School of Liberal Arts emphasized on the importance of five elements of human values. He said that with NEP, we are back on track following the same philosophy preached by our rishis. Afterwards he welcomed Plenary Speaker and Chair of the Session Dr. Pankaj. K. Mishra, Department of Sanskrit, St. Stephen's College, University of Delhi. Dr. Pankaj. K. Mishra delivered his presentation on Look Past, Implement Present, Set Future: NEP2020. He stated that NEP is a direction from India to Bharat and it's the need of the hour to understand and implement Indian Culture and Indian Traditions. He stated that since advent of NEP, a comprehension of education has started in India. He further discussed the need of NEP2020 as it focusses to instill in learner intellect, knowledge and sustainable development. Its lays emphasis on global leadership and focusses on Dharma, peace, shanti and life skills. In NEP, participation in community program is a must and it is an important ingredient in the overall development of an individual. He further stated how NEP gives the importance to mother tongue as mother tongue empowers the learners and NEP through this approach, presents a complete road map of Indian culture. He said that India has already lost 220 languages in the past and 22 languages are also facing difficulty to survive. For Sanskrit, he said that it should not be used only as a subject but as a medium. After the Introductory note of Plenary Speaker, presentations of the speakers began and the first speaker, Dr. Raj Kamal Mishra, Additional Registrar and Researcher delivered his presentation on NEP2020: Human Values and Indian Knowledge System. He stated that any language owned by any state will continue but those not owned by any state will demolish. He further said that education is more than just providing knowledge rather it is the realization of your inner self. Followed by him Prof. Prasannanshu, Professor of Linguistic, National Law University, New Delhi expressed his views on Linguistics Analysis of the Concept of "Value" in NEP2020. In his presentation, said that a learned person is not one who has information rather who values equality. Mr. Kush Kumar delivered his presentation on Role of NEP2020 in Transforming Future Generation: A Descriptive Analysis. He stated that in ancient times we had gurukuls and NEP2020 caters to the contemporary needs by keeping our culture and tradition intact. Dr. Shiv Swaroop Jha, Head, Amity College of Commerce, AUH delivered his presentation on Ramayana: An Oasis in Desert of Human Values. In his prestation he stated that Ramayana focusses on the fact that Dharma is beyond compromise. At the end of Session I, the Chair gave his inputs on the presentations of the presenters.

Session II: At the outset of Session II, Dr. Pooja Thakur from Amity School of Liberal Arts introduced Plenary Speaker and Chair of the Session Prof. Rishipal, Professor of Pedagogy, Dean Humanities and Applied Sciences and COE, Vishwakarma Skill University, Haryana. In his presentation on National Education Policy 2020: An Intervention of Resurgence of Bhartiya Value System in Indian Education, Prof

Rishipal discussed that values come from knowledge system, how an individual has been brought up and what methodologies have been used in his education. He said that knowledge and learning is a simultaneous process and deterioration of human values leads to deterioration of humanity. When family values and Dharma get disturbed, all the five basic elements of human life are destroyed. He further stressed that there is need to correct the knowledge system and it can be corrected through gyan, so right knowledge is very important for better life which leads to better society. After his Introductory address, presenters delivered their presentations. At first Dr. Chandan Kumar Jha delivered his presentation on *Bhartatiya Gyaan Parampara Mein Vyaktitv Ki Avdharna*. He said that as man is a social animal so man and society are interrelated. Followed by him, Dr. Sunita Yadav presented her paper on *Stimulating Indian Knowledge System, Arts and Culture.* She said that around one crore people throughout the world have been benefitted from Indian cultural wealth. Mrs. Asha Yadav and Mrs. Suman delivered their presentation on *Human values and professional Ethics.* Their presentation focused on the value of education and basic guidelines on NEP. The session ended with a note of appreciation and inputs by the Chair.

Session III: Dr. Girija Suri, Assistant professor, Amity School of Liberal Arts welcomed Plenary Speaker and Chair of the Session Prof. Sanjay. K. Jha, Director, Amity School of Liberal Arts, Amity University Haryana. Prof. Jha delivered his Introductory Presentation on Decoding Human Values Enshrined in Indian Epistemology. He started his presentation with the statement of the problem why humanity is at stake today and why education has lost his purpose. He stated that purpose of education is to liberate us from physical, mental and social suffering. Merely getting academic degrees can't make us real human beings. In the modern era, human beings have become intelligent robots and on the contrary Indian Knowledge System focusses on "Be Human." NEP 2020 lays emphasis on moral education and human values. He further said that we need to create forum from all areas like media and education so that we can get better form of education. First Presenter from Technical Session III, Dr. Shradhanvita Singh delivered her presentation on NEP and Slum Education: A Critical Perspective. She discussed about Sarv Shiksha Abhiyaan and Right to Education. Mrs. Ruchi Gupta presented her paper on Human Values in Sanskrit Literature and Puranas. Ms. P. Uma Nair, a young student from Amity School of Liberal Arts presented her paper on Role of NEP2020 in Transforming Future Generation. Her paper was well appreciated by the chair. Mrs. Chavi Arora delivered her presentation on Mapping Value of Education and Value of Vedic Essence with New Normal Mentorship. This session concluded with the inputs and appreciation for all the presenters by the esteemed chair

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## **TECHNICAL SESSION - DAY -II**

**SESSION IV:** The second day of the programme started with a Sanskrit rendition by Dr. Supriya Sanjju. It was followed by Dr.S K Mishra recapitulating the events of the first day of the conference. According to Dr. Mishra more than 250 participants, presenters and delegates were benefitted from the deliberations at the conference.

The fourth session was conducted by Professor Rachna Bimal who was the plenary speaker and chair of the session IV. She is from Satyawati College, Delhi University, She spoke on the Title: Bharatiya Gyan Parampara aur Naitik Mulyo ki Alok Me Varsh 2020 ki Rashtriya Shiksha Niti

Laying emphasis on the New Education Policy 2020, she said first time a bridge is being created between western/occident education and eastern or oriental education. She drew the attention of the viewers to the fact that till the 16th century agricultural and pastoralism was the mainstay of our economic system. in the 19th century it was followed by industrial revolution. It spread from Europe to cover the whole world. And the entire world became a market. The result was that West became the producer and rest became the consumer of goods. A world of demand and supply was created. We became driven by commerce. It was followed by Information revolution backed by technological advancements.

The need of the hour is to concentrate on dissemination of right kind of information. Another need is to encourage skill based teaching. Our 1000 years of education system teaches us to be civilized human beings follow a path that differentiates us, humans from animals. Information has helped to change the world. Here comes the role of teachers. Gyan is not only based on degrees but on 'parampara' or tradition. For example our older traditions emphasized on the fact that persons should start the daily chores like cooking etc. only after taking a bath. It had a very scientific reason behind it. Even the practice of watering Tulsi plant in the morning, the importance of which the world is now acknowledging. Today the world is recognizing the importance of these treasures.

All these older traditional practices make us different from animals. Due to globali sation, the trend has changed in the recent years. Today the mantra has changed to "I should remain happy and others should remain sad." Simple living is no more applicable. Too much of consumerism has now become the norm. Earlier, only basic needs had to be fulfilled.

Our vedic texts and its knowledge has the capability to take us towards light. Like the Gurkuls, which were a storehouse of knowledge. In the recent years, Lord Macaulay has misdirected us by saying that our ancient knowledge lacked scientific temper.

But as far as our old scriptures are concerned it is full of scientific knowledge. For example, Yajurveda talked about planets and earth and important information about them. Wat needs to be done now is to mix the knowledge of todays education system and our past traditionl knowledge. NEP has chapter on values in human life.And the onus lies on teachers like us who have to lay the keystone of all encompassing knowledge.

Through lectures we teachers can integrate dohas, eg. Rahim's dohas with economic knowledge to explain our economy. NEP is giving us an opportunity to integrate our past knowledge with the present form of knowledge. We should encourage students to think , deliberate, debate and create a situation where our students can benefit.

The first presenter for the fourth session was Dr. Vishal Bhardwaj, Assistant Professor, Department of Sanskrit, Guru Nanak DevUniversity, Amritsar Title: Panchatantra Mein Varnit Manaviya Muliya.

Dr. Bharadwaj laid emphasis on the rich knowledge handed down over to us by Vishnusharma's Panchatantra, Kautilya's Arthashastra etc. traditional texts. According to him, all our texts spoke about ahimsa, a very important value. In China he said the problem of coronavirus started here because of consumpton of raw meat. Something that has been comletely prohibited in our older tradition and texts. Now, because of the mistake of China, the whole world is reeling under this problem of covid. In our traditional texts, like Vishnusarma says, we should never hurt even an insect or an ant. The one who does that will never attain moksha and swarga. One who kills humans and animals will go to 'narka' and for him swarga is unattainable. In our old tradition we are also taught to take care of animals. Another important value that is taught to us through the stories of Panchatantra is that one should not eye others wealth and women. Greed for possession of others things is not to be encouraged.

In human beings Vishnusharma gives utmost importance to satisfaction or 'santosh'. Mental peace will come only when one is without any enemy. So, people should have good friendship with everyone and not have too many enemies to ensure their mental peace.

Visnusharma, according to Dr. Bharadwaj lays stress on grihasta ashram, dan and mitron ka sangraha. Even the creation of wealth has to be done without hurting anyone. Vishnusharma says..one should gain enough money without too much aggression and hurt. Dr. Bharadwaj concluded by saying that 'Santosh', 'daya', 'daan' are important values that has to be followed by human beings.

Second presenter for the session was Dr. Saloni, Assistant Professor, Department of Sanskrit, Guru Nanak Dev University, Amritsar. Title: Manaviya Mulyon Ke Sandarbha Mein Sanskrit Sahitya

Dr. Saloni emphasized on how a family that stays together is of utmost importance for the growth of a powerful society. In a joint family were there is only one head of the family is the ideal form of a family. Today's system is of nuclear families, where the family values are decaying. Our tradition teaches the son to be obedient. For example in Yajurveda, four ashrams have been discussed at length and there son is entreated to obey their mothers and fathers. Right kind of behaviour is also empasized in the ayjurveda that lays emphasis on 'gyan', 'dharma', 'sharma', 'shanti', 'ahimsa' and other human values that are to be followed. She said, there is also emphasis on things in our older texts that have to be avoided like 'hatya', chori', 'chugalkhori', 'nastikta', 'paap' etc. In Gita too according to Dr. Saloni there is talk about moving from "kaam to krodh" laying down that greed and lust gives rise to aggression and anger.

Session V : Dr. Sapna Sharma , Assistant professor, Amity School of Liberal Arts welcomed Plenary Speaker and Chair of the Session Prof. Sanat Kumar Sharma , Associate Professor, Department of Sociological Studies, School of Social Sciences and Policy , Central University of South Bihar Gaya . In his Introductory speech on *Value based Education is the Cornerstone of a Strong Society,* Prof. Sharma stressed upon the importance of *Aadarsh* and *Purusharth.* He discussed the journey from Aham to Vayam and said it is the prior goal of human life. He further discussed that it is the value-oriented education that guides a person throughout his journey. He said that the basis of the education is spirituality and without spirituality, development of moral values is not possible. He further stated that balance and harmony is another feature of "Values of Life." For "Values of Life" there are some rules to be followed. Artha and Karma are intrinsic values and Dharma and Moksha are extrinsic values. He said

that valueless education is the biggest reason for backwardness of the society and by instilling values in the personality of our children, we can empower our society. First speaker of the Session, Prof. J. K. Mehta, Adjunct Professor and Advisor, Career Point University, Hamirpur (H.P.) delivered his presentation on *Inculcating Moral Values as Soft Skills*. He said that NEP focusses on the holistic development of an individual. He further stressed on the importance of social and emotional learning and how they contribute to the overall development of any human being. Second presenter of this session Mr. Prasanna. S. Harihar presented his views on *The Holistic Personality Development Fulfilling the Goal of NEP2020*. He stated that change is the only constant phenomenon and education is the powerful weapon to bring change in the world. Dr. Rajinder Pandey, presented his views on *Thematic and Textual Analysis of Hindi Self-Instructional Material (SIM) of NIOS at Secondary Level*. Dr. Savita Sharma delivered her presentation on *Spirituality: A Common Connect Underlying Human Values* and mentioned that NEP focusses on the intrinsic values of *satya, ahimsa and dharma*. Dr. Mohnider Kumar in his presentation on *Integral Development of Human Resource Development* focused on the qualities of self- knowledge and institutional transformation.

Session VI: Session VI of the conference started by welcoming the chair Dr. Shruti Kant Pandey, Dean, Department of Sanskrit, Amity University Noida by Dr. Abhilasha Singh, Assistant Professor, Amity University Haryana. He presented his views on NEP 2020: A Tool to Reinstate Indian Knowledge System. He stated that India is known for its eternal culture and civilization. Being one of the oldest civilizations of the earth, it has a vast repository of knowledge systems in all walks of life. We are the heir to the greatest epics, Vedas and Granthas. But the new generation is not familiar with these aspects of Indian Culture. NEP 2020 is a powerful means to revive and restore the Indian Knowledge System for the allround benefit of mankind. The policy emphasizes on incorporation of features of traditional knowledge into the curriculum of modern institutions and admits the fact that the ancient educational institutions including Gurukula, Parishads, Viharas and Vishwavidyalaya like Nalanda set the highest criterions of creation, preservation, expansion and dissemination of knowledge through multiple means. First Speaker of this session P. Laxmi Nair in her presentation on Learning to live Together :21st Century Skill NEP2020 elaborated that the purpose of education in ancient India was not the possession of knowledge but for the whole understanding and liberation of oneself. The purpose of the policy is to have the highest-quality education for all learners regardless of social or economic background. Ms. Sakshi Vermani in her presentation on Inculcating Values Through Mythological Texts: A Philosophical Perspective said by studying, reading and sharing these texts, they act as a magnificent window for making our value system strong. The stories in Indian mythology are most effective in conveying powerful messages to the readers thereby influencing their personality. NEP 2020 stresses on making our future generation and our teachers must be grounded in Indian Culture, Indian Philosophy and Indian Mythology. Mr. Dinesh Kumar delivered his presentation on Academic Anxiety Among School Students During COVID 19 in India and how educational activities are hampered to a great extent.

**SESSION VII:** In the last session of the conference Dr. Parul Yadav introduced the Chairperson Prof. Sarita Sharma. Prof. Sharma in her Introductory presentation on *Human Values and Indian Knowledge System in NEP2020* mentioned that Indian civilization has always attached great value to knowledge and witness its amazingly large body of intellectual texts. National Education Policy 2020 stresses upon recognizing, identifying, and strengthening the unique capabilities of each student, achieving foundational literacy and numeracy in all students by Grade 3, flexibility for learners to

choose their learning trajectories and programs and thereby choosing their paths as per their talents and interests. First presenter of this session Mr. Ganesh Bhat delivered his presentation on *NEP 2020: Value Based Education and Teaching Pedagogy in the light of Upnishads.* Ms. Shubhra presented her views on *Nai Shiksha Niti 2020: Puratan Vidya awan Bhartiya Mulaya.* Last presenter on this session Dr. Prasun Mishra delivered his presentation on *NEP 2020: Human Values and Indian Knowledge System.* He stressed on the point how NEP will help inculcating Indian Values in the students and will teach them their duty towards society at first and humanity at large.

## VALEDICTORY SESSION

Dr. S K Jha, the chair for the valedictory session expressed his gratitude towards all for creating an atmosphere full of energy and vast knowledge.

Dr. Ashutosh Angiras, Director SDS College, Ambala was the first speaker of the session. He began by talking about challenges faced by the current education system. According to him our students are completely a disconnected lot, disconnected with our values. Why? because he believes since we are teaching the students management, sales and marketing skills we cannot expect them to speak the truth.

According to him the knowledge of our rishis was of such a high quality that their minds never became sad and dull. Their needs were very basic. They were not afraid of anything. It is because people become too entangled with materialistc pleasures, consumerism, technology and misuse of science that they become tired and agitated. Technology and money has given us so much of freedom that we do not know how to handle it. Peace is privy and happiness should be the ultimate end/goal, he said.

He described himself and other teachers as not just believers but seekers. He spoke about another challenge, that is, what does our teaching have to do with our thinking, He laments that in the past 70 years no change in syllabus has been brought about in Sanskrit language.

He deliberated on another question, i.e what kind of human beings we need in the society and what are we creating? According to him, academic culture, sensible persons and societal wellbeing are all the three things that is to be created. NEP should aim at creating sensible people with good knowledge and also smart people at the same time. Wellbeing of universe should be the ultimate goal. How should we deal with freedom, that should be taught to the students, because too much of freedom creates problems and destroys peace.

Prof. P B Sharma, Vice- Chancellor, Amity University, Haryana.

Human values are not only for humans, said Dr.Sharma adding that every being in the cosmos should be happy. Our ancestors have always prayed for the betterment of our earth and also for all the creatures in the society. Education which we are imparting is responsible for creating consciousness. Sometimes animals are more sensible than humans. Humans are in a state of crisis due to over consumption. Our forefathers understood that the purpose of education was to create capabilities for a happy life with cultivation of right attitude and right character.

India has changed so much, said Prof. Sharma adding when he was a child no locks were put on the doors of people. We have seen a society where truth funded. And people kept their words no matter what..like

Raja Dashrath who kept his word and sent his son in exile to a forest for keeping his word. Hence the metapor, "pran jae par vachan na jayee." Truth was accompanied with happiness where tension was not prevalent.

Gyan and Vigyaan, had always been intertwined in our ancient tradition..for example how Ashwathama became immortal and how Ram broke the bow during Sita's swayamvara, definitely shows the knowledge of science being there.

Indians could give a lot to the world, be it supreme character, supreme values because we had a rich heritage. We have the capability to create a world where we can live in harmony. We need to look at our Indian Knowledge system well so that we can diseminate this knowledge to the world. We can get peace by sitting under a tree but cannot bring happiness to all without science and its positive use. "Gyan and vigyan dono ki zaroorat hai" that is stressed in Bhagwat Gita because human miseries cannot be cured only by gyan, he surmised. Lastly he said, "Bal, Vivek, Sahas and Paret," all these four were important for enjoyment of the real fruits of success. We have to strive towards making India a guide to the world.

Dr. B A Sagar, VC "There are many details in New Education Policy that supports our Indian values e.g teaching in Hindi language for initial 5 years of schooling. It will help children to understand the curriculum better. There is a lot to learn from guru parampara system of education. The guru has to follow what they preach and only then the students will be able to follow the real teachings," said Dr. Sagar. NEP and the values embodied in it will have to be followed for its actual success. And this task has to be taken forward with everyone's collective effort.

Prof. P K Mishra, St.Stephen's College, Delhi University

Congratulated the Amity ASLA team for taking up a great topic. Indian knowledge system should be spread to the world along with its treasure trove of rich values. "NEP is to be accepted with an open heart and mind. We have to make it a success," said Prof. Mishra.

Shri Akhilesh Mishra, Chief Guest, Ambassador to Ireland at Embassy of India in Ireland.

NEP 2020 not only updates and replaces the Education Policy of 1986 but also reflects a course correction after 8 centuries. Its not that India is averse to welcoming foreign knowledge but the acceptance of knowledge should not be an arbitrary one. There should be a thoughtful compatibility of the new system with the existing one so that it fits in harmoniously and helps to organically grow the original one. It shoud not damage the roots. However, our subjugation by forein rule scrubbed our choice to reject what was not good for us. India suffered badly due to introduction of arab, english etc.foreign languages. Indian civilizational ethos is founded on universal wellbeing it goes beyond human wellbeing to cover all beings. It goes even further, where "gyan vaan was always above balvaan", he said. Education imposed by muslim rulers and the British were completely incompatible with our knowledge system. It created a class of teachers who became mere employees subservient to the vested interests of the foreign traders, missionaries, and rulers. Lord Macaulay's aim was to create a small circle of brown englishmen to help rule over the people of India. They wanted to destroy the pride of these people in their own tradition. Since 1947 there has been expansion of educational infrastructure but not a serious attempt to change Macaulay's blueprint. That is going to create a much

awaited equitable, vibrant education system. It lays emphasis on our mother tongue Hindi and promotion of serious study. Teaching in native language is critical for unleashing the potential of its large young population. As we know that hardly 11% people are comfortable in speaking English language. PM's use of hindi language on international fora is a conscious effort to reignite pride in our own language. He also praised our ancient Indian knowledge system. It is important that the traditional knowledge is looked at deeply to find solutions to our existing problems. Much like in the case of corona where from immunity boosting medicines to panchakarma, yoga and satvik ahaar, all have a great promise.

Vote of Thanks was delivered by Dr. Sanjana Vij "Learning never ends," said Dr. Vij recalled each and every session and their main take-aways.

Dr S K Jha delivered the concluding remarks and thanked every participant. In his concluding remarks, Prof. S K Jha laid emphasis on the fact that human beings without values is nothing and that duties are to be performed...towards society, family, profession, children..we should practice values and perform duties. we should follow values without following a particular religion. Jai Hind!!

The programme ended with a sanskrit recitation by Dr. Akhilesh and a final word by Dr. J K Mehta.




