REPORT

The National Seminar on PROMOTING HUMAN VALUES AND CULTURE FOR PEACEFUL CO – EXISTENCE was organized on Friday, 22nd July 2022 by Amity Centre of Sanskrit & Indic Studies, Amity School of Liberal Arts, Amity University Haryana. The Seminar was sponsored by Indian Council of Philosophical Research (ICPR), New Delhi.

As per the schedule, the programme started at 10.30 am with an inaugural session and 'shantimantra' by research scholar and invocation by Dr Akhilesh Kumar Tripathi & Lighting of lamps.

Welcome Address and opening remarks by were given by **Prof. Sanjay K. Jha**, Director, Amity School of Liberal Arts, Amity University Haryana

According to Prof. Jha, The way a country without laws is not a nation, likewise humans without human values is not a human. In reality we do not remain humans any longer. We should have values, which we find in the vedas for example the 10th mandala of Rig Veda where there are injunctions that invoke all the human beings to be humane and create divine peace. Aim should to be to see all human beings living in

peaceful coexistence in a time and age of degrading human values.

He also welcomed the guests for the seminar. Elaborating on the objective of the seminar, Jha sir also added that the world is passing through a phase of crisis be it crisis in jobs, families, politics, sensitivity, leadership or economic crisis. And above all the crisis in value system. The purpose of this seminar will be to understand the human values and its importance, said Jha sir. This meaningful seminar will at the end come out with tangible results and make it clear what are the expectations from us as humans, he added.

Delivering the Keynote Address our Honorable Vice Chancellor, **Prof P B Sharma**, Amity University Haryana elaborated on Truth, Compassion and Charity as important values.

Truth: Values of our forefathers are to be invoked as cardinal principles on which our society has to be built. We should appreciate the worth of truth, that is to be non-negotiable, Truth should be the answer to all ills plaguing the society. He emphasized on the value of 'Satyameva Jayate'. Our ancestors' value of truth was fundamental to create a blissful world.

Compassion: We as a society should learn to balance Harmony with Compassion. Where it is absent, untold misery befalls a nation that does not value happiness and compassion. He stressed on values like dignity and honor that is important for us. Non-discrimination on the basis of caste, colour, creed and Atmiyata-afinity ---is the foundation of the society. The world of peace and prosperity will be created.

He thanked each and everyone for attending this event and stressed on the need to rediscover the values which are universal in nature ---to create the world of our dreams. Unless we create heaven on earth in India, we will not be able to justify our existence as humans, he added.


Dinesh Chandra Shastri Sir,

Human values, Vedas, Adigrantha are all treasures from Hindustan. The man is said to have come up from the union of Manu and Shraddha. The human values have all come from Bharata-Desha. All communities, all races, all castes are living here in harmony. Our society is blessed with many pure seasons and rivers. Today's seminar is a highly fruitful one. People of India have values in their DNA.

Ramayana and Mahabharat both have given immense value to human values. He emphasized on the fact that books cannot be the basis of human values, it should be in-built. Values should be there in every book, every mind, and every human being. Veda is also all-encompassing. "Vasudhaivakutumbakam" only our country that thinks about other's welfare. One will not find any example of India attacking another country for territorial gains. Rather we care for our neighbors.

Address by Guest of Honour **Prof. Ramesh Kumar Pandey**, Ex.Vice-Chancellor, Shri Lal Bahadur Shastri National Sanskrit University ,New Delhi

Out of the four pillars of social system in India -Dharma, Artha, Kama, Moksha_ Dharma can be considered as supreme. Dharma does not mean only religion, but in reality duties of people. People who fulfil these become a real man in totality. Otherwise, the society without duties is sure to fall into crisis. One major reason for the society's downfall is values and dharma not being followed by people. People who do not follow these value systems and dharma finally results in chaos. Like a students' dharma is to study and a teacher's is to teach. Where people do their duties it leads to happiness according to Chanakya. Greed is the cause of sufferings. 'Dana' or 'Tyaga' is important. Even if one has to give from their own it should be



done. For being a true Indian, we should imbibe these values and only then we will be able to establish a happy environment.

Upanishads remind us of our 'sanskriti' and values, which we need to follow in our lifestyle. However, we are forgetting them slowly.

Prof Om Nath Bimli, HoD Department of Sanskrit University of Delhi

By following the Karma and Vedanta's path one can follow the path to final enlightenment. Dharma is human value. Human's behavior should be such that it should be beneficial for the world rather than being destructive. The values, virtues which leads to moksha is the real one. One should follow the Gita values for devi and Asuri prakriti. Interpersonal relations, strained relations and other situations can be dealt with the help of these values. Bhagavat Gita speaks of people who have not attained real knowledge. Such people should be oriented towards these values incorporated in our ancient texts. All evils fade away when people learn to live with values.

Address by **Prof Sudhir Kumar, Professor** School of Sanskrit and Indic Studies, JNU New Delhi

There is need to revive human values. Although we know very well that India has been the land of rishis, Munis, Vedas, puranas, Ramayana, Gita and sutras, he felt India as a nation has digressed from the original path.

He said we are 140 crore population. We need to look at the cleanliness level. We need a lot of effort to clean our rivers etc.

In Islam and Sikhism, even 7- to 8-year-olds recite their texts like Quran and Guru Granth sahib well. Is it the same with a Hindu child? He asked.

Its sad to find 'vridha' ashrams and 'anatha' ashrams in Indian context...people who are educated have lost more of their values. In India this whole idea of old age homes etc. which are becoming more popular, tells a lot about our eroding values. The society we are cultivating, we are moving fast towards materialism.

Today we find the respect of women falling. All goddesses are women but when it comes to involving them in various works related to Veda for example, we find them in the backfoot. It's not encouraged at all.

The brahman ideologies we should be grateful that despite so much violence and attacks on our society brahmins could still keep the knowledge alive and intact.

In today's life we are ready to buy expensive insurance covers but not ready to study the lifestyle taught by the ancient texts, to learn how to live life in the best possible way so that there would be no need of these insurance etc.

Address by **Dr Shivani Sharma**, Associate Professor Department of Philosophy Punjab University Chandigarh

Through virtuous life we can lead a life full of values. Every value system promotes meta-physics of the system. Today we live in challenging times, troubled times. We need to strike at important questions and that should lead to debates and discussions. She spoke about this whole concept of 'Other'

emphasizing on the importance to treat all individuals as equal. Coexistence is important. Concept of peace that needs to be interpreted well. It should not mean that state imposes something. She gave the example of USSR's downfall which tried to treat the state as paramount. Peace should mean minimum intrusion in other people's lives. Philosophy means nothing without morals.

Address by **Dr. Ashutosh Angiras**, Associate Professor & Head of the Department of Sanskrit and Hony Director, SDHD & T Centre, SD College, Ambala.

Although after every prayer we invoke the important human values and think about following the dharma, we tend to forget the values in our day-to-day functioning.

Importance of questioning should be explained to the students. Even counter-questioning should be encouraged. Human values lead you towards freedom. What to do with your freedom. What should be the compulsive choice and also make you a sensible human being. It teaches you how much to consume.

Greek mythology celebrates victory—leads to uncertainties in the society.

Abrahamic thought---coexistence of only the 'similar' kinds. Value system dissipates. And then comes world wars and industrialization that causes trouble.

Gandhian values and good values are not being followed in the social order.

Address by **Prof UN Singh** Dean Faculty of Arts, Amity University Haryana

Conflict is inherent in human behavior. Everybody seems to be angry. Moral science book Arise, Awake became a famous book. Knowledge and texts are worshipped in India...be it Vedas, Guru Grantha Sahib, and Geeta etc. The study of moral science is completely lost and he felt its not at all a good sign for the society.

Ms. Vanita Verma, Assistant Director-OIA joined the discussion.

Further the guest was given a campus tour-prise to show our prestigious Amity Campus-land of 110 acres covering herbal garden, dog training center and the flora and fauna, the fresh- crisp air and the thoughtfully created infrastructure, which is Platinum Led certified, make this campus beautiful, convenient, and unique.

She showed the data from her research work done in different regions through which participants could link to real life situations. Further she discussed various ways to approach and treat different cases of mental health. It helped the participants to correlate different situations amongst their family & friends. Through this session the global aspect of mental health was understood and justified keeping in mind the diverse cultures and nationalities.

Brief about the address/talk of speakers:

She broadly talked about Global Mental Health with respect to the following 3 aspects:

- Cultural foundations of parenting and emotion processes
- Culturally informed approaches to global mental health
- Marginalization and mental health

Further it was emphasized that the search for a better understanding of the causes of mental disorders and affordable and effective treatments is of importance to improving the lives of individuals living with these disorders in all countries. Relevant to her research she talked about the worldwide gap between mental health needs and available resources. Hence, she concluded that in every country “There is a need to develop and implement low-cost, sustainable, and scalable interventions”.

Various case studies taken up in her research work were discussed as well as the data and analysis done to find different causes for depressions, their symptoms and ways to handle and treat such cases were shared. As suggestive measure DBT Skills Training program was suggested for students. Finally, she summed up talking about Contextual & cultural differences due to different regions and different countries effects a lot on various issues of mental health and the ways to treat them.

‘Take Homes’ for the Guest and Attendees:

Mainly the global aspect of Mental Health was understood by one and all present in terms of contextual and cultural differences due to different regions and countries. Further various causes, symptoms of depressions and ways an unprofessional can handle such situations were discussed which helped us to correlate in our real-life situations amongst family and friends. For subject related faculty members case studies and data analysis helped them analyze various factors involved in mental health, challenges, and constraints of available resources. It was discussed how new ways and means can be developed taking entire community to play a big role in improving mental health conditions of a country and nations worldwide.

Even the guest carried a great impression of Amity having global connects with premium foreign universities & distinguished global speakers from Harvard and Stanford university. She showed a keen interest in collaborating with AUH and having long term projects and proposals.

Future plan for utilizing the contacts developed with the Invited Guests:



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ABOUT PROF. (DR.) VAISHALI RAVAL-MIAMI UNIVERSITY -OXFORD OHIO



Dr. Vaishali Raval, Professor, Associate Chair of the Department of Psychology, Miami University-Oxford.

Dr. Vaishali Raval is professor of psychology and affiliate of global and intercultural studies at Miami University in Oxford, Ohio, USA where she has been a faculty member for 15 years. She received a PhD in clinical developmental psychology from University of Windsor (with a pre-doctoral internship at The Children's Hospital in Denver) and completed a postdoctoral fellowship in cultural psychology and human development at the University of Chicago.

She is a cultural clinical developmental psychologist committed to internationalizing psychological science through her research, teaching, and service.

Her program of research focuses on three interrelated areas: In one line of research, she explores cultural and contextual foundations of parenting, with a focus on emotion processes and how they relate to child and adolescent mental health outcomes among culturally diverse families around the world. In a related research trajectory focusing on global mental health, she explores contextual understanding of psychopathology, and culturally informed mental health training and intervention approaches, primarily in India, with some research in China, Malaysia, Singapore, and South Korea. A third line of inquiry focuses on experiences of marginalization and their impact on mental health and well-being among racial and ethnic minority groups in USA. Along with undergraduate and graduate students and collaborators from around the world, she has over 60 publications including articles in peer-reviewed journals such as *Culture, Medicine, and Psychiatry, Journal of Family Psychology, International Journal of Psychology,*

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along with chapters in edited book volumes. Her work is funded by the United States India Education Foundation, as well as US Department of State and Education.

She teaches undergraduate and graduate courses on cultural psychology, global mental health, and graduate courses on psychopathology, assessment, and intervention. As the director of the Culture, Affect, Relationships (CARE) lab at Miami University, she has trained over 90 undergraduate students, providing them with hands-on-research experience. She has served as a primary mentor for 15 doctoral students (8 alumni) and contributed to over 100 master's thesis, comprehensive exam, and doctoral dissertation committees. Her mentorship was recently recognized by Henry David International Mentoring Award from the *American Psychological Association Division 52*.

Her professional service also involves activities to promote internationalization of the discipline of



She currently serves as the chair of the international committee of the *Society for Research on Adolescence* and a member of the U.S. National Committee for Psychological Sciences, a committee of The National Academies of Sciences, Engineering, and Medicine. She promotes internationalization through her role as the associate editor of *Journal of Cross-Cultural Psychology*, *Journal of Research on Adolescence*, and *Journal of Child and Family Studies*, and service on the editorial boards of *Asian American Journal of Psychology* and *Cultural Diversity and Ethnic Minority Psychology*.





9. Event Report along with glimpses of the event (Photographs)

9.1 General Introduction of the Event

An expert lecture session organized by Dr. Suvro Parui, Assistant Professor (Chinese). The keynote speaker invited was Ms. Ambika Vasudev, Overseas Admission to brief the students about scholarships and opportunities to study in Germany.

9.2 Inspiration & Objectives of the Event

The interaction was aimed at apprising the students of various scholarships and opportunities to study in Germany. The objective of the talk was to encourage foreign language students to explore opportunities abroad which will in turn benefit their career growth and development.

9.3 Brief about the address/talk of speakers

Ms. Ambika Vasudev, Overseas Admission Expert, Duende Education, delivered a very insightful and informative talk about India-Germany relationship, the growing sector of Germany in fields like automobiles, science, research, art, applied sciences and innovation. She briefed the students about direct MA admissions in top public and private universities of Germany. Being the 4th strongest economy and providing visa to 24 countries, Germany has become one of the best choices to study and work abroad. She also highlighted how Germany allows PR in just 3.5 years and allows dependent visa. With more than over 18000 courses offered, students have a wide range of selecting their choice of stream.

Ms. Ambika also presented to the students the names and fee structure of top universities for MA admission that also allows 18 months of Job Search Visa. She also called their attention to jobs in demand like care takers, logistics and supply chain, design, and other vocational programs. With Vocational Program opportunity, the applicants are not required to pay the tuition fee, allowed Work Permit from Day 1 with 1.5 years of Job Search Visa, and added benefit of "No Block Account". Undertaking a vocational program, the applicant can get a stipend between 800-1200 Euros and PR after 3 years.

Ms. Ambika explained to the students the procedure and process involved in reaching Germany through Duende Education. She encouraged the students to start thinking of prospects in Germany and offered free profiling of students in order to start the process.

The "Take Homes" for the Attendees was a clearer understanding of the international dynamics with reference to Germany and its relevance towards India and more importantly the growing opportunities in Germany for international students.

12.1 General Introduction of the Event

An expert lecture session organized by Dr. Suvro Parui, Assistant Professor and Coordinator (Chinese). The keynote speaker invited was Former Ambassador of India to Jordan, Libya, and Malta, Amb. Anil Trigunayat, who spoke to the students and faculties about global affairs, esp. the positions of India and China in the Changing Global Order.

12.2 Inspiration & Objectives of the Event

As Amb. Anil Trigunayat is a former Ambassador of India to Jordan, Libya, and Malta. The objective was to better understand the current state of international relations, with respect to India and China, considering the present conditions of unrest around the globe.

12.3 Brief about the address/talk of speakers

Amb. Anil Trigunayat started his address by speaking about the Russia Ukraine war, even though it was a genuine security concern for Russia, war cannot be a solution for resolving issues in today's day and age. He goes on to say that it really is a war between Russia and the USA.

He then talks about his experiences with China during his travels when he was positioned in Mongolia. He talks about China's history and the abject poverty the country has seen and the remarkable progress it has made to overcome it and develop. China and its people worked hard to raise its economic might and today is in a position to challenge the great world powers. China under Prime Minister Xi Jinping is challenging the US hegemony and might even succeed in its endeavor. He talks about how China needs the OBOR initiative to succeed, for its economic, strategic and military growth.

The Ambassador goes on to explain how for every country including India, national interest is of foremost importance and basis of all international relations and foreign policies. He explains India's non-critical stance towards Russia in the ongoing war as its not in India's national interest to take sides. He says, unless the country is strong, no matter how many friends you have, it doesn't matter. In case of India, we are not only the largest democracy, we also have a huge market and youth, and this is a strength we need to leverage. We should be able to call the shots when required, and China sees that and has lately been praising India (in spite of the border issues) for its strategic autonomy with respect to the Russia Ukraine war.

He explains that the 'strategy' with China is about the long haul, citing the example of the recent LAC detachment and how it was agreed upon in July but came through only recently because it took around 16 rounds of negotiations. He also mentions the shortage of vaccines around the globe during the corona outbreak, how China was one of the worst hit countries to this date and the fact that India was the only country to start vaccine distributions to other countries, causing China to realize that India too is a power to reckon with.

He also strongly suggests that the SCO, BRICS, RIC etc. countries need to cooperate with one another, respect each other's sovereignty and territorial integrity to avoid Galwan like situations. It's important for India and China to work together for the global good but on equitable terms.

He ends by saying that, China will remain a major challenge for us, but we want a good relation with them, as they remain our biggest trade partner.



24.3 Brief about the address/talk of speakers



Amity University Haryana started MTech Course in Defence Technology in 2021 and second batch of 2022-24 is under progress. There is a great amount of zeal & enthusiasm among the young students. Besides, the real core technical knowledge being imparted to these budding scientists, some senior retired Defence Services Officers namely, Major General GS Bal, Dean Students Welfare and Rear Admiral Kishan K Pandey AVSM, VSM, Director -HR & Amity Academic Staff College have familiarized these students with various facets of Army and Naval Warfare systems.

In order to provide first-hand experience of the State-Of-The-Art facility of the Indian Navy, the students of MTech Defence Tech, Aerospace engg, ECE and MTech CSE of Amity University Haryana were taken to the Indian Navy's Fusion Centre called Information Management & Analysis Centre (IMAC).

IMAC: HITECH DATA FUSION CENTRE OF INDIAN NAVY



- Post 26/11, the Indian Navy had created National Command Control & Communications Intelligence Network (NC³IN) to connect 51 Indian Navy and Coast Guard Stations across 7500 kms of Coast Line as also, Island Territory of Andaman & Nicobar and Lakshadweep & Minicoy. It is the main center of the Indian Navy for coastal surveillance and monitoring.

The network comprises of dedicated OFC with security overlays and dedicated satellite links as backup. To monitor nearly 1 Lakh ships passing through Indian Ocean

Region on daily basis, inputs from various sources viz. radars, space & terrestrial AIS, VTMS, world ship registry as also opto-electronic inputs from shore stations are taken and fused comprehensive data is projected live on a huge data wall, using highly sophisticated software. This Information Management & Analysis Centre is manned 24x7 at Gurugram and Information flows on real time amongst 51 nodes, including Naval War-rooms and Naval / Coast Guard Operations-rooms.




