General

Azadi Ka Amrit Mahotsav is being celebrated with great pomp and show at Amity University Haryana. To mark this momentous occasion, number of activities were organized at the Campus, the solemn **Remembrance Day – Horrors of Partition** being a part of the **Azadi Ka Amrut Mahotsav**.

Remembrance Day – Horrors of Partition, 1947

As the nation completes 75 years of Independence, the **Partition Horrors Remembrance Day** is being observed by the entire nation, in line with the announcement made by the Prime Minister Narendra Modi during his speech on 15th August 2021, at D Block Auditorium.

The event aims to bring to light the agony, pain and anguish of millions of people who were sufferers of partition. It is meant to remind the people of the largest displacement of human population in the last century which resulted in the death of nearly 2 million people

The Remembrance Day Event was held at AUH on 10 Aug 2022 (at 11.30 to 12.30 PM). To mark the occasion 90 yr old Retired Sepoy Rati Ram from Village Gwalior was invited as the Guest of Honor for the function. The program at the D Block Auditorium ,Amity University Haryana, started with the rendition of Patriotic Songs .Thereafter the guests led by VC P B Sharma, entered the Auditorium chanting "Bharat Mata Ki Jai" slogans.

Opening Remarks



Opening Remarks were delivered by Pro VC Dr. Vikas Madhukar. Beginning with the poem written by Faiz Ahmad Faiz The Pro VC said the "Divide and Rule" policy of the Britishers had a devastating effect on human population during India's partition. Around 4.5 lac Hindus and Sikhs were forced to move out of Pakistan, while 6 million Muslims

were forced to move out of India. Total displacement was around 10-15 million people and about 1 to 2 million people had reportedly died. For the past 75 years this horror had remained a forgotten fact of our history. "Being from the teaching community, we need to realize that it is part of our responsibility to inform the future generations about the horrors faced by our people during partition," he said.

Key Note Address

Respected Vice Chancellor P B Sharma, welcomed the guest of honor , a nonagenarian who had been witness to the Partition. He stated that we respect the call of 'Har GharTiranga' given by our Prime Minister Narendra Modiji. Till now, we have enjoyed the Independence for 75 years, time has now come to fulfil our duties towards



building a stronger nation. In the words of our first PM Mr Jawaharlal Nehru "it is time to redeem our pledge". We should realize that freedom has not come about without sacrifices. Its was a long struggle starting from 10th century to 1947, when we had to fight against different entities to make ourselves free. He specially mentioned the names of Chandrashekhar Azad, Subhash Chander Bose who formed the 'Azad Hind Fauj', Sukhdev, Rajguru and Bhagat Singh. He remembered how Subhash Chandra Bose had unfurled the tri color at Port Blair in 1931. Mass Awakening for Freedom of India campaign was successfully run by Mahatma Gandhi since the whole nation had to be charged with the idea of freedom and independence.

He recalled the horrors at the time of partition which caused huge displacement of human population, and that too on the basis of religion. A new nation was being carved out with religious affiliation. For thousands of years we had been a multilingual, multi-religious nation. Animosity amongst ourselves was the product of provocation by few intellectuals in the society, like Jinnah. While the educated class spearheaded this religious animosity, to serve their own interests, the common people followed in their footsteps. He specially mentioned poet Mohammad Iqbal who had earlier written the Book Tarane Hind (which contains 'Sare Jahan Se achha HindostanHamara') but changed with time to write "chino arabhamara...muslimhain hum'. Humanity begins to questions the relevance of education when educated people like Iqbal change their affiliation so quickly, he said.

He entreated all to respect every religion. We should be proud of the fact that we all are Indians and we belong to a multi-cultural country like India. We should respect "Oneness in diversity and diversity in oneness". On this Remembrance Day he asked the audience to uphold the dignity and honour of our motherland that is blessed with a vedic spiritual civilization.


Honoring Retired Soldier Rati Ram Ji



Rati Rati Ram ji was honored by tying a turban, and presenting him with a shawl and memento. Rati Ram ji was enrolled as a gunner in Indian Army in 1952. He had been a witness to both the Independence celebration as well as horrors of partition. He recalled some of the incidences that took place at the time

of freedom struggle. He added that "Peaceful coexistence among all the communities is important for our nation to remain intact and strong otherwise we could be in for trouble from various quarters".

Presentation On Horrors Of Partition





Maj Gen G S Bal, made a presentation on the 'Partition Horrors' titled "Recreating the past for a better future". According to him, we cannot live and coexists with neighboring countries with old baggage on our conscience. We should learn from the past and try to improve the future on the basis of that learning. He started with the quotes of Page | 5



George Santayana, Pearl S Buck and Robert Heinlein to highlight the importance of historical knowledge for a better handling of the future "Those who do not learn from history are condemned to repeat it".

Partitioning of Pakistan from India was based on the 'Two Nation Theory'. He went on to further elaborate upon the causes of the partition, the appointment of the Border Council, the Radcliff or Bloody line, elections of the Provisional Government and role of Indian National Congress and Muslim League in the events leading to the Partition. Since the Border Council could not come to any amicable solution ,Radcliff despite having virtually no knowledge of India, with just 4 weeks of deliberations, drew the lines dividing East and West Pakistan from India. The fault lines of the Radcliffe line continue to haunt us during current times. Classical example is the Kartarpur Sahib Gurdwara , which is the second most sacred shrine of the Sikhs which is in Pakistan only 3 Kms from the IB. Also the inevitability of East Pakistan becoming Independent was more or less established with the borders being drawn in 1947. Seperated by 1500 kms East Pakistan was destined to become Bangladesh due to political, ethnic, economic social issues and discrimination of the East Pakistan Populace by the Punjabi Muslims. Recounting the horrors of the Partition he spoke about a number of books written on Partition such as Dr Rajender Prasad's "India Divided" and Khushwant Singh's "Train to Pakistan". Highlighting the atrocities faced by women and children, he recounted the incident of village Tahoha Khalsa, whereby 90 women committed suicide to evade being abducted and raped by the arsonists and looters.

He concluded by saying that since we cannot choose our neighbours we must try to maintain good neighbourly relations, so that both countries progress. He concluded by saying that "For a progressive nation we need to learn from the past and diplomatically resolve the current issues with our neighbours".

Vote of thanks by Major General P K Sharma.



Maj Gen P K Sharma, thanked Respected VC, Pro VC and all faculty and staff members for attending and contributing towards the successful conduct of the Event. He thanked Rati Ram ji, for despite his advancing years, he made this humongous effort to grace the occasion.

He further thanked Respected VC, Pro VC, and DSW for sharing their thoughts with the audience. He appreciated the efforts made by Dr Ranjana Kothari and the organizing team for managing the back stage.

The exhibition aimed to impart information and knowledge relating to one of the biggest catastrophes that befell mankind in the Indian subcontinent. rendering 15 million homeless and destitute.

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
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

One week long "Hands-on Training on Materials Characterizations, Lipidomics and Proteomics Techniques" is being conducted by Amity University Haryana from August 22-28, 2022 which is sponsored by the Department of Science & Technology under 'Synergistic Training program Utilizing the Scientific and Technological Infrastructure' (STUTI).

The Scheme 'Synergistic Training program Utilizing the Scientific and Technological Infrastructure' (STUTI) is intended to build human resource and its knowledge capacity through open access S&T Infrastructure across the country. As a complement to the various schemes of DST funding for expansion of R&D Infrastructure at academic institutions, STUTI scheme envisions a hands-on training program and sensitization of the state-of-the-art equipment as well as towards sharing while ensuring transparent access of S&T facilities. The training is conducted on a hub-and-spoke model approach. Amity University Haryana, a NAAC accredited A Grade University is running two FIST programs one in Biotechnology and the other in Physical Sciences and has a Central Instrumentation Research Facility.

For this 9th hands on training program, more than 600 applications were received and after careful observations, 34 were selected from the best-ranked institutions and universities all over India.

3.3 Brief about the address/talk of speakers

DAY 1, 22 AUGUST 2022

The program started with registration of all participants from 9:30 am to 10:00 am. Later on, a theoretical session was conducted by Dr Dipankar Malakar, Application Support Manager from Sciex. He explained the basics of liquid chromatography and mass spectrometry with special emphasis on QTRAP technology. Followed by a guest lecture by Dr Ashutosh Singh, Assistant Professor, University of Lucknow. He elucidated on the day to day challenges faced while working with mass spectrometer. The session was interactive and the participants asked their questions during the session.

DAY 2, 23 AUGUST 2022

9:45 am to 11:15 am- The participants were divided into two groups for the practical sessions. Group A was taken to the Amity Lipidomics Research Facility where they were shown auto sampler, column, ion source and other components of LCMS by Dr Dipankar and Kaushavi. They were briefed about sample preparation. Various scan modes were shown using a standard mixture of phospholipids. Demonstration of optimizing various mass spectrometer parameters such as declustering potential, collision energy, source temperature voltage, etc was given. In the meanwhile, group B was taken for AIB visit to various labs like the Central Instrumentation Research Facility (CIRF), Bionova lab, graduate and postgraduate laboratories.



11:15 am to 11:30 am- Tea Break

11:30 am to 1:00 pm- Group B was taken to the Amity Lipidomics Research Facility for the practical session. Group A was taken for lab visits.



1:00 pm to 2:00 pm- Lunch Break

2:30 pm to 3:45 pm- Guest lecture by Dr Shantanu Sengupta, Principal Scientist, CSIR-IGIB. He explained how mass spectrometery can be utilized for clinical applications and biomarker discovery of various diseases. He elaborated on the change in proteome during the progression of various diseases such as Coronary Artery Disease, COVID-19 and Celiac Disease. The talk contained all the vital information from sample collection, processing, spectrometric analysis, and its advantage over other techniques. He gave information about one of his projects which aims at longitudinal sample collection of cohorts pan India inorder to prepare a national level repository for wellness that will aid in development of precision medicine for various disorders.


4:00 pm to 5:00 pm- Group A was taken to the Amity Lipidomics Research Facility for the practical session. Method creation was practically shown by Dr Dipankar and Kaushavi. Various MRMs were set up for sphingolipids. Batch creation was demonstrated. Study design was shown to the participants, explaining how biological and technical replicates are run. The participants were shown standard curve runs and how to find exact amount of lipid in the samples using the standard curve. Lipids extracted from plasma sample were run using the MRM method. Untargeted Lipidomics analysis using Information Dependent Acquisition (IDA) was explained. IDA method creation was demonstrated. Group B were provided with study material to read during this session.



5:00 pm to 6:00 pm- Group B was taken to the Amity Lipidomics Research Facility for the practical session. Group A were provided with study material to read during this session. Beta-galactosidase was run overnight for data acquisition so that data interpretation can be explained to participants on 24th August.

DAY 3, 24 AUGUST 2022

9:30 am to 10:30 am- The participants were divided into two groups for the practical sessions. Group A was taken to the Amity Lipidomics Research Facility for analyzing the beta galactosidase run on 23rd August. Dr Dipankar explained the basics of mass spectrometry based proteomics. The protocol of in gel and in solution digestion of proteins was discussed. Protein estimation techniques such as the BCA, Bradford and nanodrop were explained. A trypsin digested bovine serum albumin sample was analyzed using the IDA method. Solvents suitable for proteomics analysis were explained. In the meanwhile, group B was to the Bionova lab for demonstration on extraction of lipids from plasma sample.



10:30 am to 11:30 pm- Group B was taken to the Amity Lipidomics Research Facility for the practical session. Group A was taken to the Bionova lab for the demonstration of lipid extraction.



11:30 am to 11:45 am- Tea Break

11:45 am to 1:00 pm- Dr Dipankar demonstrated the peak view software for analysis of protein samples. He also demonstrated the use of Protein Pilot software. Various protein databases such as uniprot, swissprot and NCBI were showed. He showed how the processing method is set up for proteomics analysis including post translational modification analysis.



1:00 pm to 2:00 pm- Lunch Break

2:00 pm to 3:00 pm- Guest lecture by Dr JyothilakshmiVadassery, Staff Scientist V NIPGR. Her lecture included mass spectrometry based plant Metabolomics. She demonstrated various methods that her lab has developed for phytohormone analysis on LC-MS. One of her topics was untargeted Metabolomics analysis in tomato upon P. Indica colonization. Her lecture included tomato leaf and root metabolome changes upon P. Indica colonization. She explained the primary and secondary metabolites involved in plant growth and resistance to various herbivores.



3:00 pm to 3:45 pm- Demonstration of lipid view software was done by Kaushavi. Untargeted lipidomics analysis for a set of samples was demonstrated using lipid view software. Processing method was set up for lipid analysis and method was created for total lipid analysis. Normalization using internal standard and statistical analysis was shown. Lipid view software report was shown.



3:45 pm to 4:00 pm- Teach break

4:00 pm to 5:00 pm- Multiquant software for targeted lipid analysis was demonstrated by PhD students of Amity Institute of Biotechnology. Absolute quantification of various lipids was shown by Dr Dipankar. Standard curve was plotted from raw data, by subtracting blanks and matrix and normalizing the data using internal standard. The absolute values of lipid were estimated using the slope of the standard curve.



DAY 4, 25 AUGUST 2022

The fourth day of the training started with Theoretical session on UV-Vis Spectrophotometer and its applications at 10:00 AM in A block conference hall. Mr. Saurabh Jain, Senior Product Specialist (Mat-Char) at PERKINELMER (INDIA) Private Limited was the resource person of the day. Prof. Preeti Thakur introduced the speaker to the audience and handed over the podium to Mr. Saurabh Jain. Mr. Jain discussed how Ultraviolet-visible (UV-Vis) spectroscopy is being utilized as a key analytical technique in almost every laboratory in the world due to its versatility and simplicity. He explained the basics of UV visible spectroscopy in any very simple and elaborative way while focusing on the fundamentals, principle and working of the spectrometer. Ultraviolet-visible (UV-Vis) spectrophotometers use a light source to illuminate a sample with light across the UV to the visible wavelength range (typically 190 to 900 nm). The instruments then measure the light absorbed, transmitted, or reflected by the sample at each wavelength. Some spectrophotometers have an extended wavelength range, into the near-infrared (NIR) (800 to 3200 nm). From the spectrum obtained, it is possible to determine the chemical or physical properties of the sample. In general, it is possible to:


- Identify molecules in a solid or liquid sample
- Determine the concentration of a particular molecule in solution
- Characterize the absorbance or transmittance through a liquid or solid—over a range of wavelengths
- Characterize the reflectance properties of a surface or measure the color of a material
- Study chemical reactions or biological processes

He explained main components of UV-Vis Spectrophotometer, the light source used, difference between single beam and double beam Spectrophotometer, what does a UV-Vis spectrophotometer measure. Mr. Jain discussed how to optimize parameters for UV-Vis measurements, applications is UV-Vis spectroscopy. Overall, the session was very informative and interactive.

Practical session on UV-Vis Spectrophotometer started at 11:30 at Material Research Facility facility, 2nd floor, A block. Participants were divided into 3 groups for better learning experience. First group was given hands on training on UV-Vis Spectrometer and mean while rest of the 2 groups were introduced to other research facilities of Amity School of Applied Sciences. Mr. Saurabh Jain demonstrated the instrument to the participants as discussed in the theoretical session. He showed how to calibrate the instrument and optimize various factors. He demonstrated how this instrument is used to analyze for liquid and solid sample. After that demonstration on UV-Visible Spectrometer was repeated to 2nd group and so on.

After Lunch, at 2 PM, a theoretical session on Thermogravimetry -Differential Scanning calorimetry and its applications was conducted by Mr. Saurabh Jain. In this session He explained the basic principle, working and applications of Thermogravimetry and **Differential Scanning Calorimeters** (DSC). He also explained the basic feature of Simultaneous Thermo-Analysis (STA) and the instrument facility we have in Material Research Lab. He explained that STA is a simultaneous technique that determines the weight change of a sample (TG) and measures the change in temperature between a sample and the reference as a function of temperature and/or time (DTA). It combines the high flexibility of the differential analysis feature (DTA, DSC) with the proven capabilities of the thermogravimetric (TG) measurement technology to provide highly reliable characterization information. It is used for analysis of melting points, polymorphy, phase diagrams, eutectic purity, crystallinity of substances, phase transitions (solid-solid; solid-liquid), glas transition, specific heat, cross linking, oxidation stability, decomposition) and thermogravimetric (TG) analysis (mass change, temperature resistance, oxidation and reduction behaviour, decomposition, corrosion, composition).

Theoretical session was followed by practical session on Thermogravimetry -Differential Scanning calorimetry in which Mr. Jain demonstrated every component of STA, its calibration, software, optimization and other important features of STA to each group of participants.

After the successful demonstration of the instruments, participants were given hands on training on UV-Visible spectrophotometer where they had first hand experience on running the instruments under the supervision of experts.

Day 5

Beautiful start of the fifth day of training started with the early morning visit to botanical garden of the AUH where participant enjoyed the beautiful lush green garden and were introduced to various medicinal plants grown in the garden. Visit was coordinated by Dr. Vivek Balyan and assisted by Ms. Priya Bameta.

Technical session of day 5, started at 10:00 AM by formal introduction of the resource person Mr. Amit Kumar by Dr. Dipti Vaya. He has been dealing DLS and Zetasizer over 12 years. He explained the theory and principle underlying the working of Particle Size & Zeta Potential Measurement (Dynamic Light Scattering) technique. He explained in a very simple manner that how Zetasizer Nano ZS can measure hydrodynamic size, zeta potential and molecular weight in particle dispersions, emulsions and molecular solutions. Session continued after tea break and Mr. Kumar discussed each component of the instrument focusing on advantages and drawbacks of various geometrical arraignment of the detector. Followed by discussion on its applications in:

- a. Estimating particle size distribution of the nanoparticles (crystalline and amorphous)
- b. Calculating surface charge in terms of electric potential (V) of the nanoparticle system
- c. Determining the nature of drug-receptor interactions
- d. Understanding the aggregated state of various biomolecules like protein, lipids etc.

After an insight theoretical session Mr. Amit Kumar demonstrated all those aspects practically in practical session held at 2 PM, Material Research Facility facility, 2nd floor, A block. Again participants were divided into 3 groups for better learning experience. While the 1st group was given illustrative demonstration on DLS, the other 2 groups were given hands on training on UV-Vis spectrophotometer and other research facilities available in ASAS and so on.

Participants learnt the techniques of synthesis of nanoparticles by solid state reaction method using the research facilities available in materials research lab. They also had first hand experience on running the UV-Visible spectroscopy, DLS zetasizer under expert supervision. During these sessions, participants also discussed their queries with Dr. Shekhar which were resolved to their satisfaction.








Fig 2: Guest Speaker (Dr Sudeshna Ghosh) delivering talk




Fig 4: Lecturer delivering by Speaker



He received several National/International awards for his original contributions in the field of "Atmospheric Chemistry". He is a member of one of the prestigious **Expert Group** "Satellite Based Air Quality Monitoring System", constituted jointly by the Central Pollution Control Board (CPCB), and Ministry of Earth Sciences, Govt. of India, New Delhi.

Dr. Ranjit Kumar is a researcher and very active academician in the field of 'Particulate Chemistry and its Interface with Environmental Health'. Moreover, since long time, Dr. Ranjit has been working on the physical, chemical, radiative and dynamical characteristics of aerosols (particulate matter) over Indo Gangetic Plains and other hotspot regions of India. He published the results of his several campaign-mode studies in high impact factor Scopus /Web Sci journals. He has published more than 60 research papers to his credit in National and International journal of repute including one

in World 1st ranked Journal in the field of Environmental Engineering. Dr. Ranjit Kumar was known earlier for his excellent research work on "Chemical Composition of Aerosols over High-Altitude Regions in the country" during one of the major International Campaign programmes, for example, INDian Ocean EXperiment (INDOEX). 3. Event Report along with glimpses of the event(Photographs)

3.1 General Introduction of the Event:

Ambient air pollution is responsible for serious health problems in developing and developed countries. In today's changing environment, the ability of humankind to intuitively assess and manage the health risk has become fundamental for its survival. The current technological advancement, rapid industrialization, and modernization are found insufficiently coping with worsening the air quality. Air pollution is linked with various long-term and short-term effects such as respiratory infections and inflammations, cardiovascular dysfunctions, bronchitis, chronic cough, sinusitis, colds, cancer, and premature deaths. The important metrics to check the ambient air quality are PM10 (particles of size less than $10~\mu m$), PM2.5 (particles of size less than $2.5~\mu m$), PM1.0 (particles of size less than $1.0~\mu m$) and black carbon (a component of PM2.5). The breathing of particulate matter and black carbon poses the greatest health risks because the particles can find their way deep into lungs and bloodstream. Thus, the characterization of air pollution metrics (PM10, PM2.5, and BC), chemical constituents of particulate matter and the resultant health risk assessment play a pivotal role in the present-day weather and climate change.

3.2 Inspiration & Objectives of the Event:

- 1. Air pollution exposure assessment with Air Q+ Model. Black Carbon exposure effects in the large-scale Indian Gangetic Planes and small-scale cities like Agra
- 2. Chemical and physical characterization of particulate matter and black carbon
- 3. Morphological characterization and elemental analysis of particles of different shape and size.

3.3 Brief about the address/talk of speakers:

The aerosol mass concentration, air quality index, exceedance factor, population-weighted average concentrations, annual and seasonal variations, and their health risk assessment are highlighted. Health risk analysis using Air Q+ v.1.2 model, originally developed by the World Health Organization (WHO) is explained and demonstrated for special reference to Agra region. The relative risk factor analysis, in reference to the particulate matter from local combustion sources as the cause of mortality is described. He explained his research studies relating to mortality rate of PM_{2.5} due to Chronic Obstructive Pulmonary Disease (COPD), lung cancer and stroke in adult (30 years and above) is 1033, 2068 and 3717, respectively, while attributed mortality rate from PM₁₀ due to chronic bronchitis in adult and bronchitis in children is 872 and 168, respectively. He explained the morphological characterization of the particles of different shape and size while elemental analysis concerning to Si, Al, Fe, Ca, K, Cl, Mg, Na, Cu, and Zn. Further, he highlighted the health risk analysis of particulate matter containing carcinogenic and non-carcinogenic metals in Agra. The non-carcinogenic risk has been shown much higher than the acceptable level. The high carcinogenic risks have been found in Zn in PM₁₀ and Cu in PM_{2.5} for both children and adults.

'Take Homes' for the Guest and Attendees:

He opined that the projections, made by WHO on the basis of ratio of PM2.5/PM10 which cannot be validfully for the country like India where there is large variation in topography as well as pollution sources even within the States. Growth of human urbanization has been very closely related to the growth of power production, andhence energy consumption is always considered as an important criterion. The blind craze of development has caused release of different gaseous and particulate species into the environment and hence causing more problems to day-to-day changes in air quality. At present, air pollution is one of the most hazardous problems that worsening the health status, damaging the environmental. systems and changing the climatic conditions severely of both developing and developed countries

As explained above, the Invited Guest is one among a few researchers working on the chemistry of particulate matter, which has tremendous influence on the understanding of the intensity of morbidity and mortality of humans due to a variety of communicable and non-communicable diseases. Moreover, the chemistry of particles and gases present in the atmosphere, water and soil play a critical role in the Environmental health. Further, understanding of these constituents helps detailed diagnosis of the now-a-days complex problem of "Global Warming and Climate Change".



A Brief on the Campaign is given below:

a. Campaign Background and Objective

- ▶ Diwali is one of the prominent festivals, which induces dense deposition of a variety of aerosol particles and toxic material into the lower atmosphere. It is celebrated by cleaning the house and decorating the house with divas (oil lamps) and electrical miniature lights. A variety of pyrotechnics employed in these works produce various visual, light, sound, gas, fire, and smoke effects. All these emissions affect the Geosphere-Biosphere-Atmosphere-Hydrosphere in a variety of ways. Although such studies during celebrations have been continuing all over the world for a long time, our scientific understanding is not complete, and many more novel experimental, modeling, and curbing techniques are still in practice.
- The principal aim of the week-long Campaign, conducted at AUH, Panchgaon-Manesar-Gurugram was to investigate the influence of Diwali (Festival of Lights) on the air quality vis-à-vis human health. It is hoped to utilize the inferences obtained from different experimental and modelling approaches that have been followed in this campaign will be helpful for better understanding of the impact of additional toxic energy through harmful emissions, supplied to the earth's atmospheric system and it's transport, in modulating the local/regional weather and climate change.

b. Experiments Conducted

- Round-the-clock synchronous 16 primary & secondary air pollutants, and 6 meteorological parameters have been measured during 22-27 October 2022, encompassing pre- (22-23) during (24-25) and post-(26-27) Diwali festival, employing the Air Quality Monitoring and Diagnosis System (AQMS), AUH Campus.
- Columnar optical depths of Aerosol and precursor gas constituents (water vapor) up to stratospheric altitudes using the NASA-AERONET Sun-Sky Radiometer.

- Surface-level Black/Elemental Carbon (BC) aerosol mass concentration (in micro-gram per cubic meter) and Biomass Burning (BB, in per cent) observations using the Multi-Spectral **Dual-Spot Aethalometer.**
- Tri-Wavelength Integrating Polar Nephelometer observations of Atmospheric Opacity (Visibility).

Observation Scheme and Details

The AQMS has been operated 24x7 and obtained high-resolution observations (every 15 minutes interval) of surface-level Particulate Matter (PM₁, PM_{2.5} and PM₁₀), CO, CO₂, NO, NO₂, NH₃, SO₂, O₃, Volatile Organic Compounds (VOCs), and surface-level Meteorological parameters (Temperature, Wind Speed, Wind Direction, Relative Humidity, Pressure and Rainfall) during 22-27 October 2022. The NASA-AERONET Sun-Sky Radiometer has been operated to obtain 15minute interval data on aerosol optical depth, aerosol size distribution, single scattering albedo, asymmetry parameter, refractive index (both real and imaginary) and radiative forcing. Nephelometer and Aethalometer have been operated for obtaining one-minute interval atmospheric scattering / absorption properties of aerosols, and visibility. Some significant results have been highlighted here. Detailed analysis of these data sets is in progress.

2. Salient Results

Highlights of Diwali-2022 Findings at AUH, Gurugram

As we noticed in our earlier studies and, also as reported by several authors in the literature that pollution levels on the Diwali festival period show higher on the Diwali day and lower on pre- and post-Diwali days. Diwali-2022 is not an exception to it, but local wind suddenly turned into strong, and direction altered from north-westerly (NW) to south-westerly (SW), which helped for dispersion of pollutants, thereby the pollution was found to be considerably less (hence good air quality) on Diwali day (i.e. the night intervening between 24 and 25 October 2022) in the study region of Panchgaon, as reported by many other locations too in the Delhi city and adjoining regions. In this context, a comparison between the time variation of PM_{2.5} mass concentration observed during 24-25 October 2020, 2021, and the current year, (2022), plotted from the CPCB data, is shown in the figure below.



Figure 2: Comparison between PM_{2.5} mass concentration values during 24-25 October during 2022. Similar values for the same period during 2020 and 2021 are also compared in the figure.




Figure 3: Time variation of BC and BB observed at AUH, Panchgaon-Manesar-Gurugram during Diwali period (24-25 October 2022).

It may be noted here that the BC values observed during 24-25 October 2020 and 2021 are compared in the figure with those of 2022 (as a reference), although they are not exactly the Diwali period in those years. It clearly depicts that albeit the AQI was higher during the midnight hours, the average AQI value was lower (312) this year as compared to that during 2020 and 2021 values of 414 and 382, respectively. The synchronous BC and BB variations for 24-25 October 2022 are also shown in Fig. 2 for comparison. Both BC and BB, on an average, show higher values around 0000 h (night intervening between 24 and 25) with mean BC concentration of 0.572 μ gm per cubic meter and BB of ~ 74 per cent, which is consistent with those variations observed in PM over the Delhi region. This once again supports our earlier observations that the BC particles are of size equivalent to that of PM_{2.5} and their mutual variations are similar. The 24-h average values of surface-level PM₁, PM_{2.5}, PM₁₀, mass concentration and columnar aerosol optical depth at 500 nm wavelength (AOD_{500 nm}), contributions of fine-mode (FM_{500 nm}), coarse-mode (CM_{500 nm}) fractions of total AOD at 500 nm wavelength are also presented in the Table below.

The above table clearly indicates not only the day-to-day variation in individual parameters considered in the study but also their association with the Diwali activities, particularly burning of firecrackers. The lower values of PM at ground-level and higher values of columnar aerosol optical depth (AOD) and water vapor (WV) observed during 24-25 October 2022 (Diwali) are ascribed to be due to change in surface-level wind direction from NW to SW and additional dust and smoke particle (pollutants) and heat energy contributed by the Diwali activity, and also due to dust-rise from the gross-cutting and tree-cutting activities in the campus very close to the AQMS. Moreover, the dust-rise contributed by the activities related to Sanghatan-2022 near the AQMS, prior to the DIWALI period cannot be foresight off because these particles will remain in the atmosphere as background for about a week's time (lifetime of pollutants) as per the particle theory.

The reduction in air pollution, especially on this year's Diwali day could be due to (i) early occurrence of the festival, much prior to the winter season, (ii) strict ban by the Government on firing of crackers and (iii) less stubble burning activity in the Punjab and Haryana States. Nevertheless, this unusually good air quality feature of this year's Diwali in Delhi and surrounding regions is further witnessed by increase in pollution levels found during the preand post-Diwali days with the change of meteorological parameters. These variations were consistent with those observed in the primary and secondary pollutant concentrations over the study region of Panchgaon, a rural station in the Haryana State. The aerosol optical depth (AOD) and aerosol size distribution (ASD), deduced from NASA-AERONET are found to coincide with those retrieved from the MODIS satellite. The variations in PM and AOD values during the study period also showed good correlation with the fire images recorded (not shown here) by the MODIS and VIIRS satellites over the Panchgaon region. The time variations in air quality parameters (both ground-based and column-integrated) observed over Panchgaon (shown in Table 1) around Diwali 2022 show a reasonable correspondence with those reported for the Delhi and neighbouring regions in the literature.

3. Event Report along with glimpses of the event (Photographs)

3.1 General Introduction of the Event – Amity School of Hospitality (ASH) organized FDP (Faculty Development Program) from 21-25 November 2022 on MS Team. The faculty coordinators were Dr. Garima Parkash & Dr. Ruchika Kulshrestha. The objective to conduct this event was to educate teaching fraternity regarding impact of digitalization on the tourism & hospitality industry. The event was attended by a total of 358 faculty members (11 faculty members of ASH & 347 outside faculty members). The FDP comprised of 16 sessions. The details of each session are as follows -

Day 1 (21 November 2022)

Inauguration Session

The Inauguration Session was held on 21 November 2022 between 10-11 AM on MS Team. The chief guests were Dr. Madhuri Sawant, Director, Department of Tourism Administration, Dr. B. A. Marathwada University, Aurangabad, Maharashtra & Dr. Sarah Hussain, Associate Professor & Head, Department of Tourism & Hospitality Management, Jamia Millia Islamia University, New Delhi. The moderator of the session was Dr. Ruchika Kulshrestha. The session was attended by 358 faculty members (11 faculty members of ASH & 347 outside faculty members). Dr. Madhuri Sawant said that the COVID-19 pandemic has completely changed our lives. As a result, many industries have suffered. One of them is tourism. Companies that have developed distribution channels for services/ products on the Internet have felt the effects of the coronavirus to a much lesser extent. Tourism is another branch of the economy that is increasingly visible on the Internet. Digitization is an inevitable phenomenon. Such an unexpected event such as pandemic Sars-CoV-2 only reinforces the opinion that many companies need to digitize. Of course, in a sector like tourism, you cannot travel online, but there are many processes that can be streamlined online. You can improve the comfort of service, communication and increase sales. You can also personalize the offer and approach the client individually. Dr. Sarah Hussain said that the customer behaviour has begun to shift because of digitalization, having a significant impact on the hotel and travel industries. People expect a customer-centric experience, from selecting their location with a few clicks to receiving detailed information on the lodgings, such as customer service, available activities, and room characteristics, and so on. The hospitality sector has embraced Internet of Things (IoT) and taken it a step further by allowing their Property Management system (also known as hotel management software) to connect with their visitors' own digital devices. It significantly improves hotel operations.

Session 1 (Teaching and Learning Methods in Digital Era)

The Session 1 on topic 'Teaching and Learning Methods in Digital Era' was held on 21 November 2022 between 11 AM – 12:30 PM on MS Team. The resource person was Dr. Sudipto Sarkar, Dean and Professor, School of Engineering and Technology, Sushant University, Gurgaon. The moderator of the session was Dr. Vinod Kumar Chauhan. The session was attended by 358 faculty members (11 faculty members of ASH & 347 outside faculty members). Dr. Sudipto Sarkar profoundly explained the topic with the help of a PPT & said that there are plenty of interesting teaching and learning methods in modern education such as video-based learning, personalization, gamification, mobile learning, microlearning, acceleration and contextualization of learning, crowdsourced learning, and much more. However, if you would have to express it all in one word, you could say that digitalization is the main trend that is going to transform the

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world of education once and for all. Indeed, the majority of impactful changes in the tourism & hospitality industry are in one way or another related to digital technologies.

Session 2 (Digital Intervention of Heritage)

The Session 2 on topic 'Digital Intervention of Heritage' was held on 21 November 2022 between 2–3:30 PM on MS Team. The resource person was Dr. Surabhi Srivastava, Associate Professor, Om Kothari Institute of Management, Kota, Rajasthan. The moderator of the session was Mr. Akshay Nain. The session was attended by 358 faculty members (11 faculty members of ASH & 347 outside faculty members). Dr. Surabhi Srivastava profoundly explained the topic with the help of a PPT & said that technology is transforming how people interact with history and heritage, providing unparalleled insight into our past. From deciphering ancient manuscripts with image processing and machine learning, right through to the recent 3D modelling of priceless artefacts, such as the Lion of Mosul, technology is bringing us closer to the past and widening horizons for millions globally. The digitization of documents is playing a key role in preservation; with museums, libraries and private collections around the world using technology to enhance their capabilities and ensure that historic documents will still be accessible for decades & centuries to come.

Day 2 (22 November 2022)

Session 3 (Case Study Session)

The Session 3 on topic 'Case Study Session' was held on 22 November 2022 between 10-11 AM on MS Team. The resource person was Dr. Ashutosh Pandey, Assistant Professor, FORE School of Management, New Delhi. The moderator of the session was Mr. Arunangshu Bhattacharya & Dr. Ruchika Kulshrestha. The session was attended by 358 faculty members (11 faculty members of ASH & 347 outside faculty members). Dr. Ashutosh Pandey profoundly explained the topic with the help of a PPT & said that case studies are an instructional method & not a theory that refers to assigned scenarios based on situations in which students observe, analyze, record, implement, conclude, summarize & recommend. Case studies are created and used as a tool for analysis and discussion. They have a long tradition of use in higher education. Cases are often based on actual events which adds a sense of urgency or reality. Case studies have elements of simulations. A good case has sufficient detail to necessitate research and to stimulate analysis from a variety of viewpoints or perspectives. They place the learner in the position of problem solver.

Session 4 (Digital Gastronomy)

The Session 4 on topic 'Digital Gastronomy' was held on 22 November 2022 between 11 AM – 12:30 PM on MS Team. The resource person was Dr. Saurav Chhabra, Associate Professor, Vatel Hotel & Tourism Business School, Sushant University, Gurgaon. The moderator of the session was Mr. Subir Kumar Malakar. The session was attended by 358 faculty members (11 faculty members of ASH & 347 outside faculty members). Dr. Saurav Chhabra profoundly explained the topic with the help of a PPT & said that Digital Gastronomy is a culinary vision that infuses traditional cooking with new computational abilities. The role of computers in tomorrow's food systems and cooking will continue to grow, helping to minimize waste and personalize dishes by using ingredients with well-known nutritional values; relying on the long shelf life of dried ingredients; and giving chefs novel creative cooking tools to justify computational cooking from a culinary perspective. Digital gastronomy enhances cooking with new digital capabilities. The integration of computers with cooking allows cooks to individually address users' needs and desires, easily calculate the nutritional content of ingredients or accurately affect cooking-related chemical reactions, and thus digitally fit dishes to personal preferences.

Session 5 (Flavors to Digital Flavors)

The Session 5 on topic 'Flavors to Digital Flavors' was held on 22 November 2022 between 2–3:30 PM on MS Team. The resource person was Dr. Garima Parkash, Director & Professor, Amity School of Hospitality, Amity University Haryana. The moderator of the session was Dr. Kunal Seth. The session was attended by 358 faculty members (11 faculty members of ASH & 347 outside faculty members). Dr. Garima Parkash profoundly explained the topic with the help of a PPT & said that Flavor is a pleasurable sensory perception we experience daily while eating and drinking. Our taste buds produce powerful, personal experiences, and they are about to be digitalized. Could you imagine putting a device in your mouth that digitally enhances the food you eat, so that anything can taste exactly how you want it to. By 2030, 44 percent expect this to be

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possible. This could have big implications for our health and diets by enabling us to eat healthy foods, and yet have them taste like five-star restaurant cuisine. Now, scientists are not far off from this concept after creating a "digital taste simulator" that can produce four main elements of taste – salty, sour, bitter and sweet. Scientists led by Nimesha Ranasinghe at the National University of Singapore are developing a device named "Tongue Mounted Digital Taste Interface" that can scintillate your tongue with sour, bitter, salty, and sweet tastes without the use of any chemicals or actual food. The "Tongue Mounted Digital Taste Interface" uses a two-probe system to send electrical and thermal signals to the tongue to produce taste.

Day 3 (23 November 2022)

Session 6 (Case Study Session)

The Session 6 on topic 'Case Study Session' was held on 23 November 2022 between 10-11 AM on MS Team. The resource person was Dr. Shashi Bala Rai, Founder, Dev Comm Consulting, Noida. The moderator of the session was Mr. Subir Kumar Malakar. The session was attended by 358 faculty members (11 faculty members of ASH & 347 outside faculty members). Dr. Shashi Bala Rai profoundly explained the topic with the help of a PPT & said that case studies can be either single or multiple-case designs. Single cases are used to confirm or challenge a theory, or to represent a unique or extreme case. Single-case studies are also ideal for revelatory cases where an observer may have access to a phenomenon that was previously inaccessible. Single-case designs require careful investigation to avoid misrepresentation and to maximize the investigator's access to the evidence. These studies can be holistic or embedded, the latter occurring when the same case study involves more than one unit of analysis. Multiple-case studies follow a replication logic. This is not to be confused with sampling logic where a selection is made out of a population, for inclusion in the study. This type of sample selection is improper in a case study. Each individual case study consists of a "whole" study, in which facts are gathered from various sources and conclusions drawn on those facts.

Session 7 (Digital Storytelling)

The Session 7 on topic 'Digital Storytelling' was held on 23 November 2022 between 11 AM – 12:30 PM on MS Team. The resource person was Dr. Ruchika Kulshrestha, Assistant Professor, Amity School of Hospitality, Amity University Haryana. The moderator of the session was Mr. Abhishek Roy. The session was attended 358 faculty members (11 faculty members of ASH & 347 outside faculty members). Dr. Ruchika Kulshrestha profoundly explained the topic with the help of a PPT & said that Digital Storytelling at its most basic core is the practice of using computer-based tools to tell stories. There is a wealth of other terms used to describe this practice, such as digital documentaries, computer-based narratives, digital essays, electronic memoirs, interactive storytelling, etc.; but in general, they all revolve around the idea of combining the art of telling stories with a variety of multimedia, including graphics, audio, video, and web publishing. As with traditional storytelling, most digital stories focus on a specific topic and contain a particular point of view. However, as the name implies, digital stories usually contain some mixture of computer-based images, text, recorded audio narration, video clips, and/or music. Digital stories can vary in length, but most of the stories used in education typically last between 2 and 10 minutes. The topics used in digital storytelling range from personal tales to the recounting of historical events, from exploring life in one's own community to the search for life in other corners of the universe, and literally, everything in between.

Session 8 (Digital Psychology)

The Session 8 on topic 'Digital Psychology' was held on 23 November 2022 between 2– 3:30 PM on MS Team. The resource person was Dr. Priyanka, Assistant Professor, AIBAS, Amity University Haryana. The moderator of the session was Dr. Vinod Kumar Chauhan. The session was attended by 358 faculty members (11 faculty members of ASH & 347 outside faculty members). Dr. Priyanka profoundly explained the topic with the help of a PPT & said that Digital Psychology is an arena of study that examines the impact of digital technology and media on psychological aspects of human lives, such as human behaviours, actions, attitudes, motivation, learning, and others. Interestingly, human psychology also influences the development and evolution of digital media and technology, such as its influence on business performance, growth, and economic landscape. Digital psychology explores the bidirectional relationship between human psychology and digital technology and media that have tremendous influences on each other. Digital Psychology plays a big role in business development. Understanding how technology and media influence human behaviours can help marketers engage consumers and persuade them to take desired

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actions. Professionals with knowledge in digital psychology can analyse and interpret digital data to better understand consumer behaviours, attitudes, and satisfactions. This data can be used to shape marketing strategy and help improve technologies and digital tools.

Day 4 (24 November 2022)

Session 9 (Case Study Session)

The Session 9 on topic 'Case Study Session' was held on 24 November 2022 between 10-11 AM on MS Team. The resource person was Dr. Yatish Joshi, Assistant Professor, School of Management Studies, Motilal Nehru National Institute of Technology, Allahabad, Uttar Pradesh. The moderator of the session was Mr. Akshay Nain. The session was attended by 358 faculty members (11 faculty members of ASH & 347 outside faculty members). Dr. Yatish Joshi profoundly explained the topic with the help of a PPT & said that the presentation of the case study establishes a framework for analysis. It is helpful if the statement of the case provides enough information for the students to figure out solutions and then to identify how to apply those solutions in other similar situations. Instructors may choose to use several cases so that students can identify both the similarities and differences among the cases. Case studies can be especially effective if they are paired with a reading assignment that introduces or explains a concept or analytical method that applies to the case. The amount of emphasis placed on the use of the reading during the case discussion depends on the complexity of the concept or method. If it is straightforward, the focus of the discussion can be placed on the use of the analytical results. If the method is more complex, the instructor may need to walk students through its application and the interpretation of the results.

Session 10 (Digital Skills)

The Session 10 on topic 'Digital Skills' was held on 24 November 2022 between 11 AM – 12:30 PM on MS Team. The resource person was Dr. Savita Sharma, Associate Professor, Shri Vishwakarma Skill University, Gurgaon. The moderator of the session was Dr. Kumari Shiwani. The session was attended by 358 faculty members (11 faculty members of ASH & 347 outside faculty members). Dr. Savita Sharma profoundly explained the topic with the help of a PPT & said that Digital Skills are defined as the ability to find, evaluate, use, share, and create content using digital devices, such as computers and smartphones. Depending on your career trajectory, you may need additional skills that pertain to your specific role. Digital skills in the workplace can include original content creation, e-commerce, network and information security, UX/UI design, digital marketing, social media marketing, and data analytics. Advanced digital skills range from data visualization and basic programming skills to data engineering. While these may be more advanced, you can obtain them with hands-on training and consistent exposure. Without a firm command of digital skills, there is no way to propel innovation and remain competitive. Employers realize this, so they're prioritizing candidates who can showcase their digital literacy. By developing better digital skills, employees have a chance to contribute to their communities, future-proof their careers, and explore a wide range of professional opportunities.

Session 11 (Digitalization in Tourism: Challenges and Opportunities)

The Session 11 on topic 'Digitalization in Tourism: Challenges and Opportunities' was held on 24 November 2022 between 2–3:30 PM on MS Team. The resource person was Dr. Mahesh Uniyal, Dean and Professor, Dev Bhoomi University, Uttarakhand. The moderator of the session was Mr. Subrata Pal. The session was attended by 358 faculty members (11 faculty members of ASH & 347 outside faculty members). Dr. Mahesh Uniyal profoundly explained the topic with the help of a PPT & said that Digitalization within the tourism sector influences and alters entire cities and regions in ways which are hard to predict and complex to analyse. Digitalization is massively changing the socio-economic culture in the world, especially in the travel and tourism industry. The Digital Revolution has completely changed the way businesses operate nowadays. Gone are the days when people had to go to travel agencies and stand in long queues for hours to book their tickets. With the advent of technological advancements and rapid digitalization, all travel companies have shunned geographical barriers and are adopting online methods to approach their clients. The challenges affecting digitalization of tourism are training on new digital technology, costs & uncertain return on investment, insufficient knowledge to identify opportunities, insufficient technical knowledge & lack of suitable 'off the shelf' products within budget. The opportunities associated with digitalization of tourism are customer acquisition, improve online brand visibility, expand international reach, improve service quality & increase customer satisfaction.

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Day 5 (25 November 2022)

Session 12 (Case Study Session)

The Session 12 on topic 'Case Study Session' was held on 25 November 2022 between 10-11 AM on MS Team. The resource person was Dr. Sharad Kumar Kulshreshtha, Assistant Professor, North-Eastern Hill University (NEHU), Shillong, Meghalaya. The moderator of the session was Dr. Ruchika Kulshrestha. The session was attended by 358 faculty members (11 faculty members of ASH & 347 outside faculty members). Dr. Sharad Kumar Kulshreshtha profoundly explained the topic with the help of a PPT & said that the case study teaching method is a highly adaptable style of teaching that involves problem-based learning and promotes the development of analytical skills. By presenting content in the format of a narrative accompanied by questions and activities that promote group discussion and solving of complex problems, case studies facilitate development of the higher levels of Bloom's taxonomy of cognitive learning; moving beyond recall of knowledge to analysis, evaluation, and application. Similarly, case studies facilitate interdisciplinary learning and can be used to highlight connections between specific academic topics and real-world societal issues and applications. This has been reported to increase student motivation to participate in class activities, which promotes learning and increases performance on assessments.

Session 13 (From Tech Novice to Tech Savvy - Hospitality Housekeeping)

The Session 13 on topic 'From Tech Novice to Tech Savvy - Hospitality Housekeeping' was held on 25 November 2022 between 11 AM – 12:30 PM on MS Team. The resource person was Ms. Chandana Paul, Assistant Professor, Vatel Hotel & Tourism Business School, Sushant University, Gurgaon. The moderator of the session was Mr. Hridyansh Vaid (BHM Student of 2019-23 Batch, ASH, AUH). The session was attended by 358 faculty members (11 faculty members of ASH & 347 outside faculty members). Ms. Chandana Paul profoundly explained the topic with the help of a PPT & said that technology has an important role to play in housekeeping department within hotels because it can assist the housekeeping department with its core tasks, while also allowing the team to improve efficiency and track and report progress. The housekeeping department of a hotel is responsible for maintaining the cleanliness, tidiness, and maintenance of the hotel, including public indoor spaces, guest rooms, staff areas, and the immediate surroundings. As a department, it is concerned with providing guests and employees alike with a safe, clean, comfortable and appealing environment. This includes overall hotel upkeep, cleaning surfaces, vacuuming floors, ensuring public spaces are pleasant, and taking steps to remove possible hazards and eliminate health risks. It may also include utilising the right housekeeping technology to carry out necessary tasks, and track progress. One of the ways the burden on housekeeping employees can be reduced is through strategic adoption of the right housekeeping technology. There are many different technology solutions such as use of housekeeping software, air purifier technology, sustainable cleaning products, apps & voice control communication, use of robots & artificial intelligence that can help hotels by improving the effectiveness of processes, boosting housekeeping efficiency & identifying specific customer needs.

Session 14 (Digital Trends in Wine Industry)

The Session 14 on topic 'Digital Trends in Wine Industry' was held on 25 November 2022 between 2–3:30 PM on MS Team. The resource person was Dr. Ashok Kumar, Senior Lecturer, IHMCT&AN, Shillong, Meghalaya. The moderator of the session was Mr. Subrata Pal. The session was attended by 358 faculty members (11 faculty members of ASH & 347 outside faculty members). Dr. Ashok Kumar profoundly explained the topic with the help of a PPT & said that wine industry has always been driven by science, technology and innovation. The latest wave of technology-driven change is focused on artificial intelligence (AI), the internet of things, augmented reality and blockchain. 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resource persons of the FDP one by one who took out time from their busy schedules & educated all the participants of the FDP on several important topics.



3. Event Report along with glimpses of the event (Photographs)

3.1 General Introduction of the Event – Association of Indian Universities (AIU) – Amity University Haryana, Gurugram (AUH) – Academic and Administrative Development Centre (AADC) - Amity School of Hospitality (ASH) - Amity Academic Staff College, AUH organized Five Days Online Faculty Development Programme (FDP) on 'Technological Advancement in Tourism & Hospitality Industry' from 20-24 March 2023 on MS Team. The faculty coordinators were Dr. Garima Parkash, Dr. Ruchika Kulshrestha & Mr. Akshay Nain. The objective to conduct this event was to educate tourism & hospitality teaching fraternity regarding technological advancement in the tourism & hospitality industry. The event was registered & attended by a total of 310 faculty members (10 faculty members of ASH & 300 outside faculty members). The FDP comprised of 14 sessions. The details of each session are as follows -

Day 1 (20 March 2023)

Inaugural Session

The Inaugural Session was held on 20 March 2023 between 10-11:30 AM on MS Team. The inaugural session commenced with Amity Education Group age-old tradition of Lamp Lighting (Virtual) & Saraswati Vandana. Thereafter, opening remarks were given by Dr. Sanjna Vij – Program Director, Amity Academic Staff College, Amity University Haryana. She focused on how technology is enhancing the tourism and hospitality industry.

Maj. Dr. Gulshan Sharma, Director General, International Chamber for Service Industry (ICSI) focused on incorporating the travel trade, to give the research projects to the students. He also focused on implementing domestic tourism as an integral part of the syllabi. He also motivated the participants to be the part of the MICE industry. Mr. Ashish Kumar, Co-Chairman, FICCI Travel Technology & Digital Committee addressed the session and explained about the adaptation factor in tourism and hospitality industry. He also focused on technological contents and advised to run with the pace. A brief address was given by Prof. Dr. Garima Parkash – Director, Amity School of Hospitality, Amity University Haryana. She also gave the vote of thanks to the dignitaries. The session was moderated by Dr. Ruchika Kulshrestha, the Organizing Secretary of the Faculty Development Programme. The session was coordinated by Mr. Akshay Nain, Faculty, Amity University Haryana.

Session 1 (Optimization of Front Office through Technology)

The Session 1 on topic 'Optimization of Front Office through Technology' was held on 20 March 2023 between 11:35 AM – 1:05 PM on MS Team. The resource person was Mr. Ashish Srivastava, Hospitality Manager, IIT Mandi, Himachal Pradesh. The moderator of the session was Mr. Akshay Nain. Mr. Ashish Srivastava profoundly explained the topic with the help of a PPT & said that cloud-based technology, self-check-in technology, specialized mobile apps, smart mobile keys, digital concierge technology, robotic staff, artificial intelligence based smart virtual assistants & chatbots are the major technological advancements in the hotel front office. The Cloud-based Property Management Systems (PMS) are likely to be adopted on a macro scale. Cloud solutions for the hotel front office help hotel operations by allowing systems to move from a physical location onto the internet. Many hotels now use a self-check-in kiosk which is a convenient one-stop facility that can read debit and credit cards, accept cash payments, print receipts and handle other aspects of the check-in process. A hotel app allows guests to book rooms, check-in, check-out, order room service, contact front office and communicate with front office staff in real-time, without having to call down

or leave the room. Payments can also be handled via the hotel app, making stay easier for the guest and also providing additional opportunities to increase revenue for the hotel.

Session 2 (Next Generation Hotels)

The Session 2 on topic 'Next Generation Hotels' was held on 20 March 2023 between 2– 3:30 PM on MS Team. The resource person was Mr. Arunangshu Bhattacharya, Deputy Director & Professor, Amity School of Hospitality, Amity University Haryana. The moderator of the session was Mr. Mohammad Soyav. Mr. Arunangshu Bhattacharya profoundly explained the topic with the help of a PPT & said that today most of the traditional hotels operate in silos defined by brands and spaces. Next Generation Hotels will build bridges to access new resources, balance resources to bring new life to existing capabilities, mobilize current resources for new partnerships and merge outside potential into new opportunity areas. Hotels are in a phase of significant evolution and opportunity. Technological innovations, changing customer demands and new competitive threats are pushing hotels to offer increasingly personal & uniquely tailored experiences for every guest on every visit. Very soon next generation hotels are going to evolve. The characteristic features of next generation hotels will be contactless payments, mobile door keys, facial recognition, personal voice assistance, hotel robots, online monitoring systems, chatbots & artificial intelligence.

Day 2 (21 March 2023)

Session 3 (Intelligent Cooking)

The Session 3 on topic 'Intelligent Cooking' was held on 21 March 2023 between 10-11:30 AM on MS Team. The resource person was Dr. Kunal Seth, Professor, Amity School of Hospitality, Amity University Harvana. The moderator of the session was Dr. Vinod Kumar Chauhan. Dr. Kunal Seth profoundly explained the topic with the help of a PPT & said that intelligent cooking is the usage of intelligent cum smart cooking machines that work through internet to cook food & are controlled by the mobile phones. These machines are easy to use, have wireless connectivity & are programmed with several step-by-step guided cooking recipes. These machines also have accessories such as steamer, simmering basket, butterfly whisk, spatula etc. Intelligent Cooking is a time-saving, fun & sustainable cooking. Intelligent Cooking cooks a particular food for optimal required time & at optimal temperature to produce best taste, aroma & texture. Just imagine when you wake up in the morning and get a ready-made coffee of your favorite texture and taste, it boosts you. By any chance if you forgot to turn off your cooking appliance, you will burn your food. But with intelligent cum smart cooking appliance, you can easily control food burning point. It has proved to be a revolutionary innovation for people with special abilities. Blind and people with impaired hearing can use keyboard navigation or automated voice transcription. The Internet of Things and Artificial Intelligence has made it possible for people with special ability to feel more empowered as they are not dependent on anyone. Internet of Things has made the usage of intelligent cum smart appliances so easy for old aged people too.

Session 4 (Virtual Technology - A Game Changer in Tourism)

The Session 4 on topic 'Virtual Technology - A Game Changer in Tourism' was held on 21 March 2023 between 11:35 AM – 1:05 PM on MS Team. The resource person was Mr. Anil Shashwat, Founder & Director, Holiday Host, New Delhi. The moderator of the session was Ms. Anishka Pachauri. Mr. Anil Shashwat profoundly explained the topic with the help of a PPT & said that evolving virtual technology is making an impact on how people travel and the functioning of tourism-related businesses. As people have become more informed when it comes to their travelogue, the travel industry must invest heavily in a wide range of technology-enabled solutions that can offer an enhanced experience to people. According to a Google study, 74% of travellers plan their trips with the assistance of the Internet. The Internet revolution has spurred people to explore those regions or locations which were a distant dream for travellers. With the Internet of Things (IoT), the major transformation which we witness during our travel is integrating sensors connected to the internet inside items like cars, suitcases, buildings etc. It will make the travelling experience more personalized for a traveller as with the help of Internet of Things (IoT), a user can keep track of his/her luggage at the airport or other public platforms besides controlling their room's temperature even before entering the hotel.

Session 5 (Strategies for Sustainable Green Hotels and Design: A Technical Approach)

The Session 5 on topic 'Strategies for Sustainable Green Hotels and Design: A Technical Approach' was held on 21 March 2023 between 2–3:30 PM on MS Team. The resource person was Dr. Varsha Khetrapal, HOD-Planning, School of Art & Architecture, Sushant University, Gurgaon. The moderator of the session was Mr. Shivansh Soni. Dr. Varsha Khetrapal profoundly explained the topic with the help of a PPT & said that Sustainable Green Hotels significantly reduce harmful impact on environment by adopting green practices in terms of their maintenance, services, logistics, products and supplies. The core elements revolve around reducing waste, saving energy and cutting down on water usage. There are many steps a hotel must take to move toward sustainability. Some of them are major capital expenditures, such as replacement of the HVAC system while others are easy to implement and even low-cost such as establishing processes to compost waste which will support sustainable gardening practices in hotels, donating unused or leftover food to various local and national food banks, using aerators on bathroom sinks to reduce water usage, replacing standard toilets with reduced water flow flush versions, swapping out traditional lights with energy-saving lights with sensors to automatically turn them on or off & brighten or dim, cutting the plastic usage, supporting local producers & vendors, reducing carbon emissions, solar panel installations, energy star rated heating & cooling systems, geo-thermal cooling towers, water recovery systems & recycling systems.

Day 3 (22 March 2023)

Session 6 (Impact of Robotics in Tourism Industry)

The Session 6 on topic 'Impact of Robotics in Tourism Industry' was held on 22 March 2023 between 10-11:30 AM on MS Team. The resource person was Dr. Anila Thomas, Associate Professor and Head, Department of Tourism & Travel Management, Jyoti Nivas College, Bangalore. The moderator of the session was Ms. Anishka Pachauri. Dr. Anila Thomas profoundly explained the topic with the help of a PPT & said that tourism industry is deploying robots to fundamentally change the tourist experience. Tourists can ask these robots questions, find out information and even get them to perform key tasks. Many of these robots also understand and communicate in multiple languages. There are a variety of other uses for robots within the tourism, travel & hospitality industry. These include robotic luggage porters and butlers, which can navigate hotels and provide valuable services for customers, and these robots are capable of handling check-ins and check-outs. Robots deliver greater consistency and accuracy than humans and are often quicker than humans & handle operations of tourism, travel & hospitality industry tirelessly 24x7. Among the most innovative uses of robots within the tourism industry so far is, Travelmate, a robotic suitcase, which removes the hassle of travel. This suitcase can follow its owner autonomously, utilizing collision detection technology and 360-degree turning capabilities, removing the need to carry the suitcase. Robots are also used to amuse & entertain customers many a times.

Session 7 (Artificial Intelligence in the Travel Industry)

The Session 7 on topic 'Artificial Intelligence in the Travel Industry' was held on 22 March 2023 between 11:35 AM – 1:05 PM on MS Team. The resource person was Dr. Pankaj Tyagi, Professor, Chandigarh University. The moderator of the session was Mr. Subir Kumar Malakar. Dr. Pankaj Tyagi profoundly explained the topic with the help of a PPT & said that Artificial Intelligence has made advances in many industries since it was invented. The ever-changing travel industry is also taking advantage of Artificial Intelligence to revolutionize the way it operates. As a result, now-a-days, travel companies highly leverage Artificial Intelligence-powered tools and solutions for various processes from travel planning to landing in the destination. Currently, Artificial Intelligence has been incorporated into many areas of the travel and tourism industry, making lives easier for travelers around the globe. For instance, there are some widely used forms of Artificial Intelligence in airports these days, such as facial recognition systems and airport security scanning devices. Thanks to Artificial Intelligence, travelers no longer need to visit travel agencies to book flights or search for accommodation. Artificial Intelligence assistants and Intelligent chatbots have now taken the place of travel agents allowing travelers to book flights and accommodations and hire vehicles online. These chatbots are deployed in social media sites like Facebook, Messenger, Skype, WhatsApp, Viber etc. to offer users a more personalized booking experience.

The resource person was Dr. Amitabh Dey, Principal, IHM Guwahati. The moderator of the session was Dr. Kumari Shiwani. Dr. Amitabh Dey profoundly explained the topic with the help of a PPT & said that Pedagogy is defined as the specific approach educators rate to

Mr. Deeptiman Bhattacharya profoundly explained the topic with the help of a PPT & said that incorporating technology in the food & beverage outlets is vital for improving efficiency and the customer experience. For instance, using digital menu boards in the food & beverage outlets allow customers to view available offers and place & send orders to the kitchen directly. Digital menu boards also reduce manual errors in the kitchen because orders placed directly by customers are accurate. Other technologies that improve customer experience in food & beverage outlets include bill splitting apps, online reservations and self-service kiosks. Food ordering and delivery apps like Deliveroo, Ubereats and Menulog allow you to order your favorite food and have it delivered to your doorsteps. Plus, you can pay online as well. These apps offer many benefits not only to consumers but also food & beverage outlet owners. By providing new technological mechanisms, food & beverage outlets enjoy increased online visibility, customer satisfaction and reduced expenses.

Session 11 (Technological Trends in Room Division)

The Session 11 on topic 'Technological Trends in Room Division' was held on 23 March 2023 between 2—3:30 PM on MS Team. The resource person was Ms. Neeraj Sharma, Executive Housekeeper, GMR, New Delhi. The moderator of the session was Dr. Vinod Kumar Chauhan. Starwood Hotels provide keyless entry to guests through its SPG app. More and more hotels are expected to switch to app-based entry systems soon. Guests can watch high-definition TV in mirrors, usually while enjoying a bathroom, sauna, or swimming pool. Hotels

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are increasingly adding thermostat technology that will allow guests to adjust the temperature in their rooms with a smartphone, even if they aren't on the premises. At many hotels, guests can now stream their computers, phones, or tablets directly to the large, high-definition televisions in their rooms. This allows guests to work on these screens, or to use them to watch content via streaming services such as Hulu and Netflix.

The AI systems in tourism and hospitality industry must be fair & un-biased. The AI systems must be free from any kind of discrimination with respect to tourists & hotel guests. AI systems must be safe & trustworthy.


