Additionally, she encouraged students to explore interests beyond their core subjects, promoting a balanced life across the four quadrants of self, family, friends, and community. Highlighting the importance of technical skills, Col. Inderjeet Singh, Chief Cyber Officer at Vara Technologies, provided insights on adapting to the corporate world. He stressed the importance of awareness and upskilling in a technologically driven era, highlighting the conversion of knowledge into skills in the corporate sphere. Col. Singh candidly addressed the time constraints for learning and the industry's expectations for immediate reliability and credibility. He advocated for mentors to bridge the gap between industry requirements and academic learning, urging students to go particularly

Regarding concerns that AI and Blockchain might lead to negative impacts, Col. Singh refuted the notion, asserting that technology's integration into jobs is inevitable and that upskilling is the key to remain relevant.

Succinctly summarising the key principles for industry-level upgrading as Mr. Sharad Gupta, Vice President & Head - Corporate Communications & Brand Strategy at Escorts Kubota Limited, gave three important terms, "Passion. He recommended resourceful reading beyond the curriculum, mentioned essential databases, and urged students to establish clubs that foster not only camaraderie but also learning. 

The new students thoroughly enjoyed themselves as they participated in different ice breaking activities like guessing the song from emoji; quiz and talent hunt.





Amity Business School (ABS):



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



