

He also talked about how start-up firms like Aspiring Minds harvested the need of sound trustworthy ecosystem as a business opportunity which worked creatively to match talent with job requirements using most modern tech and AI tools. Professor Khanna also touched upon the need to eliminate mistrust between scientists and entrepreneurs so that a free flowing collaboration could happen to bring societal benefits. We should work on unlocking scientific potential to allow free flow of ideas to generate creative solutions to the societal problems," added Prof Khanna.

3.1 General Introduction of the Event

With a continuous vision to create exclusive internationalization learning exposure for Faculty Members and Students at AUH, Office of International Affairs at Amity University, Gurugram Haryana, organized yet another session of the International Expert Talk Series (IETS) that hosts eminent academicians as speakers from leading premier universities across the globe. Under the great leadership and mentoring of the Hon'ble Chancellor Dr. Aseem Chauhan, AUH continues to take bigger and bigger strides in the sphere of comprehensive internationalization.

The session was delivered by the Dr. Ranjan Swarup, World Renowned Expert- Hormone regulated Root Development, Associate Professor, University of Nottingham, UK on "Role of Auxin Influx Carriers in Plant Development". It was hosted and moderated by Vice-President-

RBEF & Director- International Affairs, Prof. (Dr.) Gunjan M. Sanjeev. It was graced by prence of Deputy Vice-Chancellor, Maj. Gen. BS Suhag, Dean-DSW, Maj. Gen. G.S. Bal, Director-ASCI, Prof. (Dr.) Arvind Chabra and Director-AIP, Prof. (Dr.) Satish Sardana. The event was attended by many students and faculty members from ASCI, AIP, AIB and External Audience from India and Overseas.

3.2 Objectives of the Event

The main objective of the event was to create exclusive internationalization learning exposure and to provide a platform to AUH fraternity to interact and brainstorm with top academicians from premier foreign institutions across the globe and learn best practices on the contemporary topics across various domains.

3.3 Brief about the address/talk of speakers

At the webinar titled "Role of Auxin Influx Carriers in Plant Development", Dr. Ranjan Swarup elucidated about various plant growth hormones (auxins) and their contribution to regulate root development and their impact on overall plant growth and development. "Plants have a specific set of hormones, auxins and gibberellins, that regulate development of root and the shoot, respectively. Development of healthy roots, with more numbers of secondary roots, will naturally provide more nutrients to the plant, which would help grow healthy plants with better stem, fruits and leaves, quantitatively as well as qualitatively. Therefore, development of ways by which we induce healthy root formation would increase plant productivity", he mentioned.

Dr. Swarup studies hormone regulated root development and its impact on above ground physiology of the plants. Towards this, he examines the role of auxins in root development process. Auxin is a key plant hormone regulating various aspects of plant growth and development. Dr. Swarup is studying the role of AUX/LAX gene family that encodes high affinity auxin transporters which facilitate auxin transport, are located on the plasma membrane (PM). He also provided evidence that AUX1 PM localisation is mediated by AXR4. Further, he showed that auxin influx carriers are required for low Phosphorus mediated root hair elongation response in Arabidopsis and rice. He also presented his recent findings rice homolog of AXR4. Given that better root development in plants would improve plant health and productivity, Dr. Swarup's work has significant implications. As mentioned before, inducing healthy root formation could increase productivity of the plants, therefore, Dr. Swarup's research has direct translational implications." Currently working as Associate Professor at University of Nottingham, UK (Ranked amongst the top 100 as per QS global world university rankings 2021), Dr. Ranjan Swarup is a world-renowned expert on hormone regulated root development, authoring many highly cited papers.



In order to do this, student should not only achieve the deep knowledge of their disciplines but should be prepared for inter-disciplinary partnerships, inter-disciplinary friendships and find experiences which enable them to apply their knowledge in the context. 



3.2 Objectives of the Event

The main objective of the event was to provide a platform under IETS to AUH Students and Faculty Members to interact with top academician from leading foreign universities across the globe and learn the best practices on the contemporary emerging issues.

The secondary objective of the event was to organize collaborative activities with top foreign universities to strengthen linkages for creating various internationalization opportunities.

3.3 Brief about the address/talk of speakers

Office of International Affairs, Amity University Gurugram has organized an online webinar on "Leading & Managing Through Crisis: The Case of COVID-19" under its "Internal Expert Talk Series (IETS)". The Session was delivered by Dr. Brian McGarrie, Director- Executive MBA Programs, Birmingham University, UK and hosted and moderated by Vice-President- RBEF and Director-International Affairs, Prof. (Dr.) Gunjan M Sanjeev. Other panelists include Hon'ble Vice-Chancellor, Prof. (Dr.) PB Sharma, Dean-Students Welfare, Maj, Gen. GS Bal, Director-HR, Rear Admiral KK Pandey, Director-Admission and HoD-ABS, Prof. (Dr) Vikas Madhukar, Director-AIBAS, Prof. (Dr.) Rajesh Nair and Deputy Director- ASH, Prof. (Dr.) Aroonagshu Bhattacharya.

Vice-President- RBEF and Director- International Affairs, Prof. (Dr.) Gunjan M Sanjeev welcomed the participants and introduced esteemed guests to the audience. Prof. (Dr.) Gunjan M Sanjeev also talked about the necessity of new leadership lessons to be adopted to lead through crisis and managing organizations.

During his talk, Dr. Brian mentioned different types of crises and about various stages of a crisis which the organizations could face in their functioning. He gave some very lucid examples to explain some of the crisis that has affected the world before COVID 19. In the Indian context, he highlighted some of the disasters such as the Indian Ocean Tsunami 2004 and the Bhopal tragedy that occurred in 1984. He emphasized that in such a scenario, the government must address challenges on three fronts – How do we address the health crises? How do we address the economic crisis? and, how do we keep the business of the government operating? He suggested that the government should respond fast to recover and thrive from such crisis.

He raised a very important issue as to what does good leadership looks like during a crisis. The salient features that emerged from his discussion are- acting with urgency, communicating with transparency, responding productively to missteps, and engaging in constant updating. He further brought out a very relevant point where he emphasized that it is wrong to think that the work of the leader is to set a course and stick to it. He opined that leader must constantly update their understanding of prior probabilities deliberately using strategies to elicit new information and learn rapidly as events unfold and new information comes to light.

Dr. Brian is the Executive Director at Birmingham University, UK. He teaches Crisis Management and Organizational Reliability and Resilience. Brian has recently taught in Singapore, Malaysia, India, Jordan, and Zambia and worked with Airbus on their World Class Leaders Programme and taught a Risk and Crisis Management Executive Programme for Singapore Social Services.

Prof. (Dr.) PB Sharma, Vice-Chancellor, Amity University Gurugram in his special address highlighted resilience that India is demonstrating in the handing of Covid 19. Leaders must act with urgency, and they must acknowledge the crisis. Often delay in crisis creates unmanageable situations. Leaders must also act a tremendous amount of robustness on the policies and their execution.


