Since this was a Live YouTube event it might have served the purpose of encouraging the budding minds to think out of the box and inculcate an Entrepreneurial skills with in themselves.


### What Next

The whole idea was that the highest scorer and spirit of innovation wins.


Dr. Niti Chatterjee who was our mentor for the event gave word of encouragement and also concluded the event by giving a vote of thanks.


### The Impact:


Students across different backgrounds including Fashion Designers, Interior designers, BBA students and many more were seen and encouraged to come forward and work towards turning their idea into a working venture.


Dr. Niti Chatterjee who was one of the judge in the panel gave word of encouragement to the students. The session was concluded by giving a vote of thanks.

The event was successful in addressing some social issue in the country. It also provided some clarity on the procedure to open up a social venture and how to build a sustainable model for community change.







### **3.2** Objectives of the Event



- The interactive session by Mr. Addison Kappu, VP Investments on Roads to raising funds from venture capital is initiated with his introduction afterwards Mr. Kappu elaborately explained the procedure of raising funds for start ups through identified financiers and venture funds, he further explained that the procedure depends on assessment of existing resources and how best it can be utilized and leveraged for building up the enterprise. 

### 9.2 Objectives of the Event


