### 3. Event Report along with glimpses of the event (Photographs)

A notable feature of the Indian Constitution is the dignified and crucial position accorded to the Judiciary. Judge is the highest and the most respected position in the legal/ judicial system of India. They are impartial decision-makers in the pursuit of justice and rule on questions of law, act as a referee between the litigating parties and renders decisions in legal disputes. Due to the importance and responsibilities assigned to Judiciary, the demand to pursue Judicial services as career has become quite evident among majority of law students. In order to help the ALS students as well as to equip them with the required knowledge to get selected in the Judicial Examination of various States and to make their dream of becoming a Judicial Officer a reality, Amity Law School, AUH conducted a Guest Lecture on "**How to Crack Judiciary**", on 11<sup>th</sup> April, 2022 from 12PM- 1:30 PM.

The idea behind this was to provide a conceptual introduction about taking up Judiciary as a career option and tools and techniques to be adopted in order to clear Judicial Services Examination. The session was chaired by **Mr. Nikhil Kashyap, Director, Karat Lawz Academy** which is a leading coaching institute in New Delhi, by using ICT facilities. It was attended by 104 attendees (**Faculty members -02 & Students-102**).

The session started with the opening remarks from Maj Gen P.K. Sharma (Retd) Professor & Director, Amity Law School and Dean Faculty of Law Amity University Haryana. He welcomes the guest and expressed his happiness on organising such a lecture where students could learn the techniques for the preparation of Judicial Examinations.



The Guest apprised briefly about the Qualifications to appear for the Judicial Services examination which has two levels:

First, is the lower judicial service for fresh law graduates selected through an Entrance Exam conducted by the respective State Public Service Commissions or the High Courts. An entry through this assures time-bound promotions and secured tenure.

The second, is Higher Judicial Services for practicing lawyers. The selected applicants get posted as Additional District Judges, and their promotion is faster.

He further, highlighted on the Skills and Qualities needed for cracking the said Examination. The students were also equipped with a tricks and techniques, to be followed in Prelims, Mains and Interview.

He also motivated the students to keep themselves updated with not only the syllabus but also legal awareness and informed them about the available sources.

### **MAJOR HIGHLIGHTED POINTS:**

1. Selection Criteria: Preliminary, Mains and Interview.
2. Basic Attributes Required: Sense of responsibility, Impartiality, Patience, Commitment, Self-Confidence, Positive Attitude, Analytical Thinking, Good Communication Skills and Leadership Qualities.
3. Role and Responsibilities

The lecture concluded with Questions- Answers Session which turned out to an interesting and interactive part.
