General

1. Life of law is not logic, it is experience. Hence, Practical experience in law is very important. When stands in good stand with any legal professional, Moot Court exercises are indispensable to impart practical training to the students of Law. 

1. General



General

1. Life of law is not logic, it is experience. Hence, Practical experience in law is very important. When stands in good stand with any legal professional, Moot Court exercises are indispensible to impart practical training to the students of Law. 

1. 

It offers unrestricted access by users to different service providers. It supports generalized mobility which will allow consistent and ubiquitous provision of services to users.
