It gives me great pleasure to confirm that you have been chosen by the Board of the Structural College as the winner of the 2019 R W Chapman Medal for your paper "Effect of recycled coarse aggregate and manufactured sand in self compacting concrete", P. Mahakavi, and R. Chithra.

The medal was first awarded in 1935 and perpetuates the memory of Sir Robert Chapman, a former Professor of Engineering at the University of Adelaide and a member of the inaugural Council of the Institution. He was Chairman of the former Adelaide Division in 1920 and was President of the Institution in 1922.

The Chapman Medal is awarded for the paper published in an Australian Journal (with special consideration to the Australian Journal of Structural Engineering) satisfying the criteria in the previous calendar year. A learned paper submitted must meet the following criteria;

- Make a genuine attempt to share data.
- Represent a realistic approach to the subject i.e. practically appropriate techniques.
- Have at its core an important or neglected issue that could have wide application.
- Be a sound technical development.

The R W Chapman Medal is planned to be presented to one of you as representative of all the authors contributing to the paper at an Engineers Australia Structural College formal occasion later this year. We will be in touch to confirm the date and other details.
