Railway Sleeper Factory, Sithouly, Gwalior

NSS- AUMP organized one day visit of students to railway sleeper factory at sithouly, Gwalior. The programme aim was to instill the information regarding railway sleeper production and how to make railway sleeper in this factory. Rail Spring Karkhana is Located near Sithouli Railway Station about 12.8 KM away from Gwalior Railway Station. It is a unique workshop designed for manufacture of Hot Coil Helical Springs of various types for use on various types of Rolling Stock over entire Indian Railways. This unit was sanctioned & set-up well before formation of North Central Railway as an independent Railway Zone.

The Foundation Stone was laid by Hon'able Member Parliament Shri Madhav Rao Scindia. This is the largest dedicated Plant for manufacture of Helical Hot Coiled Springs for use on Indian Railways. It was setup in 1989 on turnkey basis by M/s Ernst Komrowski & Co. Germany in the Technical Collaboration with M/s Grueber, a Leading Spring Manufacturer of Germany. The total sanctioned cost for setting-up of the Project was Rs 54.04 Crores. The plant is now equipped with state-of-the art facilities for manufacture of Coiled Springs. All furnaces of this Plant are LPG fired.







In reference to the Letter No. 11014/01/2018-(EBSB) dated 28.08.2019, received from MHRD, "Jal Shakti Pakhwada" was observed in Amity University Madhya Pradesh from 1st to 15th Sept. 2019.

Activities taken up during the Swachhta Pakhwada 2019

The jal shakti team worked out the water conservation and water culture practices existing in the university premises. Ten pits of Rain Water Harvesting in are well maintained state. Hilly terrain of the 104 acre AUMP campus has natural water sheds, the same spots have been selected to build the water harvesting pits. Recycled water is used for horticulture and wash rooms. Drinking water supply is maintained by installation of Water Softening Plant maintained by ION Exchange of 30 K Ltrs capacity. Two Sewage Treatment Plants of 2.1 & 1.6 Lacks Ltrs per Day capacity each are functional and maintained.


Jal Shakti Team organized awareness campaigns involving experts followed by group discussions:

National Service Scheme (NSS): Poshan Maah (3rd October 2019)


"Poshan Maah" was observed by the NSS volunteers of Amity University Madhya Pradsh in the month of Sept 2019.




National Unity Day


Sanitation training-Poshan Maah


"Virtual Video Lecture of Waterman of India" from 12:30 to 1:00 PM
