

Report on one day (11th of November 2019) Cognitive Drill Therapy workshop conducted by Amity Institute of Behavioural & Allied Sciences, AU MP.

Amity Institute of Behavioral & Allied Sciences (AIBAS), AUMP conducted a workshop on Cognitive Drill Therapy on 11th Nvember 2019 with the auspicious presence of Dr Rakesh Jain, Senior Clinical Psychologist and Faculty from the Institute of Mental Health and Hospital, Agra. The workshop was organized with the objective of equipping the participants with novel perspectives of treatment in dealing with Anxiety Disorders such as Phobias and Obsessive-Compulsive Disorder (OCD).

The course of the workshop was divided into three sections:

- To understand the issues in Phobia and Obsessive-Compulsive Disorder and how to understand them from the patient's perspective
- To learn about the treatment of these conditions using the classical Cognitive and Behavioural Therapies.
- Introduction to Cognitive Drill Therapy (CDT), its uses and new methods associated with CDT in the treatment of Phobias, anxiety and OCD

The workshop benefited 72 parcipants which comprised of students from MPhil Clinical Psychology, U.G and P.G psychology students. There were 2 participants from outside as well. A total of 3 sessions were scheduled and each session lasted for 1.5 hours. Using his enriching clinical experience, Dr Jain, in the initial phase of the workshop, laid out the premise of phobia and OCD by explaining the internal factor of these conditions- which is anxiety. Keeping an interactive approach with the participants he elucidated how anxiety is associated with the fear of consequences or the perception of threat about the future which is irritational in comparison to the actual survival threats. Students learned about the mechanism of fear in phobias using real-life examples initiated by Dr Jain.

In the second phase of the workshop, in order to tackle these fears of uncertainty, Dr Jain comprehensively explained the measure of anxiety in the patient using several means. He then moved to describing how the classical approaches pertaining to behavioural and cognitive therapies have helped overcome these fears observed in the mentioned conditions. Using examples from clinical cases, how to use therapies such as cognitive therapy and behavioural therapies like systematic desensitization are used. Through this, Dr Jain laid down the foundation of Cognitive Drill Therapy and how its origin came to be within his own professional journey.

The third phase of the workshop commenced with elucidation of the usage of techniques that are central to CDT and the knowledge concerning how to use these techniques within therapeutic treatments. Students were enlightened with the ways in which they can learn these techniques by changing the linguistic pattern of their conversation with the patient and by introducing new exercises. To execute this, Dr Jain used his own therapeutic experiences with patients to take the students through the process and finally ended with a message of professional integrity encouraging the participants to learn CDT and use it for the betterment of society.

Questions and answer sessions were open throughout the workshop and Dr Jain humbly encouraged the participants to ask questions and answered their queries with utmost certainty. He also provided live examples of CDT by inviting participants to express their fears and overcome them by using the techniques that are being taught. The workshop proved successful and enlightening for the participants and the faculty with the opportunity to learn novel ideas and methods that lay down the path for advanced system of treatment within clinical psychology

The workshop was inaugurated by Dr. Deepa Pandey, Officiating Head of Institute of AIBAS, Dr. Rajendra Kumar Sharma, Head of Department of Clinical Psychology, the Organizing Committee and the faculty members of AIBAS.
















OUTCOME REPORT

5th INTRAMOOT 2019 Organized on 16-17 October 2019

General

1. Life of law is not logic, it is experience. Hence, Practical experience in law is very important. When stands in good stand with any legal professional, Moot Court exercises are indispensible to impart practical training to the students of Law. In the above backdrop, Amity Law School, Amity University, Madhya Pradesh, Gwalior conducted an internal Moot Court Competition, "3rd INTRAMOOT 2017" for its own students. All the UG students of ALS, except first and Final year students, were required to actively participate in the event. 1st year students, however, were also required to take part as the Court clerks and as spectators. The Competition was organized on 16-17 October 2019 in 'B' Block, Amity University, Madhya Pradesh, Gwalior, with an intention to give a platform to budding lawyers for growing as a skilled professionals. The Moot Proposition was based on Constitutional Law. The issue was related to Article 14, 19 and 21 of the Constitution of India. Faculty members of ALS judged various rounds of the events. LL.M. students were also included in the panel. Students were examined on three Parameters, First, they were examined for their drafting skill through their Memorials for Petitioner and Respondent, thereafter, researchers of the participating teams were examined for the research they did for the event in relation to Moot Proposition. The ultimate test was the arguments before the Court. Out of 55 teams of 3 students each, 8 teams qualified for quarterfinal round on the basis of their collective marks in Memorials and 1st Oral round. Through knockout rounds, two teams reached the Final. After conducting various rounds in Room No. 106,4107,1000 109, 110, 204-A and 204-B, the final was organized in the Moot Court.

Objective (s) of the Moot Court Competition

- 2. The Moot Court Competition was organized with the following objectives:
 - a. To impart practical training to the students about the court proceedings and to handle legal problems in a methodical and meticulous manner.
 - b. To teach the students to carryout research to find solutions to a legal problem.
 - c. To enable the students to learn the art of applying law to the given facts and present arguments before the court in clear, concise and logical manner.
 - d. To train the students about the Court etiquettes and court craft to enable them to make persuasive arguments.
 - e. To encourage the students to make best endeavours by honest, dispassionate, scientific, critical and careful investigation, enquiry and search to discover legal principles by taking into account the legislation, executive and judicial law making process. Further it is also designed to assess how far the legal process serves the social needs, and how it could be made useful and effective for the public good.
 - f. To teach the law students honesty of purpose, industrious engagement rendering justice as a judge and helping to render justice as an advocate, serving the society and philosophical free thinking and solving legal problems independently.
 - g. To enable the students to excel in law, consequently testing their creativity and powers of persuasion in a friendly competition.
 - h. To motivate the students to excel in interpretative skill which in fact is the lifeline of law.
 - i. To create an atmosphere of Moot Court in the ALS.

<u>Pre – Event Outcomes</u>

3. Tangible Outcomes.

- (a) All students from 3^{rd} , 5^{th} and 7^{th} Sem of all courses of ALS participated in the event.
- (b) 1st sem students of UG Courses also participated as Court Clerks and spectators.
- (c) 55 teams of 3 students each participated in the event.
- (d) Total 187 students including 155 competitors, 8 Organizing Committee members and 24 Court Clerks of 1st Sem of UG Courses took part in various capacity in the event.

4. Intangible Outcomes.

(a) Students of ALS got an opportunity to prepare the memorials based on the Proposition', which sharpened their drafting skill in relation to a real life issue.

- (b) Arguments on the given issues in Moot Court enhanced their arguments skill before the Court and they got well-versed with the court etiquettes and court craft.
- (c) Students got an opportunity to hear the arguments advanced by other teams on this very topic and views of Judges, which strengthened their knowledge and understanding of the subject.
- (d) Students learnt to carry out the research to find relevant law to the facts of the case.

During Moot Court Competition Outcomes

5. Tangible Outcomes.

- (a) Students participated in the moot court as budding lawyer and argued their cases with refreshing clarity converted into proper courtcraft.
- (b) Certificates were given to every participant, which shall be a part of their record, thereby establishing the name of AUMP forever.
- (c) As per the policy of the University, all the talks were recorded and kept in the Library for future reference of faculties, scholars and students.

6. Intangible Outcomes.

- (a) INTRAMOOT resulted in knowledge sharing by young budding lawyers of ALS in the form of high quality arguments. The participants presented innovative research ideas while arguing. This has resulted in enhancement of knowledge of students.
- (b) Knowledge was disseminated not only to the students of ALS but also to other students of AUMP, who attended the Moot Court.
- (c) The various rounds amplified the awareness of the students on various diversified issues related to the Moot Proposition that increased research skills among the students, research scholars and the faculties.
- (d) The Arguments in Moot Proposition also enhanced the knowledge of faculties and students as well as research scholars. Exposed them to new research ideas, which credibly enhanced the reputation of AUMP as a research and innovation driven University.

Post Moot Court Competition Outcomes

7. Tangible Outcomes.

- (a) A data base of all the Memorials of participants has been developed and maintained for future reference.
- (b) Certificates were distributed to all the participants and so also the awards to winners. This will also enhance our brand visibility.

This was the live quiz round where each participant had to answer a series of multiplechoice questions and their result were displayed in real-time.


3. Round 3: Programming


Amity Coding Club developed some websites with the help of club members.





- c) Student can fill choice anytime or any Place.


This year we have done minor track choice filling of 500 students within 10 minutes with this Application.



- v. And finally, the score is submitted to the server.








