

### **INTRODUCTION:**

One of the main being the fact that Clay as a building material is ideal for tropical conditions in our subcontinent. Other than these natural clay – of which terracotta is made of, is the most flexible form of earth. It is essentially the least resisting material. Clay is the oldest known versatile building material which has lasted for centuries sustaining its value and utility, it is the most plastic and workable material as it takes shapes of a toy to a material used for making high rise buildings.

Clay is a healthy solution for modern day building construction. The structures made up of the clay have proven themselves for their versatility and endurance for ages. Clay was selected as the choice of material for various favorable reasons including the commercial considerations, natural availability and recyclable nature of clay. Looking into the current volatility of the manufacturing cost of cement, Clay proves to be the most cost efficient and sustainable.

Clay when fired leads to a porous structure which are filled with air when dry thus providing the best of the insulation properties largely useful to regulate the temperature (keeping cool in summers and warm in winters).

Meanwhile, Plaster of Paris is light in weight and more durable and has low thermal conductivity. It is very good fire resistant and hence a very good heat insulating material. It does not shrink while setting. Therefore, it does not develop cracks on heating or setting and forms a thick surface to resist normal knocks after drying. It mixes up easily with water and is easy to spread and level. It has good adhesion on fibrous materials. It gives a firm surface on which the colours can settle and has no appreciable chemical action on paint and does not cause alkali attack. Plaster of Paris gives a decorative interior finish. Its

gypsum content provides it a lot of shine and smoothness. The best part is it can easily be molded into any shape.

### **OBJECTIVES:**

- To offer hands-on experience building clay structure.
- To impart knowledge of traditional and modern earth techniques and provide exposure in different materials and mediums.
- To give students a "material imagination" and "3-d forms visualization" for design -Learning how to use clay and P.O.P as a building material
- Applying the proper construction methodologies for the task at hand
- Solving problems as they arise
- Setting priorities and keeping work on schedule

All these objectives were successfully completed with the guidance and aid of the organizing team.

### **METHODOLOGY:**

**Day 1:** We started our day with development of design with imagination processing and processing of raw clay i.e. mixing of water into clay to create different sized lumps and keep it for drying.

Then the students were told to sketch and finalize their murals and sculptures.


### **CONCLUSION:**







# General

1. Life of law is not logic, it is experience. Hence, Practical experience in law is very important. When stands in good stand with any legal professional, Moot Court exercises are indispensible to impart practical training to the students of Law. In the above backdrop, Amity Law School, Amity University, Madhya Pradesh, Gwalior conducted an internal Moot Court Competition, "3rd INTRAMOOT 2017" for its own students. All the UG students of ALS, except first year students, were required to actively participate in the event. 1st year students, however, were also required to take part as the Court clerks and as spectators. The Competition was organized on 6th to 8th November 2017 in 'B' Block. Amity University, Madhya Pradesh, Gwalior, with an intention to give a platform to budding lawyers for growing as a skilled professionals. The Moot Proposition was based on "Ban on sacramental wine and total prohibition of liquor". The issue was related to Article 14, 15, 19, 21, 25, 28 and 29 of the Constitution of India. Faculty members of ALS judged various rounds of the events. Guest faculty and LL.M. students were also included in the panel. Students were examined on three Parameters, First, they were examined for their drafting skill through their Memorials for Petitioner and Respondents, thereafter, researchers of the participating teams were examined for the research they did for the event in relation to Moot Proposition. The ultimate test was the arguments before the Court. Out of 56 teams of 3 students each, 16 teams qualified for Pre-quarterfinal round on the basis of their collective marks in Memorials, Researcher test and 1st Oral round. Organised By: Amity Law School Separation of Power is the inherent Characteristic of the Indian Constitution, but the mere separation is not sufficient without the 'Check & balance' among the three organs of the State. Though, broadly the demarcation of powers is clear, but unfortunately, by a thin line. An experience of 66 years of Constitution shows that every organ tried to increase its powers and to limit the powers of other organ.

Though Court accepted the parliament's absolute power to amend the Constitution but subject to Basic Structure of the Constitution. It has been observed that Parliament has been tried to limit the power of the Court by various Amendments. Court always remained vigilant and struck down the provisions of various amendment acts. Recently, in the matter of 9th Schedule Case (I.R. Coelho) and more recently NJAC Case reiterated the necessity of reconsideration of the concept of 'Check & Balance' as enshrined in the Indian Constitution

The proposed Seminar is an effort to analyse that whether these conflicts show the strength of the Indian Constitution or Weaknesses? Is it the Power clash or true Interpretation of the Constitution? Is the 'Check & Balance' system is turning the balance towards any of the organ? Can we presume that the Court has become most powerful organ in Indian Constitution?
