ABOUT AMITY UNIVERSITY MADHYA PRADESH

- 1. Amity University Madhya Pradesh (AUMP) was established by RitnandBalved Education Foundation (RBEF) at Gwalior by Madhya Pradesh NijiVishwavidyalaya (Sthapna Avam Sanchalan) Adhiniyam 2007 and Dwitiya Sanshodhan Adhiniyam (No. 27 of 2010) vide State Government Notification No. 7692-402 इक्कीस अ (प्रा) dated 30 Dec 2010, with the view to promote professional, industry-oriented education in the state of Madhya Pradesh. Amity University Madhya Pradesh, Gwalior located on a sprawling campus of 102 acres of land opposite Gwalior Airport, imparts modern, practical and research-oriented courses which lead to the development of professionals who are employable and industry ready. This in turn drives the socio-economic upliftment of the region.
- 2. Amity University Madhya Pradesh (AUMP) imparts education in almost all areas including management, engineering, architecture, biotechnology, law, Journalism & mass communication, behavioral science, Psychology, fashion, etc.





Hostels

The University has three large hostels two for boys and one for girls with capacity of 240 each totaling to 720. Separate facilities for boys and girls, caring wardens, and tight security ensure a pleasant stay for students. The mantra of Amity hostel staff is to create a home away from home for all hostel students.



This is achieved by ensuring 24 hours power and water supply, clean, well-lit, specious rooms, common rooms with television, geysers in bathrooms, and window with wire mesh to keep out mosquitoes. Each student is provided with a separate bed, mattress, pillow and study table. Each hostel is surrounded by a boundary wall and entry to the hostel is restricted to only those students who are staying in hostel. The hostellers are required to show their identity cards to the security personnel posted at hostel gates and also sign their entry using bio-metric device installed in each hostel.




All hostels are Wi-Fi enabled, and the students can access the net 24/7 from their rooms. The students are provided a free laundry service, and have 24 hours access to the Medical Room.

GREEN INITIATIVE

With an aim to promote clean and green energy, the University has successfully installed roof top solar panels in its 03 Academic Blocks with a total capacity of 305 KW. Through this initiative total savings of Rs. 26,48,812/- (rupees twenty six lakhs forty eight thousand eight hundred twelve) has been done for the period between July, 2018 to June 2019 in the energy consumption of the University. The electricity bill has been reduced to approximately 10% per month of the total bill amount.






a) Gender Wise Strength of Students Admitted in 2018-19: (Total)




(b) Total Gender Wise Strength of Students (Total: 2018)





Two of our University projects made by the students got selected in part – 1, with the prize money of 1000\$ and 250\$




2. NHRC WINTER INTERNSHIP PROGRAMME 2018


