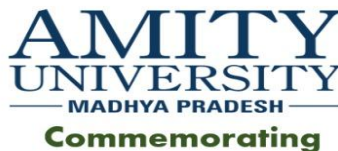
## Outcomes Achieved:

The event led to a deeper understanding of World AIDS Day 2025, brought some positive news, especially for India. The country has seen a 49% drop in new HIV infections and an 81% fall in AIDS-related deaths. This is a huge achievement, considering the efforts made under the National AIDS Control Programme. Students actively engaged in the scientifically manner through lectures. It promoted awareness of HIV infections and blood donation. However, there's still work to be done, especially among young people (19-28 years old), where new infections are rising. Stigma and late testing remain significant challenges.

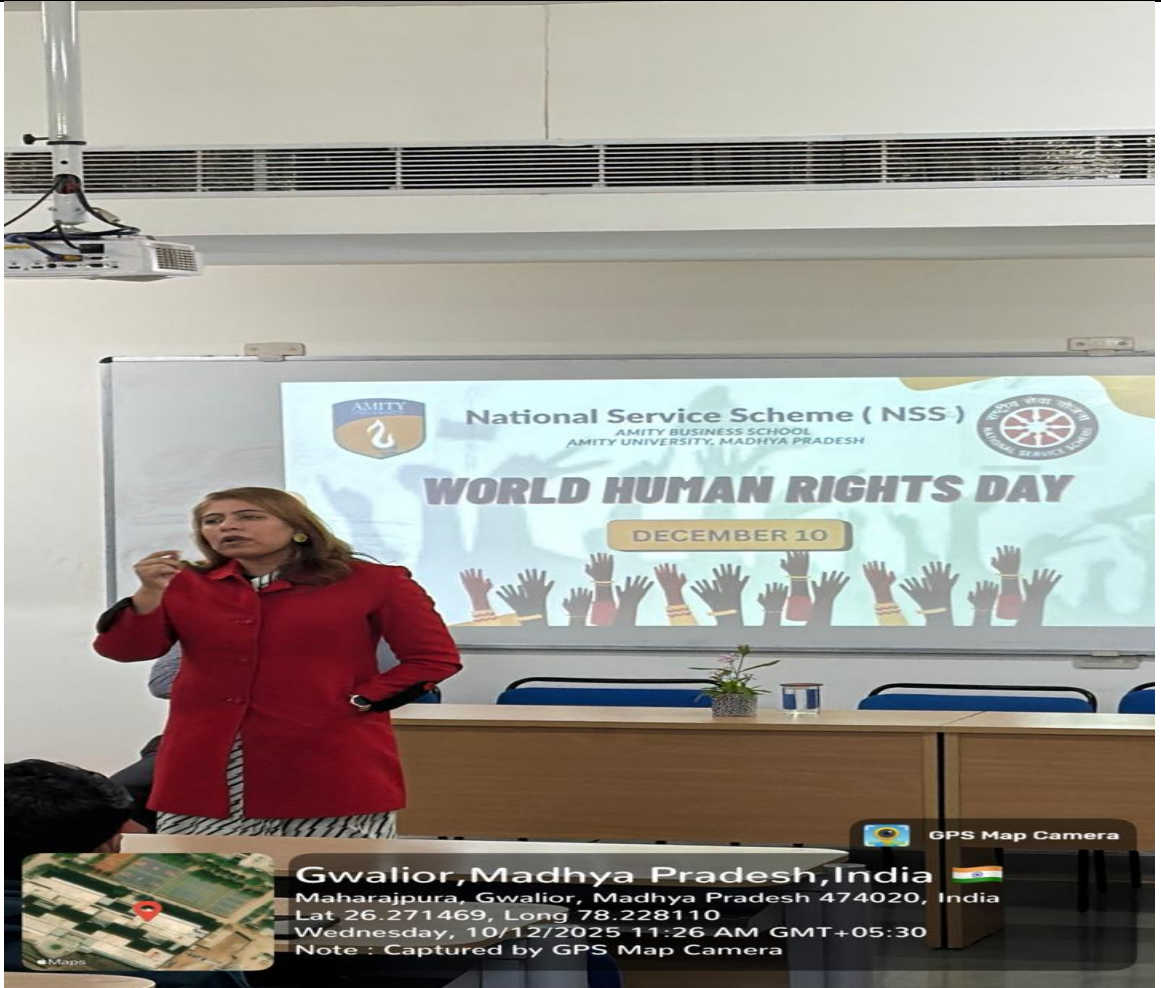
On 10-12-2025, a guest session was conducted at ABS.

**General Introduction of the Event:** The NSS Unit of Amity University Madhya Pradesh (AUMP) organized an Eye Checkup Camp on 27 November 2025 at the E Block Foyer as part of its regular NSS activities, in collaboration with ASG Eye Hospital, whose team of five experienced doctors conducted the checkups. The camp was inaugurated by Lt. Gen. V. K. Sharma, AVSM (Retd.), Hon'ble Pro Chancellor, AUMP, in the presence of Dr. Nikhil Jain from ASG Eye Hospital and the NSS Wing of AUMP. The event witnessed overwhelming participation with more than 250 registrations, including faculty members, administrative and technical staff, students, and support staff from hostels, security, and administration. The medical team provided vision screening, refraction tests, eye pressure checks, and preliminary diagnosis of common eye-related issues, while NSS volunteers efficiently managed registrations and assisted throughout the event. The camp successfully promoted awareness about eye health, facilitated early detection of vision problems, and strengthened collaboration between AUMP and ASG Eye Hospital, receiving highly positive feedback from participants and contributing significantly to the university's ongoing health and wellness initiatives.

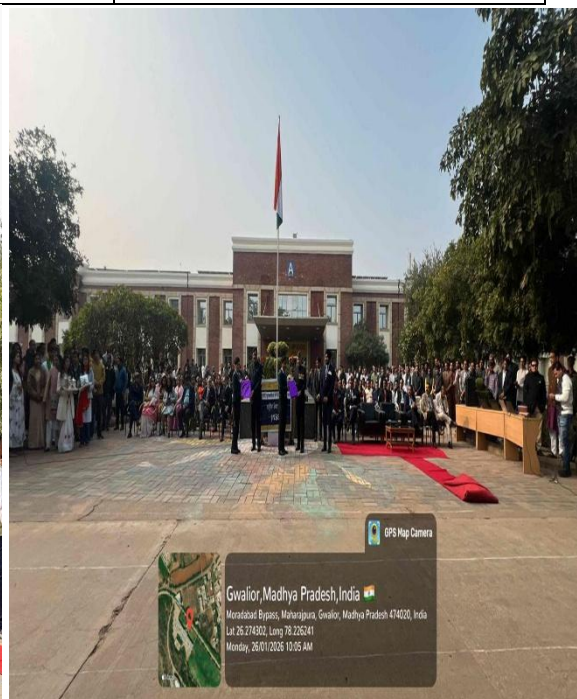

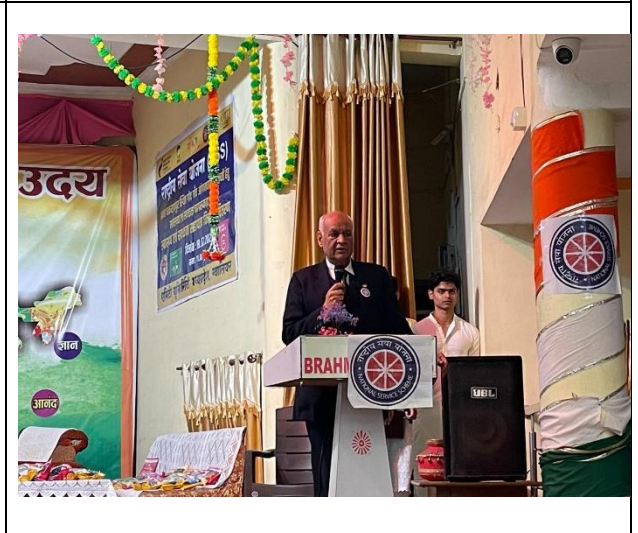
included cleaning the Aashram premises. In the afternoon, the volunteers visited the nearby rural areas to plan future social activity projects for the camp tenure.

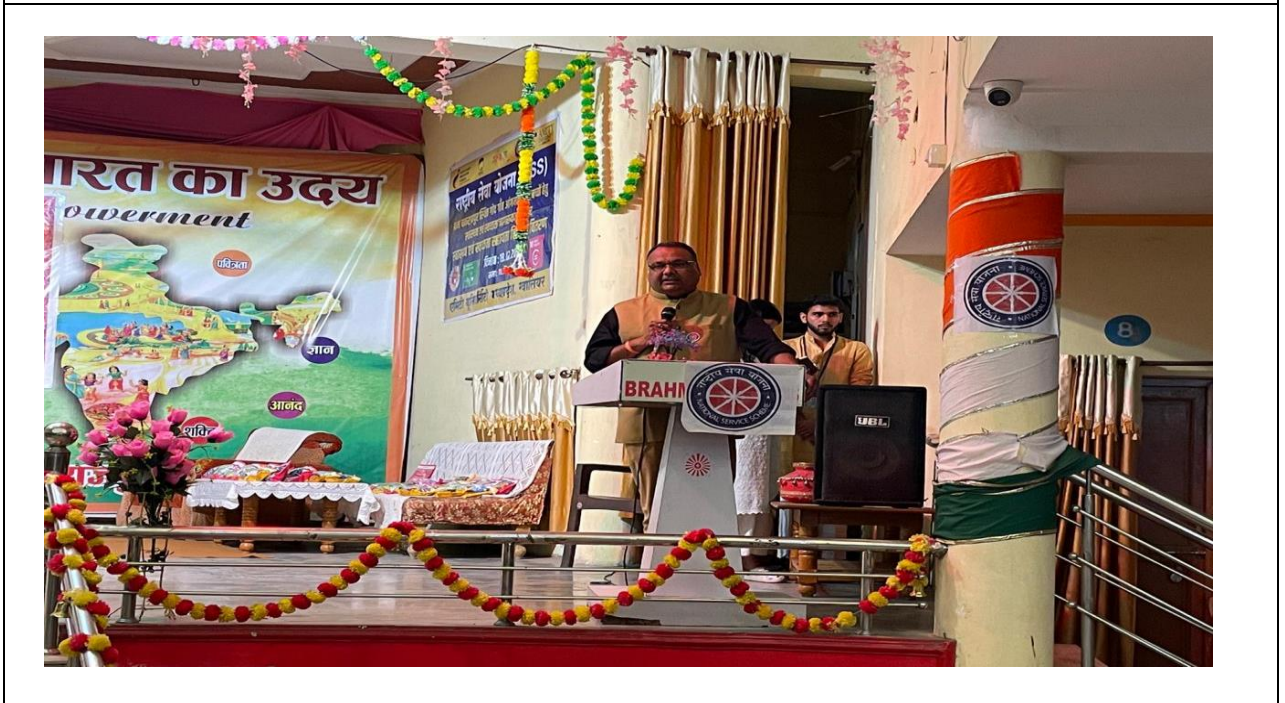
