ग्वालियर 31 मई. एमिटी यूनिवर्सिटी मध्य प्रदेश की राष्ट्रीय सेवा योजना इकाई ने 31 मई 2024 को विश्व तंबाकू निषेध दिवस पर विशेष कार्यक्रम आयोजित किया। कार्यक्रम का उद्घाटन यूनिवर्सिटी के माननीय प्रो चांसलर लेफ्टिनेंट जनरल वीके शर्मा, एवीएसएम (रिटायर्ड) के ओजस्वी व्याख्यान से हुआ। उन्होंने आवाहन किया कि युवाओं को तंबाकू की लत से परे रहकर अपने स्वास्थ्य पर ध्यान देना चाहिए। विश्व तंबाकू निषेध दिवस 2024 की थीम तंबाकू उद्योग के हस्तक्षेप और बच्चों की सुरक्षा पर उन्होंने बताया कि
