



**National Seminar: Juvenile Delinquency and Justice: Changing Contours (30<sup>th</sup> March, 2019)**

Amity School of Law conducted National Seminar on “Juvenile Delinquency and Justice” on 30<sup>th</sup> of March, 2019 to create a forum to discuss the various facets of juvenile delinquency.
