

Policy Guideline on Public Access to Green Spaces

1. Introduction

1.1. Purpose

The purpose of this policy is to provide guidelines for facilitating public access to university green spaces while ensuring their preservation and responsible use. It aims to balance public enjoyment with the protection of natural resources, the maintenance of safety, and the fulfillment of the university's commitment to sustainability.

1.2. Scope

This policy applies to all designated green spaces on university property, including parks, gardens, courtyards, and recreational fields. It governs access for students, staff, faculty, visitors, and members of the general public. The policy also includes guidelines for the use of these spaces for events, recreational activities, and environmental stewardship initiatives.

2. Policy Objectives

The primary objectives of this policy are:

Promote Public Access: Ensure that university green spaces are accessible to the public for recreational, educational, and cultural purposes.

Preserve Environmental Integrity: Protect the natural environment and biodiversity within green spaces, preventing damage and ensuring sustainability.

Maintain Safety and Order: Implement measures to ensure that green spaces are safe and well-maintained for all users, while minimizing risks related to misuse or overcrowding.

Support University and Community Goals: Align the use of green spaces with the university's mission to promote education, research, and community engagement, while preserving spaces for student and staff use.

Encourage Sustainable Practices: Promote environmentally responsible behavior among users, including waste management, water conservation, and the protection of flora and fauna.

3. Guiding Principles

The following principles guide the management of public access to university green spaces:

3.1. Open and Inclusive Access

University green spaces are open to the public during specified hours, and visitors are encouraged to use these areas for leisure, reflection, and recreational activities. All members of the community are welcome to enjoy these spaces, regardless of background, with respect for others and the environment.

3.2. Protection of the Natural Environment

Visitors are required to respect the natural landscape, flora, and fauna. Damaging plants, trees, or wildlife, littering, or otherwise harming the ecosystem is prohibited. Special care will be taken to preserve areas of ecological significance, such as native plant gardens or wildlife habitats, through signage and restricted access where necessary.

3.3. Responsible Use of Space

Visitors must use green spaces in a way that does not interfere with university operations or disrupt academic activities. Large gatherings, events, or recreational activities that could impact the surrounding environment or campus life may require prior approval. Visitors must adhere to safety regulations, such as not entering restricted areas, avoiding damage to infrastructure, and following any posted rules regarding the use of recreational equipment, such as bicycles or sports gear.

3.5. Environmental Stewardship

The university is committed to promoting environmental sustainability within its green spaces. Initiatives such as waste recycling, water conservation, and energy-efficient lighting systems will be implemented and supported by the community. Educational programs and signage will encourage visitors to act as stewards of the environment by reducing waste, conserving water, and respecting the natural habitat.

4. Programs Supporting Public Access to Green Spaces

To enhance the experience of using green spaces and foster community engagement, the following programs and initiatives will be in place:

4.1. Public Events and Activities

The university will organize public events such as outdoor yoga, guided nature walks, sustainability workshops, and cultural festivals to encourage community use of green spaces. These events will be planned with environmental impact in mind to ensure minimal disruption to the ecosystem. Special events, including academic and social gatherings, may be held in designated areas of green spaces. These must be approved by the university's event management office to ensure they align with the policy objectives.

4.2. Educational and Environmental Awareness Programs

The university will offer educational programs that raise awareness about environmental conservation, biodiversity, and sustainability practices. These programs may include public lectures, volunteer opportunities, and exhibitions related to green space management and ecology. Partnerships with local schools and community groups will be encouraged to engage a broader

audience in environmental stewardship.

4.3. Volunteer and Community Gardening Initiatives

Community gardening programs may be established to allow students, staff, and local residents to participate in maintaining and beautifying university green spaces. This includes planting native species, maintaining flower beds, and participating in tree-planting events. Volunteers will be provided with training on sustainable gardening practices and the ecological significance of native plants and landscapes.

4.4. Accessibility Enhancements

The university is committed to ensuring that all visitors can enjoy its green spaces. Accessibility features such as ramps, paved pathways, and designated seating areas will be maintained to provide ease of access for individuals with disabilities. 5. Monitoring and Control

5.1. Security and Surveillance

This may include a hotline or an online form where visitors can report problems or offer suggestions for improving the use of green spaces.
