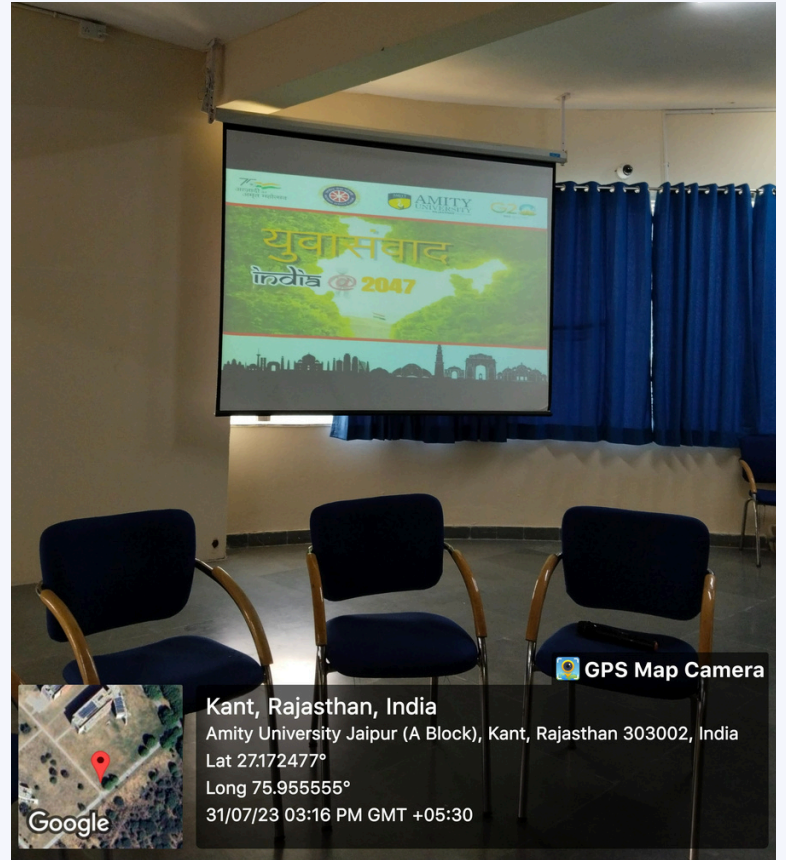

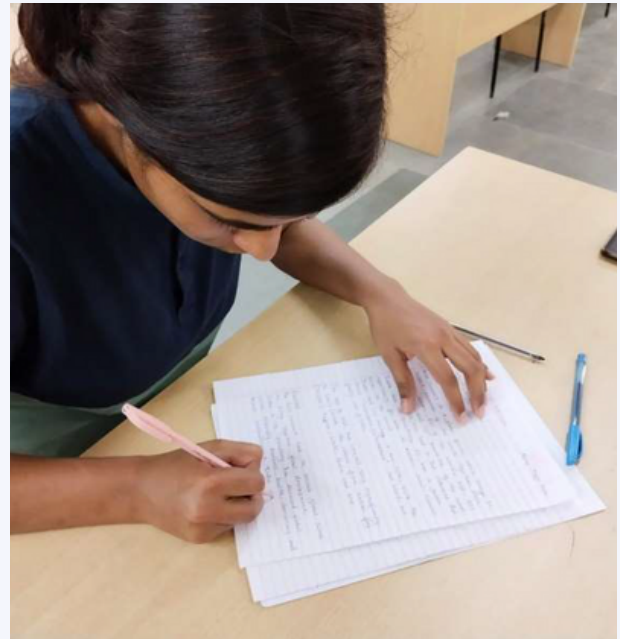
# RAJASTHAN MISSION 2030: A VISION FOR THE FUTURE

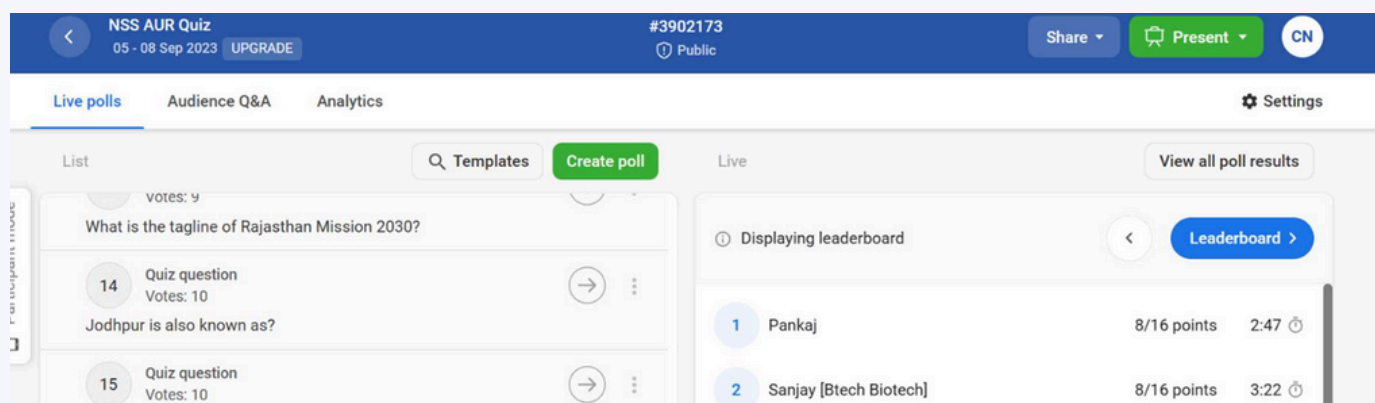
# RAJASTHAN MISSION 2030: A VISION FOR THE FUTURE

# POLICE VIDYARTHI SAMVAD

To promote an open and creative dialogue between the police and students, NSS Cell of Amity University Rajasthan organised a "*Police Student Dialogue*" program. The event commenced with a welcome speech by **Dr. Pallavi Mishra**, Associate Professor at Amity University Rajasthan, who explained the program's objectives. The Bagru print is a type of traditional print in Bagru village which is in Sanganer district, Rajasthan. It is a 400-year-old printing method started by **Thakur Sahab**, the printing equipment was imported from the Swai Madhopur. The Bagru village is located near a river which provides them a good-quality clay. The villages while creating the prints wash the clothes with turmeric water which gives them peach colour. The cloths were washed after every step and dried into the direct sunlight for a day. The paste that is going to be printed on the cloth is printed with the help of wooden blocks. There are mainly two types of outline that are famous in Bagru printing: black and red.

Through **Khadi Mahotsav**, volunteers gain valuable knowledge about the history and importance of khadi clothing, making it a meaningful effort to promote khadi over mass-produced garments

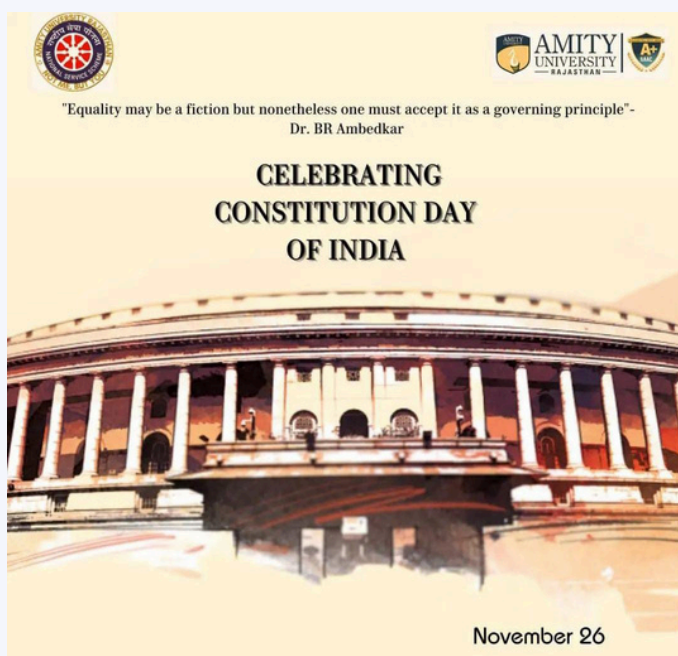


# NATIONAL CONSTITUTIONAL DAY
