







Report on Online Essay and Drawing Competition

SDG 6::

Clean Water and Sanitation- Availability to all.

Water Management in Cities for Sustaining Urbanisation

To add to the problem is the poor availability of water. The per capita water availability on our planet has been consistently dipping. This was over 6000 cubic metres in 1947 and is projected to decrease to less than 1150 cubic metres in 2050, which is regarded by WHO as insufficient for healthy living. As global population grows to over 9 billion by 2050, water scarcity could 'blow up' the world through failure of crops, breakdown of ecosystems, collapse of industries etc. Majority of India survives on ground water. Ground water levels are receding all over the country, rivers are drying up and fertile lands are turning towards desertification. Global warming is making the situation even worse. Already, parts of India are facing drought due to failure of the monsoon year after year. Nature had created the surface and ground water habitats for fresh water through geological activities millions of years ago. Until about a hundred years ago, fresh water from these habitats appeared to be perennial. But its traditional habitats are being systematically destroyed by human activities and the ignorant public remains a mute spectator.

Amity University Rajasthan is not only promoting the sustainable use of water in ensuring availability of clean and sanitized water but also practicing different initiatives for the same.

Conserving Water and Preventing Wastage Water conservation is very important at AUR. The aim is to reduce wastage of water. To this end the following measures are being taken:

(a) Rainwater harvesting Lake The artificial lake gets



treated water from the Sewage Treatment Plant and also all the rainwater from terraces of buildings, and other rain water drains comes to this lake. This water is used for horticulture, thus ensuring literally zero wastage of water.

- (b) Water Level Indicators A panel having three indicators denoting the water level is being established at ground level for ease of information to the plumbers for switching pumps On/Off, thus avoiding spillage and waste of water.
- (c) Automated water filling system A Solenoid valve, pressure switch, float switch arrangement is being planned for implementation for automatic water filling system at one of the hostels on trial basis. This system if implemented at all locations will promote zero wastage of water therefore conserving water.
- (d) Ground Water Recharging Ground water recharging had been done at various places. The ground water recharging is planned to be extended to borewell recharging. Two borewells have been identified for the pilot project. As AUR is in a semi bowl shape, water during rains also flows into the campus from the front and rear gates. The aim is to channelize this water to the nearest borewell for recharging through proper filtration.
- (e) Use of STP water in flush system hostels Hostel Blocks are connected with a separate flush line for using the STP water.
- (f) Ground Mapping Ground mapping of AUR periphery has been done by 2 D image resistivity method. Cracks fixtures which could store water have been found. The intent is to recharge these zones so that the water resource is within the campus.

Amity University Rajasthan has established a dedicated research centre, "COAST- Centre for Ocean & Atmosphere Science and Technology", in the year 2015 to plan and execute climate related R&D.

Centre is first of its kind in the state of Rajasthan to promote interdisciplinary research on numerical modeling of Ocean & Atmosphere state, monsoon studies, climate modeling, extreme weather as well as academic programs at graduate, post-graduate and doctoral levels. The Research is focused on

- Prediction of High Impact Weather Hazards such as heavy rainfall, tropical cyclone
- Regional Climate Modeling for prediction of climate change disasters
- Environmental Monitoring and Modeling

Environmental Monitoring Facility (EMF) has been established at Amity University Campus with the collaboration of India Meteorological Department (IMD), Ministry of Earth Sciences, New Delhi to monitor air quality.

Climate related projects are implemented with the support of Department of science & technology which helps the planners, disaster managers and coastal zone authorities for planning and implementation of climate change hazards. The University is also organizing Webinars to create awareness by inviting experts from NGO's, Govt Organizations and Reputed Institutes.

Amity University Rajasthan (AUR) follows a strict policy on Bribery and Anti-corruption and takes zero-tolerance approach for the same. The University follows a strict system and mandate on Freedom to Academic affairs which is applicable to all the Faculty Members, Staffs and students at the University. There is a system of Class Representative, wherein the students vote and elect their representative who in turn attends all the meetings with the Management Representatives on behalf of the students body. AUR follows a system of Mentor Mentee where all the students are provided with a Faculty Member (Mentor) to address, resolve and help the students in different affairs related to academics as well as personal.

Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) is a part of all the programs at AUR. This ensures student centric contextual curriculum and achievement of desired student learning outcomes. Choice Based Credit System enables the students to satisfy their scholastic needs and aspirations as the system provides enhanced learning opportunities. It offers flexibility, as the student, apart from the core courses, has a choice in selecting courses (as electives, relevant to the programme of study and as per the programme structure) out of those offered by other AUR Institutions/Departments/Disciplines. The aim is to provide students to undertake inter-disciplinary courses (as electives). Interdisciplinary approach enables integration of concepts, theories, techniques, and perspectives from two or more disciplines to advance fundamental understanding or to solve problems whose solutions are beyond the scope of a single discipline.

Amity University Rajasthan strongly believes in creating open platform for its stakeholders to discuss various issues/ policies/ current affairs/practices. where political experts are visiting university and utilizing the platform. Domain specific experts from government and oppositions have recently visited universities and shared their views and planning which they are inducting in near future.

For smooth implementation University has signed several MOU's /LOA's with these organization and continuously encourages its faculty members and students to add required organizations for outcome-based R&D.

University encourages its departments to plan and execute various events which are targeting cutting age domains including cross sectorial in nature. Faculty members are encouraged to organize as well as participate in various conferences and programmes related to Sustainable Development Goals.

Amity University is always at the forefront on Humanitarian responses to disasters caused due to unforeseen consequences. Covid 19 was such an unforeseen emergency which arose as a pandemic. The Volunteers working under Unnat Bharat Abhiyan and other NCC Units helped the villagers sustain their Hunger through distribution of Food Packets. During the lockdown period, food packets were distributed to villagers of Chak, Gunavta, Kant, Achrol and to MGNREGA labour. The distribution was done in three phases on 5th, 6th and 9th May 2020. 200 packets were



distributed on 5th May, 500 on 6th May and 225 on 9th May 2020. Poori, Potato vegetable and pickle was distributed on 5th and 6th May. On 9th Vegetable Biryani packets were distributed. Directors and faculties were a part of the distributing committee.
