


Figure 2: Caption of Slide 2




Figure 1: Crop science division




Figure 2: Growth of Bayer company as revealed by data





Figure 5: Crop Improvement Techniques Used at Bayer crop Science.


- practice would be associated with an improvement in mental health during the pandemic. The Webinar created opportunities for better lives for many.






Figure 2: Caption of whole event with speaker 1








Figure1: Caption of slides1




Figure 2: Caption of Slide 2




Figure 3: Caption of Slide 3

Tech from Indian Institute of Technology, Bombay in Control Systems and the Bachelor's degree from University of Mumbai in Electronics Engineering. His PhD and early post-graduate work were focused on restoring arm and hand movements in patients paralyzed by stroke and spinal cord injury, where he developed a novel brain-machine interface (BMI) algorithm to decode motor intentions of paralyzed patients directly from their brain activity using EEG. This paved the way for a clinical trial to determine the clinical efficacy of BMI-controlled exoskeleton for stroke rehabilitation. Later on, he conducted research in implanted BMIs and wearable neurostimulation devices for stimulating the peripheral nerves, in order to restore hand movements in tetraplegic patients.

Presently, Dr. Bhagat is the founder of Neuralaxy LLC, an early stage company that focuses on developing open-source neurotechnology's. He has also received funding from Dept. of Science & Tech. under the Nidhi Prayas program and he is working with SCTIMST, Trivandrum to develop a wearable hand rehabilitation device for stroke patients. Dr. Bhagat also holds an adjunct faculty position in the Dept of Physical Medicine & Rehabilitation, University of Texas Health Science Center.




Figure 1: Caption of slides 1




Figure 2: Caption of Slide 2




Figure 3: Caption of Slide 3




Figure 4: Caption of Slide 4

AMITY CENTRE FOR OCEAN-ATMOSPHERIC SCIENCE & TECHNOLOGY (AMITY COAST)

Amity COAST is celebrating World Meteorological Day on 23 March 2022. The proposed theme of World Meteorological Day this year is "Early Warning and Early Action: Hydrometeorological and Climate Information for Disaster Risk Reduction".

It is well known that Impact-based early warnings to the public are vital to save lives and livelihoods. Being prepared and able to act at the right time, in the right place, can save many lives and protect the livelihoods of communities everywhere. Dr. S.H.M. Fakhruddin, Technical Director, Disaster Risk Reduction and Climate Resilience at Tonkin + Taylor, Auckland, New Zealand has delivered a talk on the above theme.

Dr. S.H.M. Fakhruddin presented a brief overview of early warning systems (EWS) and their importance for both the national and global disaster risk reduction (DRR). He emphasized further the need for considering local to global scale while developing early warning systems to reduce disaster risks, with special attention to the regions more vulnerable to climate change. While presenting, Dr. Fakhruddin devoted substantial amount of time in explaining multihazard early warning system, early warning problems, warning messaging, utilizing an example of hazard forecasting, and a framework for weather and climate data integration.

Dr. Fakhruddin elaborated on the potential advantages of early warning system forming a major component of disaster risk reduction. EWS could help preventing loss of life and reducing the economic impact of natural hazards. Moreover, increasing the availability of multi-hazard early warning systems and disaster risk information is one of seven global targets set forth by the Sendai Framework for Disaster Risk Reduction 2015-2030.

While presenting, he focused on the need of risk knowledge and emphasized the interplay of vulnerability at a specific location poses a greater risk. Further, he elaborated risk assessments require systematic data collection and analysis in addition to considering dynamic nature of hazards and vulnerabilities that may result from human induced activities such as urbanization, land use change, environmental degradation, and anthropogenic climate change. He suggested that assessment methods and maps can help to motivate individuals, prioritize the need for installing early warning systems, and employ prevention and response plans to counter direct catastrophe.

The EWS's services are at the heart of reducing disaster risk. A solid scientific foundation is a must for anticipating and forecasting natural hazards causing danger. Also a dependable forecasting and warning system that must operate 24-hours a day is required. To generate accurate warnings in a timely manner, a continuous monitoring of hazard factors and precursors is essentially required. Wherever practical, warning systems for distinct dangers should be coordinated to take advantage of shared institutional, procedural, and communication networks.


Those who are at risk must receive timely warnings. Clear signal with simple and practical information is essential for prompt response that should help in protecting lives and livelihoods. Communication networks at the regional, national, and neighborhood levels must be determined ahead of time, and suitable authoritative voices must be developed. Multiple communication channels must be used to guarantee that as many individuals as possible are alerted, to prevent any one route from failing, and to emphasize the warning message.

Communities must be aware of natural hazards prone to their geographic region, respect the warning system, and know how to respond. Education and planning programs are extremely important in this regard. It's also critical to have crisis management plans in place that have thoroughly been practiced and tested. The community should be well-informed on safe behavior practices, available evacuation plans, and on reducing property damage and life loss in the event of a natural hazard.

Whenever possible, EWS should connect all hazard-based systems. If systems and operational activities are built and maintained within a multifunctional framework that considers all threats and end-user needs, economies of scale, sustainability, and efficiency can be improved.

Multi-hazard early warning systems (EWS) will also be activated more frequently than single-hazard early warning systems, resulting in higher functionality and reliability for dangerous high-intensity rare phenomenon such as tsunamis. Multi-hazard systems also assist the public in better understanding the variety of dangers they may face, as well as reinforcing desired preparedness and warning response behaviors.

Dr. Fakhruddin concluded his lecture by emphasizing the importance of developing a people-centric early warning system to empower individuals and communities at disaster risk.




Image 1:Poster of the Event: Circulated Online/On Social Media




Image1: Poster of the event; Circulated online/On Social Media







He expressed his concern about almost total dependence in the era of pandemic, which affects the very purpose of foreign language pedagogy. He also identified the gradual shifting of the focus on learners' autonomy, which makes learning less expensive and easier. He also warned the listeners of the threat of misuse by way of looking for solutions to assignments available online and thus defeating the very objective of learning in many cases. He referred to the all-time relevant and famous German Philosopher of the Enlightenment period Immanuel Kant, who encouraged the world to be wise und trust one's own understanding – the motto of Enlightenment.

- 4. The guest speaker has been serving an expert who is registered patent and trade mark consultant and certified lead auditor of Bureau of Indian Standards (BIS). He was looked for through a professional colleague from southern India.
- 5. Students from Amity Law School, faculties and students from various Institutions attended the webinar. 191 people in all attended the webinar.
- 6. The importance of Intellectual property rights along with various facets were discussed in the webinar by the subject expert. Salient points covered by the speaker were:

In regard to the mission, it can be thought of that the expert can organize session with students in the University; since, he is registered patent and trade mark consultant and certified lead auditor of Bureau of Indian Standards (BIS) and as he is inclined towards academics. It is left upon the consent of authorities. Even a long-term association can be developed with him.

Report on Earth Day (April 22nd, 2021) celebrations by the Center for Ocean-Atmospheric Science & Technology (COAST), Amity University Rajasthan

Earth Day 2021 was celebrated in Amity University Rajasthan, with full vigor and enthusiasm to understand the current challenges and potential solutions to restore our mother Earth for sustainable development and growth of all living beings. Due to pandemic (COVID-2019), Earth Day 2021 was organized online a guest lecture by an eminent scientist of the country, Dr. Atul Kumar Sahai, Scientist-G at the Indian Institute of Tropical Meteorology (IITM), Pune. Dr. Sahai graced the occasion by delivering a lecture via an online platform on the "Role of MoES in Enhancing Water Security over India". Before the talk started, Prof. (Dr.) P.V.S. Raju, Director of the Center (COAST), welcomed and introduced Dr. Sahai to all the participants.

Dr. Sahai emphasized the current global scenario of water security and associated crisis and how MoES (ministry of Earth Sciences, India) is countering the challenge of water-related issues in the country, especially in the light of climate change. Further, elaborated the role of water in the socioeconomic growth, environmental, and political perspective of the country. Dr. Sahai enlightened us on the potential causes of water security such as increasing water demand due to population increase and industrialization, degrading water quality because of human intervention, natural causes such as monsoon patterns in India, choice of agricultural practices (growing cash crops versus food crops), human-induced deforestation, and other natural and anthropogenic causes of declining water availability. Dr. Sahai cited the reports from Niti Aayog (2018) suggesting India is on the verge of facing the worse water crisis ever. The Niti Aayog report predicts that because of increasing population demand for food production and industrial setup, our water resources will be under immense pressure as groundwater withdrawal has already been at threatening increasing levels in northwestern states (e.g., Punjab, Haryana, and Rajasthan) in conjunction with declining recharge levels due to lack of monsoon rains (causing rivers running dry) or increasing levels of impermeable surfaces in urban developments.

To address the alarming issue of water security in India, Dr. Sahai outlined the plans by the MoES and other initiatives taken by locals to the Government of India level. He presented examples from ancient India where communities were more responsible and visionary in protecting and preserving our most important natural resource -Water. For example, Kundi systems in Rajasthan, Zings in Ladakh, Guls in Himalayan region, Ahar Pynes in South Bihar, Bamboo drip irrigation in Meghalaya, Madakas in Karnataka and Kerala, and Cascade tank methods in Tamil Nadu were a few traditional methods of rainwater harvesting that were actually originated from a scientific mindset of those communities. The need of the hour is to think and apply such techniques and encourage the population to innovate more for the future to preserve and protect water for our sustainable future. Dr. Sahai further emphasized the need to harvest rainwater, to encourage microirrigation and crop diversification, to utilize nature's support in cultivating organic produces, to recycle wastewater into the agricultural fields, and managing aquifer recharge to increase groundwater levels that should be considered as major action plans to counter increasing water deficit in the country.

Dr. Sahai further elaborated the initiatives taken up by the Government of India such as the Groundwater Bill 2017, Namami Gange Scheme to protect and clean River Ganga by human efforts, and by encouraging public-private partnership (by giving incentives to private industries). MoES, a Govt of India functionary, is also contributing by producing and delivering science-based hydro-meteorological and climate information to the community and other interested stakeholders.

Dr. Sahai elaborated on the role and tasks completed by MoES in imparting regular information on monsoonal patterns for decades. He further emphasized that MoES has successfully been able to predict monsoonal patterns over many years and has been instrumental in predicting extreme rainfall events over many places in India. The information produced by MoES should be taken into account with full confidence and must help in managing our water securities. Dr. Sahai concluded that prioritizing the need for rainwater harvesting, judicious consumptive uses of water resources, and public-private collaborative approaches are the key to counter water security issues in India.

Finally, Dr. Sahai responded to a few questions or concerns raised by the participants on the role of MoES in tackling water-related issues.

Before signing off the meeting, Prof. (Dr.) P.V.S. Raju delivered the vote of thanks to Dr. A.K. Sahai, who enlightened all the participants with great knowledge and information on current and upcoming challenges of water-related issues in the country and discussed few potential solutions to attack the problem with confidence. Dr. Raju take this opportunity to place his sincere thanks to Hon'ble Chancellor Sir, Dr. Aseem Chauhan for his constant Support and help. He also thank Prof. Amit Jain, Pro Vice Chancellor, AUR for his encouragement to organizing this event.

Earth Day 2021 was concluded with an increased level of understanding about our most precious and most wasted natural resource -Water. 






EXTORTION

Definition: As per section 383 IPC

Whoever intentionally puts any person in fear of any injury to that person, or to any other, and thereby dishonestly induces the person so put in fear to deliver to any property or valuable security, or anything signed or sealed which may be converted into a valuable security, commits "extortion".

Illustrations

- (a) A threatens to publish a defamatory libel concerning Z unless Z give him money. He thus induces Z to give him money. A has committed extortion.
- (b) A threatens Z that he will keep Z's child in wrongful confinement, unless Z will sign and deliver to A promissory note binding Z to pay certain monies to A. Z signs and delivers the note. A has committed extortion.
- (c) A threatens to send club-men to plough up Z's field unless Z will sign and deliver to B bond binding Z under a penalty to deliver certain produce to B, and thereby induces Z to sing and deliver the bond. A has committed








Figure2: Caption of Guest Speaker




Figure 3: Caption of whole event with participant

AMITY CENTRE FOR OCEAN-ATMOSPHERIC SCIENCE & TECHNOLOGY (AMITY COAST)

Topic: Remote Sensing Applications: Indian Scenario

Amity COAST, organised a guest lecture on 26th of February, 2020 which was delivered by Dr. P.C. Joshi. The title of the talk was: "Remote Sensing Applications: Indian Scenario". Dr. Joshi has been a part of Space Application Centre, ISRO, Ahmedabad, where he has been working closely with the developing applications to read and use the satellite data.

Prof. (Dr.) P.V.S Raju introduced and welcomed our speaker. There after the speaker interacted with the students present and got to know the area which they are presently working. Dr. P.C. Joshi was to introduce and explain students about Remote sensing, its working and application. An introduction was given on the basic concepts namely- Electromagnetic Induction, Plank's law of black body radiation, electromagnetic spectrum of sun and earth, etc. This helped students to revisit the fundamentals needed further in lecture.

Dr. Joshi briefed about types of satellites and orbits along with the types of sensors. He then presented the evolution of Indian Meteorological satellites i.e. from Bhaskara in 1979 to INSAT 2013 and its use in earth observations systems for atmosphere and ocean monitoring. Outputs from INSAT and Kalpana satellites were demonstrated. He also explained what type of satellite can be used for information and warning system for disasters like Cyclones, Tsunami, etc.

Further, Dr. Joshi informed the students about SMART Programme by ISRO which would help them to get opportunities for research and training.

AMITY CENTRE FOR OCEAN-ATMOSPHERIC SCIENCE & TECHNOLOGY (AMITY COAST)

Amity COAST organized online webinar on Meteorological Applications in Renewable energy sources on 1 July 2020. Dr. Raghavendra Ashrit Scientist F, National Centre for Medium Range Weather Forecast (NCMRWF) Noida and Mr. Shushant Kumar Scientist, NCMRWF delivered a talk on Meteorological Applications in Renewable energy sources. They emphasised the diverse requirements in renewable energy sector for meteorological services particularly, planning for setup Renewable Energy site, the first consideration is the long-term expected production of the facility. These include assessments of seasonal wind or irradiance patterns and their interannual variability. Efficient power-grid management and load balancing mainly depend on the accurate power and demand forecasts. Electricity produced by renewable energy sources are derived from atmosphere which are highly variable in space and time. Meteorological services at the later stage, is useful to support decision-making for both day-to-day operations and for longer-term strategic planning.

Dr. Ashrit also deliberated the efficient power-grid management and load balancing and demand forecasts. As of March 2020, the installed capacity of wind power in India is 38GW whereas solar power capacity is 34 GW. This is likely to be increased to 60GW and 100GW by 2022. The increase in variable RE sources into the grid implies a burgeoning need to forecast the resource on several scales. In wind and solar energy sectors, wind and solar irradiance forecasts are crucial. The wind and solar power forecasting methods, which are primarily based on statistical algorithms, use farm observations (in-situ or remotely sensed) but have insufficient accuracy beyond a few hours. High resolution Numerical weather prediction (NWP) models with state of art data assimilation techniques are important tools for farm-scale forecasts. Further, these NWP models-based weather forecast products at different time-scale are suitable for load forecasting. Seasonal forecasts are useful for long term planning of fuel suppliers, extended range prediction (for a week to few months) for maintenance and fuel transport and short term (up to a week) for day to operation and power trading. To avoid power outages due to severe weather events like storm, polar vortex, cyclones etc., meteorological services can play a crucial role.

Dr. Sushant Kumar talked about NCMRWF NWP modeling system is used in real time seamless prediction. The forecasting at different scales (spatial and temporal) is carried out using 12km (large and synoptic scale), 4km and 1.5km (mesoscale) and 60km (coupled model) model configurations. The high-resolution models allow for realistic representation of the local terrain and land use characteristics and their interaction with near surface wind flow. These

forecast products are used for prediction of day-ahead, short (72hrs) and medium (7days) range and extended range RE generation. Furthermore, these forecast products can also be directly used for load/demand forecasting to have efficient transmission and distribution of power, depending on the evolving weather conditions (winds, temperature, humidity and rainfall) in short and medium range and power trading. A high-resolution regional reanalysis dataset produced at NCMRWF (IMDAA) can be used at different stages of resource assessment.

They were impressed with our water usage policy and suggested to construct recharge pit nearby to address the waterlogging problem faced at the main entrance gate during monsoon season.
