7.1.1 ANNUAL GENDER SENSITIZATION ACTION PLAN

Amity University Rajasthan strongly believes in and practices gender equality in all its academic, administrative, and social functions. The university is committed to offering a bias-free supportive environment to its students and staff with an inclusive approach. Through various curricular and cocurricular-based activities; efforts are made not only to sensitize university staff and students but neighbouring communities also, on the key areas related to gender equality and to bring out a change in attitudes through debate, discussion, and dialogue.



Strategic approach towards implementing Gender Equality at Amity University Rajasthan

The Gender Cell of Amity University Rajasthan strives towards activities and programs to create a gender-aware and gender-just environment within the campus. At the same time, it contributes to preparing and capacitating young people as 'Gender Champions' with appropriate perspectives, attitudes, and skills to work towards creating gender-just spaces where all genders are treated with dignity and justice.

Following are the key areas addressed by the Gender Cell, Amity University Rajasthan:

- 1. Conducting activities to sensitize the university members towards issues related to gender.
- 2. Providing support and creating a conducive environment for sharing anxieties, problems, and difficulties faced by university members on account of gender and sexuality through personalized counselling and quick complaint redressal.
- 3. Redressal of the complaints related to sexual harassment, violence, discrimination, and ragging against the member so the university, and submission of the appropriate recommendations to the higher authorities.
- 4. Implementation of guidelines issued by UGC relating to addressing the issues of sexual harassment, violence, discrimination, and ragging against the members of the university.
- 5. Reviewing and recommending the policies to ensure the safety, freedom and security of women within the university campus; along with the opportunity to lead, participate and benefit from equal opportunity and access to the resources with the university.
- 6. Ensuring a decent, supportive, healthy, and dignified work environment for women staff of the university.
- 7. Sensitizing Gender champions and enabling them to create awareness through workshops and other activities towards creating a gender-bias-free community.



POLICY ON GENDER EQUITY

Amity University Rajasthan strives to inculcate a zero-tolerance towards all forms of discrimination and prohibits gender stereotyping and/or bias. To enforce this philosophy, Amity University Rajasthan in all its affairs will ensure gender equity and gender sensitivity along with equal opportunity for all genders, especially the marginalized. The policy will be known as the AUR Policy for Gender Equity. The university will take regular initiatives and sensitization drives to ensure that the employees and students at the university ensure the implementation of a gender bias-free approach in all their endeavors in and outside the university, in letter and spirit.

Objectives of the Policy:

- To ensure the committed contribution towards the national commitment to implement gender equity.
- To inculcate a positive and inclusive approach towards people of different gender and sexual orientation.
- iii. To ensure equal opportunity to everyone without any discrimination on the basis of gender.
- iv. To sensitize the community towards the acceptance, respect, diversity ane intersectionality of marginalized genders.
- v. To ensure the implementation of this policy in letter and spirit.

Definitions:

- i. Gender: The sexual classification that a person identifies him/her with.
- ii. Equity: Fair and equal treatment for all based upon their needs, qualification, intellectual abilities, and skills in terms of rights, benefits, obligations, and opportunities.
- Bias: Any conscious and/or unconscious awareness/ preference that impacts the behavior/ attitude/ approach towards the people.
- Employee: Any person who is a current employee of the University, and includes permanent, full-time, part-time, and contracted staff.
- v. Student: Any person registered at Amity University Rajasthan for academic purposes.
- vi. Resources: Physical resources as well as resources in terms of guidance, online resources, academic resources
- vii. Facilities: All infrastructural facilities and educational facilities provided by the University

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Areas of Relevance:

The Policy will be applicable to the activities relating to Admissions, Career Development and Promotion, Recruitment, Participation in University Governance, Research, Leadership Opportunity, Academic Development and Support, Teacher Student Relationship, Research, Training and Teaching, Access to the University Facilities and Resources and Participation in University Affairs/Curricular/ Extra-Curricular/Co-Curricular activities. In addition to these, the policy will also be applicable to any and every area that is identified as a matter of significance with regard to gender equity.

To ensure the implementation of Gender Equity in all its endeavors, Amity University Rajasthan is committed to ensure the implementation of the following guidelines:

- i. The university will set up an Internal Complaint Committee (ICC) for the redressal of complaints regarding gender discrimination, bias, or insensitive behavior. The committee will be formed according to the prescribed guidelines by UGC and an annual report of the same would be compiled.
- The university will organize various events and training programs to sensitize its stakeholders toward the importance of gender equity.
- iii. Gender stereotyping will be prohibited. All forms of bias and discrimination including unconscious bias against women will not be tolerated.
- iv. Gender equity will be practiced in all recruitment, training, selection of various committees, and/or career progression opportunity for leadership; so that equal representation of men and women could be ensured.
- v. No gender-based discrimination will be practiced in the opportunities relating to research, rewards, or academic opportunities. Appropriate and continued measures would be taken to motivate the marginalized section to participate in the areas where they are underrepresented.
- vi. No student will be denied admission on the grounds of gender.
- vii. Gender sensitivity will be employed in the design of the curriculum and wherever applicable a gender-specific analysis will be included in all disciplines.
- viii. In evaluating students, a policy of fair treatment of male and female students alike will be employed.
- ix. A gender-sensitive approach will be undertaken while organizing any event or program, including but not limited to meetings and conferences, fest, seminars, etc.
- x. The Guidelines for the Gender Champions (GC) Programme vide OM No.4-2/2014-WW dated
 3 June 2015 of the Ministry of Women & Child Development, Government will be implemented in letter and spirit.
- xi. All the employees and the students will necessarily undergo gender awareness and sensitivity





training at least once a year.

- xii. Gender-sensitive approaches will be practiced in teaching and learning processes across disciplines.
- xiii. Women-specific infrastructure facilities will be provided on campuses. Regular upgrading of the facilities would be done as per the need of women at the university. In the creation of new development, renovation of existing infrastructure, and other resources, women-specific needs will be addressed.
- xiv. UGC's 'Saksham' Measures for Ensuring the Safety of Women and Programmes for Gender Sensitization on Campuses will be followed. 18. Proactive measures will be undertaken to facilitate and encourage active participation of women students and employees in all activities of the University.

Grievance Redressal:

Any grievance in contrast with the practice of Gender Equity at Amity University Rajasthan would be reported to Internal Complaint Committee (ICC) and would be subject to redressal as per the University Policy and any other policy/law prescribed by the national agency, depending upon the subject of the complaint.

6. Cartoon making- A carton can be made depicting the given theme.

The submission should also include a small write up (not more than 100 words), explaining your idea in the composition.

Mode of submission:

The submission should include the scanned copy (pdf) of your composition along with its write up. The submissions have to be done on online mode before 7pm on 08.03.2021.

International Women's Day is all about unity, celebration, reflection, advocacy and action - whatever that looks like globally at a local level. But one thing is for sure, International Women's Day has been occurring for well over a century - and continues to grow from strength to strength.

Ms. Muskan Sharma initiated the discussion by expressing her opinion and she outlined the link between women equality and generation gap by stating the position of women in traditional and modern generation.

Ms. Drishti Sharma recounted the various global agenda for gender equality based on Beijing Declaration. She further introduced the Beijing Declaration and its action plans, by stating that it is unanimously adopted by 189 countries, as in its agenda for Women Empowerment.

Ms. Aayushi Agrawal discussed the experience of the women who are facing violence and she concluded by stating the harsh truth of today's world that women tolerate violence at different stages because they don't want to hamper their career and life.

Mr. Ajay Pareek mentioned that many challenges remain, and there is an ongoing need to ensure that adequate attention is given to the current issue to attain equality. As he concluded by stating that, "*This can only be achieved when the females and males stand on the same platform of opportunities*".

Ms. Yashika Vijay pointed out the various problems in the implementation of laws in our country. She expressively stated that, "*Laws are made but not followed up. Feminism is just not about equal position on work places but in little things of life.*"

Ms. Lata Ladrecha failed to agree with Ms. Yashika Vijay and as she critically stated that, "The space and position of a women has so far has drastically been improved since independence and a lot more has to be done. The changes though are slow and minute yet visible and impact full. Today, there are several of women who have reached to the pinnacle of success and the society has accepted their victory and position. In neutralising this gap and bringing equality the laws and policies has a vital role to play." She quoted the Indian constitution and various other acts such as Maternity Benefit Act, Equal Remuneration Act, Commission of Sati Act, Dowry Prohibition Act, etc and further she also took reference from Justice Verma Committee and cited landmark Court Legislation like Vishaka vs. State of Rajasthan, Laxmi vs. Union of India and Devika biswas vs. Union of Indi in context of her arguments.

Mr. Yash Johari highlighted the current issue by analyzing the laws related to women protection and he concluded by stating that, "...but looking at the bigger picture we see that there is almost no proper implementation of these laws..." he further contradict Ms. Lata ladrecha by mentioning the death of the victims like Priyanka reddy and Nirbhaya. He concluded by quoting Emma Watson, Actress - Feminism is about giving women choice. Feminism is not a stick with which to beat other women. It's about freedom, it's about liberation, it's about equality.

Ms. Deepti Meena concluded the session by acknowledging the contributions of the panellists and audience members and stated women empowerment may be expected that with a strong determination, commitment, and involvement of people and organisations with philanthropic motive and a rational outlook, the problem that women faced, can be solved and hurdled be overcome for promoting national rejuvenation and development.


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The events were organized by nodal teachers under the guidance of Gender Cell Amity University Rajasthan with whole hearted participation of the students from various streams. The Gender Champions Actively popularised the event for maximum participation and creating awareness.

Nominations were invited from every School of the university and screening was done on 2nd March 2020, for selecting the best participants to be showcased on the grand finale for celebration of international women's day.

The **moderator** for the panel was Prof. Vinita Agrawal, Chairperson- Gender Cell, Amity University Rajasthan.

He is known for his sessions on Problem Solving, Critical thinking and developing soft skills in a logical way. The Panel Discussion was initiated by the moderator on a very interesting note that "Why are we even having a discussion on Gender Equality?". The first panellist Dr. Veena Arora emphasized that the scenario is changing with various corporate sectors giving equal opportunities to women, giving an example of JCB where they have fixed a percentage as 35 for recruiting female candidates. She also contradicted that there are organizations who still do not recruit female candidates in the core technical sectors, keeping the gender bias even today. The second panellist Dr. Pramila Sanjaya elaborated upon the disparity which is evident in the society. The Government of India has initiated many schemes for women empowerment and to increase the income of women for their upliftment but in reality the

effect is not penetrating the masses and reaching to the grassroot level where the disparity is more apparent. Mr. Mukesh Vyas stressed upon the concept of practising Gender Equality rather than preaching it and he mentioned about practising it from one's own homes which is the fundamental unit of society. Prof. Vinay Sharma mentioned about the glass ceiling effect of gender inequality prevailing in Academics and research sectors. He specified special role of guide and mentors who can hand hold the candidate and motivate them to come with better ways to move ahead in their careers as well as balancing their responsibilities at home.
