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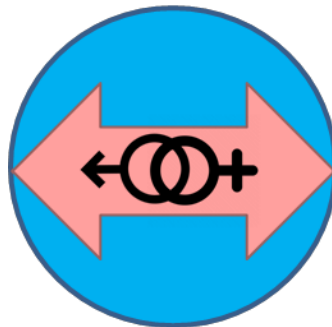

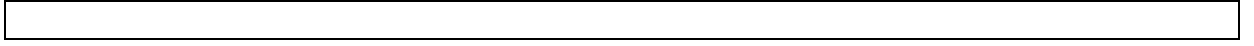
Future Scope of the Event:

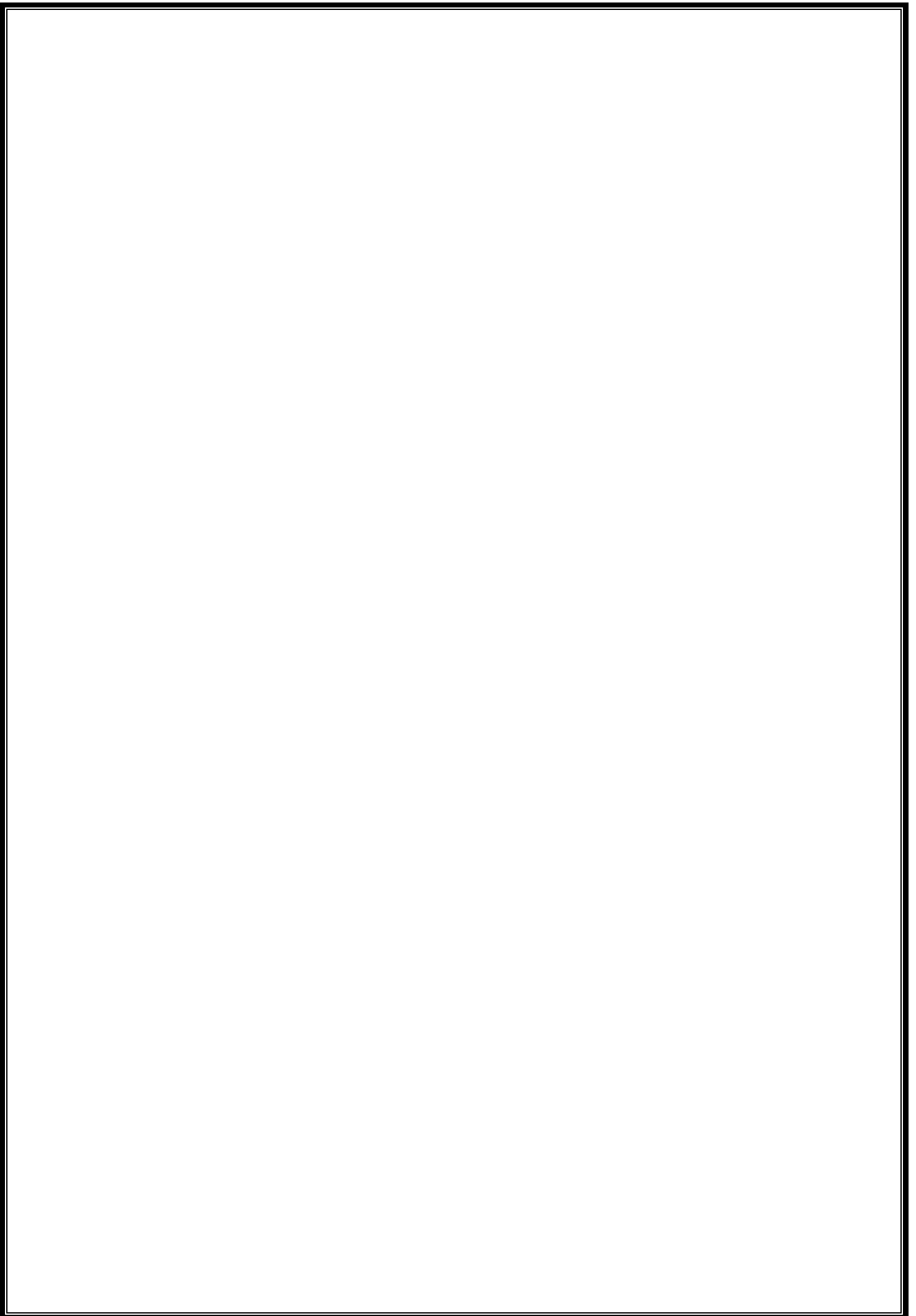

Ms. Deepti Meena as the moderator of the panel discussion welcomed participants and opened the event by briefly establishing a background for them.

International Women's Day (March 8) is a global day celebrating the social, economic, cultural and political achievements of women. The day also makes a call to action for accelerating gender parity.

No one government, NGO, charity, corporation, academic institution, women's network or media hub is solely responsible for International Women's Day. Many organizations declare an annual theme that supports their specific agenda or cause, and some of these are adopted more widely with relevance than others. International Women's Day is a collective day of global celebration and a call for gender parity.

International Women's Day is all about unity, celebration, reflection, advocacy and action - whatever that looks like globally at a local level. But nothing is for sure, International Women's Day has been occurring for well over a century - and continues to grow from strength to strength.

Ms. Muskan Sharma initiated the discussion by expressing her opinion and she outlined the link between women equality and generation gap by stating the role of women in traditional and modern generation.

Ms. Drishti Sharma recounted the various global agenda for gender equality based on Beijing Declaration. She further introduced the Beijing Declaration and its action plans, by stating that it is unanimously adopted by 189 countries, as its agenda for Women Empowerment.

Ms. Aayushi Agrawal discussed the experience of the women facing violence and she concluded that women face violence at different stages because they don't want to hamper their career and life.

Mr. Ajay Pareek mentioned that many challenges remain, and there is an ongoing need to ensure that adequate attention is given to the current issues to attain equality. As he concluded that we can only achieve when the females and males stand on the same platform of opportunities.

Ms. Yashika Vijay pointed out the various problems in the implementation of laws in our country. She said that gender discrimination is just not about equal position on work places but in little things of life.

Ms. Lata Ladrecha failed to agree with Ms. Yashika Vijay and as she stated that, "The space and position of a women has so far drastically been improved since independence and a lot more has to be done. The changes though are slow and minute yet visible and impact full. Today, there are several of women who have reached to the pinnacle of success and the society has accepted their victory and position. In neutralising this gap and bringing equality the laws and policies has a vital role to play. She quoted the Indian constitution and various other acts such as Maternity Benefit Act, Equal Remuneration Act, Commission of Sati Act, Dowry Prohibition Act, etc and further she also took reference from Justice Verma Committee and cited landmark Court Legislation like Vishaka vs. State of Rajasthan, Laxmi vs. Union of India and Devika biswas vs. Union of India in context of her arguments.

Mr. Yash Johari highlighted the current issue by analyzing the laws related to women. He stated that there is almost no proper implementation of these laws which further contradict Ms. Lata ladrecha by mentioning the death of the victims like Priyanka reddy and others. He concluded by quoting Emma Watson, Actress "Feminism is about giving women choice. Feminism is not a stick with which to beat other women. It's about freedom, it's about liberation, it's about equality."

Ms. Deepti Meena concluded the session by acknowledging the contributions of the panellists and audience members and stated that empowerment may be expected that with a strong determination, commitment, and involvement of people organisations with philanthropic motive and a rational outlook, the problem that women faced, can be solved and hurdle be overcome for promoting national rejuvenation and development.

She is a Member at Internal complaints committee for Prevention of sexual harassment at workplace- Department of Medical Health Family welfare, Chakrapani institute of Ayurveda, Some Export companies, Hindi grand academy, Bosch India Ltd, North western Railways and RDPL (Rajasthan Drugs and Pharmaceuticals private ltd; a Government of India Undertaking, Reliance and so on. Also 'Man' Advisor and Consultant SIDART- HSF programmes on Women Empowerment and Panchayat Strengthening for HSF, Munich. She is an Executive Committee member at the Rajasthan Chapter of Indian Society for Training and Development (ISTD). She has more than three decades of Indian Government service both at the policy planning, administration monitoring and grass root level implementation level in Women and Child Development, Rural Development and Panchayati Raj.

He is Start-up enthusiast, Technology & Management Consultant, Career Counselor and an Entrepreneur - running his venture with Profit from inception, having 5 years of entrepreneurial experience after working for 15 years in Industry in Manufacturing, Marketing and IT Services Sector. He has done his MBA (Marketing) from Nirma University and he is a B.E. (Electronics) (Gold Medalist) from Rajasthan University. The first panellist Dr. Veena Arora emphasized that the scenario is changing with various sectors giving equal opportunities to women, giving an example of JCB where they have fixed a percentage as 35 for recruiting female candidates. She also contradicted there are organizations who still do not recruit female candidates in the core technical jobs, keeping the gender bias even today. The second panellist Dr. Pramila Sanjaya elaborated the disparity which is evident in the society. The Government of India has initiated many schemes for women empowerment and to increase the income of women for their upliftment but in reality the

effect is not penetrating the masses and reaching to the ground level where the disparity is more apparent. Mr. Mukesh Vyas stressed upon the concept of practising Gender Equality rather than preaching it and he mentioned about practicing it from one's own homes which is the fundamental unit of society. Prof. Vinay Sharma talked about the glass ceiling effect of gender inequality prevailing in Academics and research sector. He specified special role of guide and mentors who can hand hold the candidate and direct them to come with better ways to move ahead in their careers as well as balance their responsibilities at home.

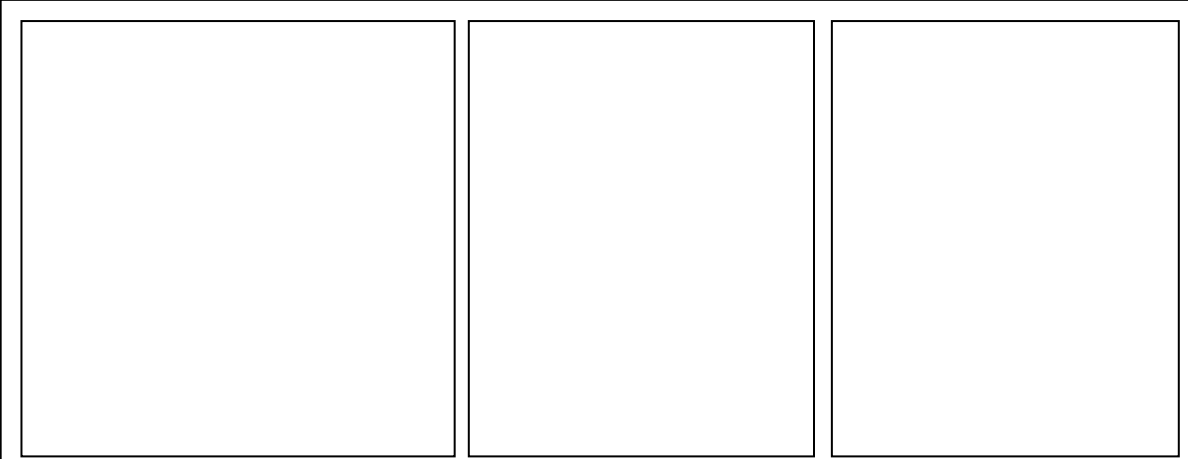

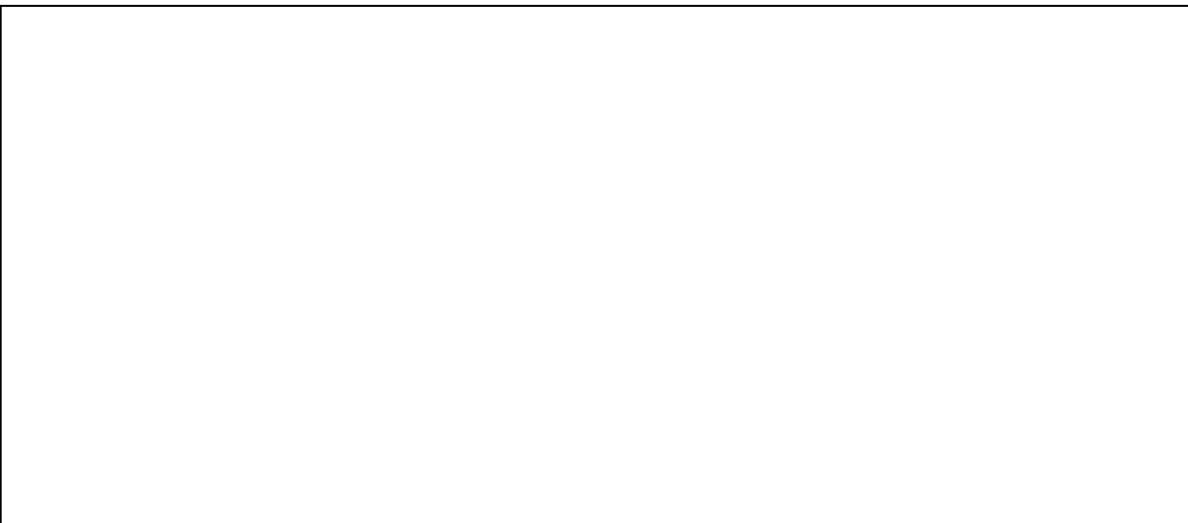
