

7.1.8 Institutional efforts/initiatives providing an inclusive environment i.e., tolerance and harmony towards cultural, regional, linguistic, communal, socio-economic and such other diversities

Amity University Rajasthan provides an inclusive environment for everyone with tolerance and harmony towards cultural, regional, linguistic, communal socio-economic and other diversities. The University encourages the students to organize and participate in various programs organized by the colleges, inter-collegiate activities, university and other Government or non-government organizations to make them sensitized towards cultural, regional, linguistic, communal, and socio-economic diversities. To build a nation of youth who are noble in their attitude and morally responsible. The university organizes and conducts several activities to build and promote an environment of ethical, cultural, and spiritual values among the students and staff. Different sports activities like annual sports fest 'Sangathan' and 'Shauryamanthan' and AUR techno-cultural fest and activities are organized not only to promote harmony towards each other but also showcasing creativity, talent, scientific aptitude, and innovations. Students from various regional and cultural backgrounds participate in such programs and present their regional or cultural folk songs and dances.

To cultivate the emotional and patriotic feelings among the students, the faculty and staff members, commemorative days like Independence Day, Republic Day, Women's Day, IDY, Cancer Day, AIDS Day along with many regional festivals like are celebrated on the campus with the initiative and support of the management for not only recreation and amusement but also to generate the feeling of oneness, social harmony among people of different racial and cultural backgrounds. The University students, teachers and staff jointly celebrate the cultural and regional festivals, like Fresher and farewell Party, teacher's day, orientation program, Youth Day, Women's Day, Yoga Day.

There are active grievance redressal cells in the university like Student grievance redressal cell, Gender cell which deal with grievances without any racial or cultural biases. Motivational lectures from domain experts and eminent personalities are arranged for all-round development of the students for their personality development and to make them responsible citizens following the national values of social and communal harmony and national integration. Every year, NSS Units of university conduct social activities, community services, and awareness camps in nearby villages addressing various social issues impacting the lives of the people in the community viz-a-viz including social and



cultural values among the young students. The students participate in 'Prayas' and 'Umeed' NGO activities to render services to the society.

The institute also takes account of socio-economic diversities among the students and offers scholarships to the students from economically weaker sections. In addition to learning resources, cuisine and food habits, tourism sites and cultural programs of the states are shared extensively. To cater to the linguistic harmony, Hindi Divas is celebrated and diversified events like Essay Writing, poem recitation, Debates, webinars are conducted in Hindi, English, *and in foreign languages also*. Catering to Multilingualism: "Matribhasha Diwas" is celebrated, in which the students take part in calligraphy, singing and poetry competitions in their mother tongue. Several workshops are conducted by the language experts to bring in inclusivity. Amity School of Languages offers different foreign languages as credit courses (German, French, Spanish, English, and Chinese) to help make the students, global citizens.

AUR is mini India having a rich cultural mix of local students, and students and faculties from different regions and States from India and abroad also. The University strongly advocates and promotes the concept of global citizenship, equal opportunities and balanced representation in building livable society. AUR is thus a home away from home for all the students from remote areas and reflects Unity in Diversity.

UNNAT BHARAT ABHIYAN (UBA)

Unnat Bharat Abhiyan (UBA), a flagship program of Ministry of Education, Government of India aims to enable higher educational institutions to work with people of rural India in identifying development challenges and evolving appropriate solutions for accelerating sustainable growth. It also aims to create a virtuous circle between society and an inclusive academic system by providing knowledge and practices for emerging professions and to upgrade the capabilities of both the public and private sectors in responding to the development needs of rural India. Unnat Bharat Abhiyan is inspired by the vision of transformational change in rural development processes by leveraging knowledge institutions to help build the architecture of an inclusive India. Unnat Bharat Abhiyan at Amity University Rajasthan organized 15 events during the period 2020-2022. University has adopted 5 nearby villages to take up their social and governance-related issues and provide expert lectures, workshops and activities related to sanitation, organic farming, possible animal husbandry, and awareness of the weather forecast to help in the development of village life. Through this initiative, students examine the social challenges / problems, assess the needs of the community/ society, evaluate previously implemented projects



and think of further solutions.



NATIONAL SERVICE SCHEME

The National Service Scheme (NSS) is a government-sponsored public service program conducted by the Department of Youth affairs and Sports of Govt. of India. It provides opportunity to the student youth of 11th & 12th Class of schools at +2 Board level and student youth of Technical Institution, Graduate & Postgraduate at colleges and University level of India to take part in various government led community service activities & programmes. Amity University Rajasthan was granted five self-financed units on June 03, 2015. Since then, around 500 students have been registered as NSS volunteers. NSS Units conduct several programs like swachchta abhiyaan, run for unity, Fit India Movement, Tree Plantation Drive and many other activities within the campus and nearby villages for the benefit of the community.

NSS Units of AUR conduct several programs which benefit the students as well as community in which students work. The motto of National Service Scheme is "Not me but you". The aims and objectives of NSS are 1) Understand the community in which they work 2) Understand themselves in relation to their community 3) Identity the needs and problems of the community and involve them in problem solving process 4) Develop among themselves a sense of social and civic responsibility 5) Utilize their knowledge in finding practical solution to individual and community problems 6) Develop competence required for



group living and sharing of responsibilities 7) Gain sills in mobilizing community participation 8) Acquire leadership qualities and democratic attitude 9) Develop capacity to meet emergencies and natural disasters 10) Practice national integration and social harmony.

Under the "Regular Activities", students are expected to work as volunteers for a continuous period of two years, rendering community service for a minimum of 120 hours per annum (i.e. 240 hours over 2-year period). As per the fundamental principles of National Service Scheme, a volunteer is expected to remain in constant touch with the community. The nature of activities taken up under NSS continue to evolve in response to the needs of the community. An illustrative list of some of the activities undertaken under NSS is as follows: **Education-** adult literacy, pre-school education, continuing education of school dropouts, legal literacy, consumer awareness, programmes on eradication of social evils, etc. Health, Family Welfare and Nutrition- Immunisation, blood donation, health education, AIDS awareness, population education and family welfare programmes, working with people in nutrition programmes, provision of safe drinking water, life skill education, etc. Environment Conservation- Plantation of trees and their preservation/ upkeep, cleaning, and maintenance of streets, drains etc., construction of sanitary latrines, watershed management, soil conservation, etc. Social Service Programmes- Work in hospitals, institutions for disabled persons, orphanages, old-age homes, women welfare institutions, etc. Programmes for improving Status of Women- Awareness generation reg. women's rights, creating awareness among women reg. how they can contribute to the social and economic well-being of the community, imparting skill training to women wherever possible. Production-oriented Programmes-Working with people and teaching them about improved agricultural practices, soil testing, repair of agricultural machinery, assistance, and guidance in animal resource development, promoting small savings, assistance in procuring bank loans. Relief and Rehabilitation during Natural Calamities-Assisting and working with local authorities in rescue and relief operation, in distribution of rations, medicines, clothing, immunization and inoculation, etc.

A camp of 07 days' duration is conducted every year in the adopted area on a specific theme. Each student is required to participate in at least one Special Camp over 2- year period. The nature of activities taken up under NSS continue to evolve in response to the needs of the community. Special Camping forms an integral part of National Service Scheme. It has special appeal to the youth as it provides unique opportunities to the students for group living, collective experience sharing and constant interaction with community. Special camping Activities are organized generally on various developmental issues of national importance. Every year 50 percent of the volunteers of each NSS unit are expected to participate



in special camps which is of seven days duration. The NSS organized 53 events during the period of 2017 to 2022.

justice.





Amity University Rajasthan organized 47 Military Training Camps during the period 2017 to 2022 and trained more than 4000 undergraduate and post graduate students.






NATIONAL CADET CORPS



Finances


