A Amity University Rajasthan was established on October 21, 2007 by promulgation of an Ordinance which later became an Act (Act No 8 of 2008) of Legislature of the State of Rajasthan. Sponsoring Body of Amity University Rajasthan is Ritnand Balved Education Foundation (RBEF), New Delhi, a society registered in 1986 under the Societies Registration Act, 1860.

RBEF is engaged in the field of education for the last 35 years and is running a number of educational institutions under the name of 'Amity Institutions' which are imparting quality education in the disciplines like Management, Engineering, Biotechnology, Law, Journalism, Communication, Insurance, IT, Fashion Designing, Nano-Technology, Behavioral Science, Fine Arts etc.

1.1 ACADEMIC PROGRAMMES & FACULTY

Academic programs at Amity University Rajasthan (AUR) cover a wide range of disciplines. The University offers postgraduate and undergraduate degrees in over 72 programs ranging from traditional courses in Engineering, Architecture, Management, Mass Communication, Law, to unique programs in Microbial Technology, Ocean Atmospheric Science and Technology and Converging Technologies, to name a few.

AUR is fortunate to have more than 500 qualified and dedicated faculty as well as staff members, and also engages about 50 distinguished visiting members of faculty to provide quality education.

1.4 RESEARCH AND DEVELOPMENT ACTIVITIES

Right from its inception, Amity University Rajasthan has given greater thrust to Research & Innovation in order to be in the forefront of the National vision of developed India. The University has not only major infrastructure in the form of modern buildings, state of the art laboratories, auditoriums, well equipped library, student's hostels but also continuously adds equipment & facilities to keep pace with the ever-changing requirements and dynamic environment.

The university has filed 9 patents, 04 patents have been published, and 01 patent has been granted during the Academic Year 2020-21. The University this year has to its credit more than 231 publications in refereed journals and in peer reviewed proceedings of the national and international conferences along with 215 scopus listed papers. University has been awarded research project with funds worth Rs. 49,26,339/- from state and central govt. agencies during the year.

University has currently more than 497 registered Ph. D. scholars, each of them have co-guides from other universities, R&D organizations, corporate, and other institutions of repute to ensure quality.

Our faculty members are also working in collaboration with leading research institutes like AIIMS-Delhi, CIRG-ICAR Mathura, PGI-Chandigarh, Bombay Medical College, IITs, ICMR, India Meteorological Department to name a few.

1.5 IMPACT OF COVID-19 PANDEMIC

The nationwide lockdown imposed on 23/03/2020 to limit movement of the population of India as a preventive measure against the COVID-19 pandemic. The lockdown restricted people from stepping out of their homes and as a result services of educational institutions were

also suspended. Social distancing being the only way to combat COVID-19 and curb the spread of dreaded disease, the students in institutions almost all over the world, were required to stay at home for prolonged duration.

Amity University Rajasthan has been among the pioneers in country to implement an Online learning system to ensure continuous learning. Removing the barrier of geographical boundaries and location, an Online Learning system also helped to develop a sense of responsibility and discipline amongst students. Amity University Rajasthan, Jaipur, was quick to respond and moved to online teaching and learning which helped students save precious time and kept them engaged in productive work.

As well Online teaching learning, examination and assessment also conducted Online. This was successfully executed by the university, which resulted in a very smooth conduct of the exam.

Prof. (Dr.) Rakesh Bhatnagar has joined as President (Vice-Chancellor) of Amity University Rajasthan, Jaipur and Senior Vice-President of Ritanand Balved Education Foundation, New Delhi on 10/05/2021.

Before this, Prof. Bhatnagar was the Vice-Chancellor of Banaras Hindu University, Vice-Chancellor of Kumaun University, Nainital and Professor in School of Biotechnology, Jawaharlal Nehru University, New Delhi.

Prof. Bhatnagar, after completion of his Ph.D. from the Department of Biochemistry, National Sugar Institute, Kanpur, moved to Freiburg University, Germany as Scientist

(Wiessenschaftliche Angestellter) followed by Medical Hospital, University of Caen, France as Visiting Assistant Professor; National Institute of Health, Bethesda, USA as Visiting Associate and United States Army Medical Research Institute of Infectious Diseases, USA as Senior NRC Associate. After returning to India Prof. Bhatnagar joined School of Biotechnology, Jawaharlal Nehru University as Associate Professor and subsequently became Professor.

Prof. Bhatnagar pioneered the teaching and research in Biotechnology at Jawaharlal Nehru University, the first of its kind in the country. He is well known for developing recombinant vaccine against anthrax, the technology of which has been transferred to the industry and the vaccine has successfully completed phase I and II human clinical trials. One of his significant contribution in the field of research and innovation has been the development of Drug Resistant TB Diagnostics in collaboration with one of the topmost Diagnostic Company.

Prof. Bhatnagar's research has been ranked 7th (The first six were from Pasteur Institute, Harvard Medical School, NIH and USAMRIID) in the anthrax research globally. Prof. Bhatnagar has more than 185 research papers to his credit which have received more than 5000 citations with 39 h-index and 115 i10-index. Prof. Bhatnagar is an elected Fellow of all three major Science Academies of India namely Indian National Science Academy, New Delhi; Indian Academy of Science, Bangalore; National Academy of Science, Allahabad, besides being J C Bose National Fellow. He has attracted research grants about Rs. 40 Crores from national and international funding agencies.

Prof. Bhatnagar has received several prestigious awards and recognitions, few of them are President's Award for Best Innovation by President of India; ICMR Award for Outstanding research work in the field of Immunology by Hon'ble Health Minister, GoI; All India Biotech Association Award; to name a few.

Prof. Bhatnagar has been a successful administrator and institution builder. He has served Jawaharlal Nehru University at various important positions like Chairperson and Dean of School of Biotechnology; Director of Advanced Instrumentation Research Facility; Director of Academic Staff College and Chairman of Intellectual Property Management Cell. He has created a world class state-of-the-art Biological Safety Laboratory Level III (BSL 3) in Jawaharlal Nehru University which is first of its kind in University system.

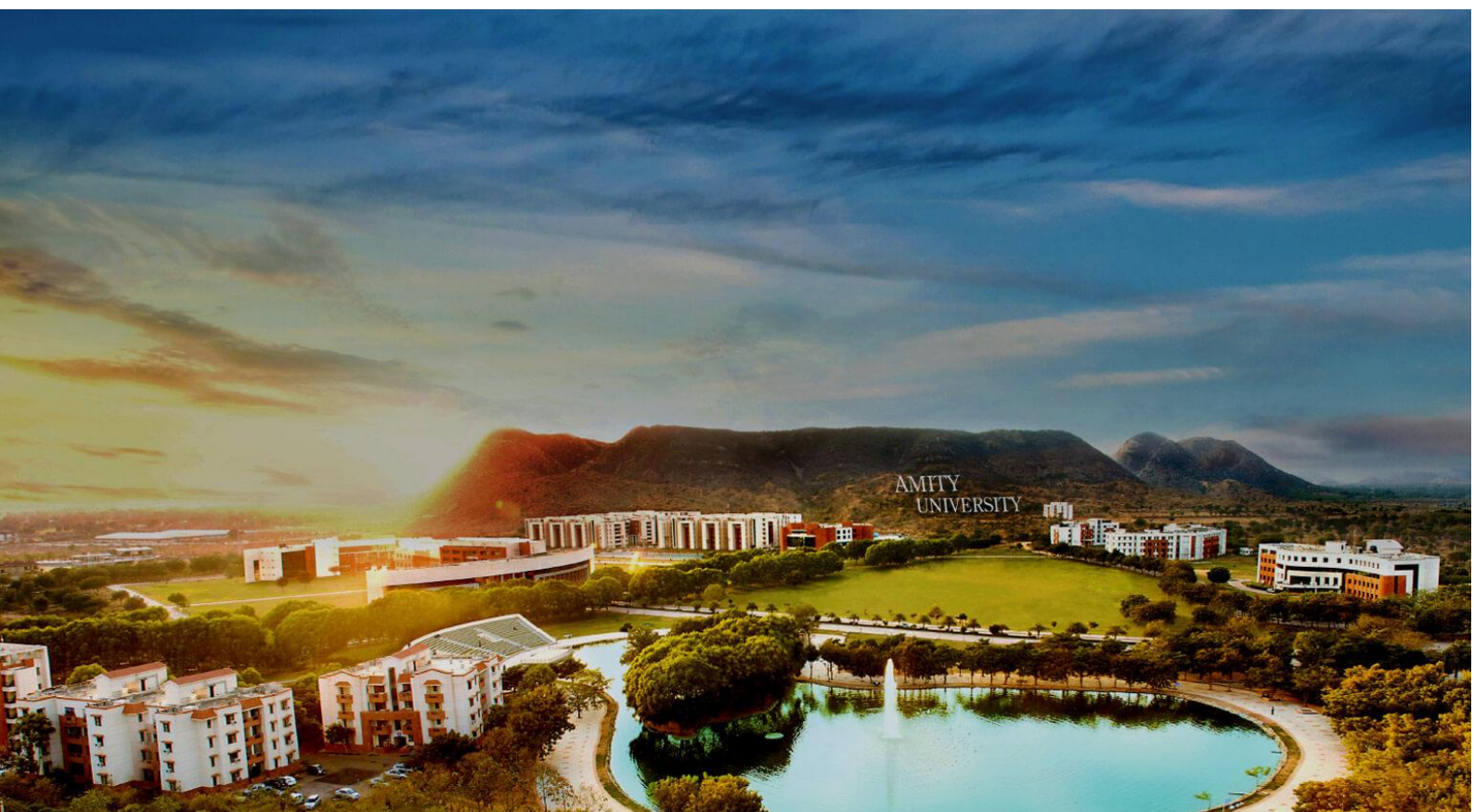

University Infrastructure and Set-up



Amity University Rajasthan is located on the Delhi-Jaipur Highway, a hi-tech and residential 152 acre campus, just outside of Jaipur towards Delhi. The University takes pride in its world class infrastructural facilities which have been scientifically and aesthetically designed for optimal use of the natural resources.

The world class infrastructure of AUR comprises of 5 Academic Blocks having spacious, well ventilated CRs/LTs, well equipped modern laboratories and Seminar Halls, Student Resource Centre with Mess and Cafeterias, state of art Auditorium, picturesque Amphitheatre with a seating capacity of 1500, 7 Residential blocks for Faculty /Staff and 05 Hostel blocks with a capacity upto 3000 beds.

Every department has a well-equipped chamber for Director / HOI and senior faculty members, spacious cubicles for faculty members and office for support staff. Departments have Seminar Halls for guest lectures and other activities, Students Lounge, Common Rooms / Rest Rooms for female faculty members and students. Adequate facility of separate washrooms for faculty members and male – female students on each floor has been provided. All academic blocks have elevators which are used by students and staff.

University has two Battery Operated Cars for internal movement which is also used by specially abled persons. Ramps have also been provided in each academic block and in hostels for specially abled persons. It is with pride, we say, that AUR is a ‘Specially Abled Person’ friendly campus.

The University also has ground tracking solar power generation system. This along with the panels installed on the terrace has been generating a power of one megawatt. The changeover to LED lights in the campus has been started in a phased manner to give a boost to our green campus initiative.

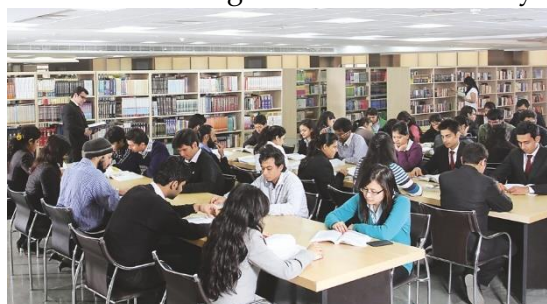

3.4 LIBRARY FACILITIES

University has a huge central library housed in an area of approx 1475 Sq Mtr with holding of books over 40 thousand offering students a great opportunity for updating their knowledge. University also has online resources which students can access and where about 10 lakhs plus resources already registered.

Access to e-journals, databases etc. is provided through ‘Amizone’ (web portal) (www.amizone.net) which students can access from University as well as their home also.

University Library building is centrally located, well laid out, and aesthetically designed to make it an inviting place with the ambiance that is suitable for learning. Library buildings have provision for both individual and group studies making room for interaction, discussion and quiet studies. Adequate space is provided for browsing and relaxed reading. Libraries also have carrels as well as research scholars/faculty rooms for quiet and serious studies.

Libraries are equipped with adequate number of signboards and guides for smoother and convenient movement users. The library has open access to its collection for all student, faculty and staff. All buildings have fire detection alarm and fire fighting systems installed. Library buildings are also having ramp, escalators and lifts for easy and convenient access to differently - abled users.

To provide uninterrupted access to digital resources, 22 Multimedia Internet ready PCs with Scanner and Printer facility are available for students in the Library.

For security reasons, the Library is placed under IP Camera surveillance.

5.2 COURSE PREPAREDNESS OF FACULTY

University's Quest for Excellence, desire to bring global trends in the curricula and extensive use of IT enabled teaching and learning practices, has resulted in preparing students with well-honed skills compatible with the Global Market.

At Amity, Quality Teaching is fostered with the use of innovative pedagogical techniques to produce learning outcomes for students. It involves several dimensions, like the effective design of curriculum and course content, a variety of learning contexts (including guided independent study, project-based learning, collaborative learning, experimentation, etc.), soliciting and using feedback, and effective assessment of learning outcomes. It also involves well-adapted learning environments and student support services.

Fostering quality teaching is a multi-level endeavor at Amity. Support for quality teaching is practiced and monitored at three interdependent levels :

- Individual level : including initiatives that help teachers achieve their mission, encouraging them to innovate and to support improvements in student learning and adopt a learner-oriented focus.
- Program level : comprising actions to measure and enhance the design, content and delivery of the programs within a department or a school.
- At the institution level : including projects such as policy design, and support to organisation and internal quality assurance systems.

Amity prepares students for entry to an environment that is characterised by greater uncertainty, speed, risk, complexity and interdisciplinary working and equip them with appropriate skills, knowledge, values and attributes to thrive in it. There is a strong drive to build and create knowledge together with an understanding of working life and reformulate the concept of knowledge in learning situations. Strong connections with working life through different academic projects provide authentic opportunities to learn both generic and professional competencies as well as to build networks and pathways for employment after graduation.

The salient points of the pedagogy are :

1. Detailed Course Delivery Plan
 - a. Learning objectives of the course.
 - b. Continuous assessment scheme, i.e. components, schedule and feedback.
 - c. Common thread through the course objectives, syllabus, pedagogy and the assessment scheme.
 - d. Listing topic wise allocation of sessions.
 - e. List of text and references (numbers and quality).
2. Power Point Presentations for all the sessions (1 credit course requires 10-12 hours of teaching and for one-hour teaching, ideally 6-8 slides).
3. Other Teaching Material
 - a. Teaching notes and material in addition to the prescribed text.
 - b. Guidelines on short projects.
 - c. Write-up on term paper.
 - d. Relevant articles and papers.
 - e. Tutorial sheets, as defined in the program structure.
 - f. Experiments to be carried out in labs, their objectives and methodology.
 - g. Use of videos/ films, including the objective to be achieved.
4. Making the Course Practice Oriented
 - a. Field/industry visits, their planning, objectives and summary report leading to evaluation.

- b. Projects.
 - c. Case studies and other exercises.
 - d. Guest lectures/panel discussions.
5. General guidelines for students regarding attendance, punctuality, meeting the deadlines, chamber consultation hours, prior self-study to be undertaken etc.
 6. Finally the efforts are made to judge how much rigor the course has created for the students. In a professional program, normally the mandate is that a student has to put in 2-3 hours of self-study for each hour of classroom teaching.

5.3 SYSTEM OF EDUCATION

Semester System

Amity University follows a semester system, which is in conformity with the global practices and standards. The Course curriculum of one year is taught in two semesters, i.e. 17-18 weeks each. The Semester system promotes greater interaction between faculty members and students and permits more meaningful term paper and research assignments.

Grade System

The level of students' academic performance is the aggregate of continuous evaluation & the end term examination and is reflected by letter grades on a Ten Point Scale. Letter grades (A+, A, A-, B+, B, B-, C+, C, F) have points associated with them in quantified hierarchy and have qualitative meaning. Semester Grade Point Average (SGPA) & Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA) are calculated based on the students' performance in Semester(s) & overall performance, respectively.

Amity University follows Absolute Grading as well as Relative Grading depending upon the strength of students in a particular program & batch. Students are required to maintain minimum SGPA & CGPA to pass a semester and promotion to the next semester and qualify for Degree/Diploma.

100% Attendance

Every student in Amity University is required to achieve 100% attendance in all the Lectures, Tutorials and Practicals and Seminars arranged for the respective course during the semester. However, a relaxation up to a maximum of 25% is granted in case of contingencies. A minimum of 75% attendance is required to appear in the examinations. 100% attendance criteria ensure academic excellence, disciplinary approach and growth of the student.

Internal Evaluation System

The scheme of examinations & evaluation is one of the most important components of judging the academic performance and development of the students. Therefore, in Amity, the students are assessed at regular intervals. 30% weightage is given to continuous/internal assessment in a semester wherein 3-4 evaluation components with weightages are defined. It covers Class Test, Viva, Quiz, Case Discussion /Presentation /Analysis, Home Assignment, Project, Seminar, Term Paper, Attendance etc.

5.4 CURRICULA & SYLLABI

The detailed course curriculum of all the programs in Amity University is reviewed at regular intervals as per the industry requirements. For this, many points are considered such as feedback reports on the placements, employability of the passed-out students, latest developments in the technology, statutory compliances of various bodies, etc. The course syllabus is first examined and evaluated by an expert committee which is then reviewed by the Board of Studies of the institution for recommendations to the Academic Council for approval.

The Program Structure is prepared for each Program that includes a semester-wise course (core and electives) to be taught, any internship to be undergone, project/dissertation as per requirement of the program curricula. Each course contains details of the course code, classroom hours, practical/lab classes, tutorials, self-study hours and credit units.

The credit units attached to each course are defined in terms of contact hours, i.e. Lectures (L), Tutorials (T) and Practicals (P). Towards earning credits in terms of contact hours, 1 lecture and 1 tutorial per week are rated as 1 credit each and 2 practical hours per week are rated as 1 credit. In a full-time degree Program, a student is required to earn on an average 25-30 credit units per semester. The credit units attached to Summer Internship/ Training (8-10 weeks), fieldwork etc. are included in this total.

As a mandatory requirement, 'Boards of Studies' are constituted for each Institution after approval of the President for the structuring of Academic Programs, viz. framing of Curricula, Syllabi, and Scheme of Evaluation, etc. The Various Boards of Studies hold their meetings and after rigorous scrutiny, the course structure and curricula of the Academic Programs offered are implemented with the approval of the Academic Council.

5.5 CHOICE BASED CREDIT SYSTEM

In accordance with the guidelines of the University Grants Commission, Amity University has implemented the Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) Programme in which the students have a choice to choose from the prescribed courses, across the courses being offered by the University, which are referred as core, elective or minor and they can learn at their own pace and the entire assessment is graded-based on a credit system.

The basic idea is to look into the needs of the students with the aim to keep themselves up-to-date with development of higher education in India and abroad. CBCS aims to redefine the curriculum keeping pace with the liberalisation and globalisation in education. CBCS allows students an easy mode of mobility to various educational institutions spread across the world along with the facility of transfer of credits earned by students.

5.6 ACADEMIC CHANGES DURING THE YEAR

- **Programme Review & Credit restructuring** -Departments have organized Board of Studies (BoS) and Industry advisory board (IAB) meetings and taken domain related updates which they further incorporated in the ongoing programmes and restructured credits. We have harvested some time by above credit restructuring and utilized in organizing co - curricular activities. University has ensured programme upgradation in line with industrial requirement to prepare future ready students.

- **Assessment design for teaching- learning** -In consideration of continuous COVID-19 pandemic in the Academic year 2020-21 also, University have adopted online platform for teaching-learning and evaluation. We have relooked assessment tools and implement followings :
 - Replaced traditional assignment with group presentation
 - Replaced industrial visits with survey-based industry insight report.
 - Replaced routine viva-voce/quiz with industrial case based
- **Strengthening Online Examination** - University collects the stakeholder's feedback and believes in loop completion, in the same line, examination related feedback has been discussed in examination committee. Following have recently incorporated :
 - Constituted one committee by taking one faculty from each department to rectify students' grievances related to online examination on the spot.
 - Declaration of the result within 15 days.
 - Option of MCQ & OBE

5.7 MONTHLY STRUCTURED MEETINGS

With an aim to build a sense of community and engage all stakeholders in decision making, as well as to improve the governance of various facts of academics & administration, structured meetings are being organized every month with stakeholders as below:

- I. Meeting with Teaching HOIs- Every first Thursday of Month- To discuss/resolve the issues and strengthening of the Academics Matters.
- II. Meeting with Non-Teaching HODs- Every second Thursday of Month- To discuss/resolve the issues related to general administration and other non-academics issues.
- III. Meeting with Students Representatives- Every third Thursday of Month- To discuss/resolve the issues of students related to academics and infrastructure facilities including mess, sports, extra curriculum activities etc.

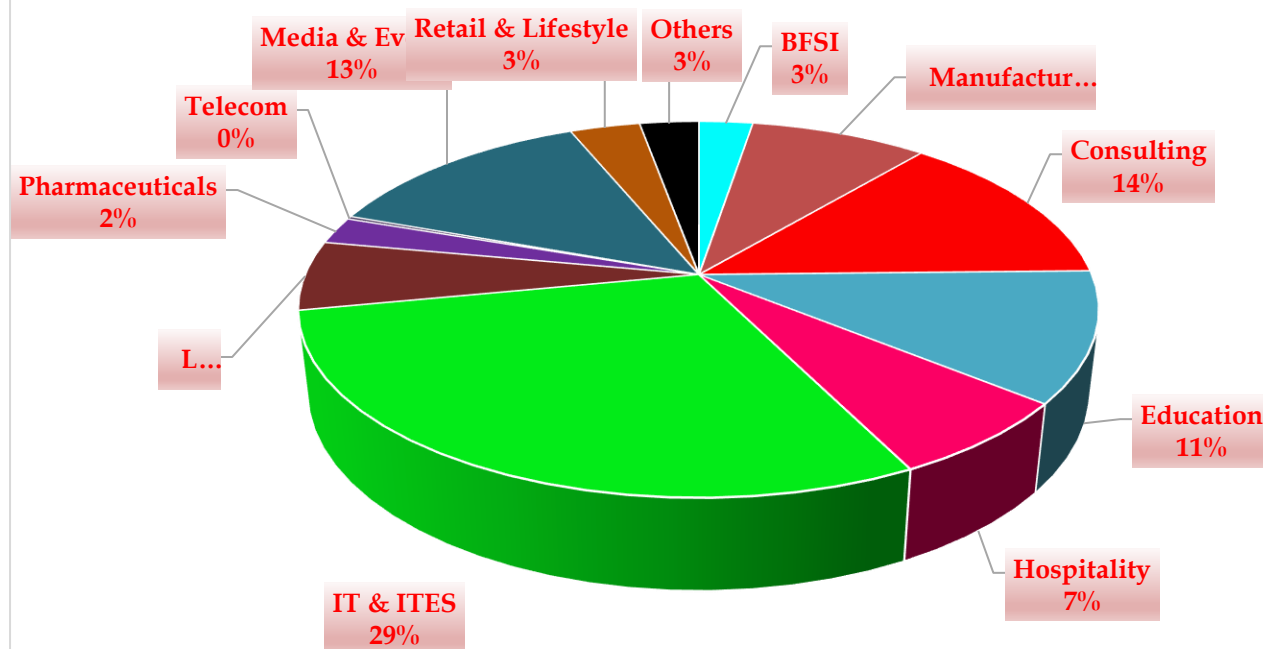

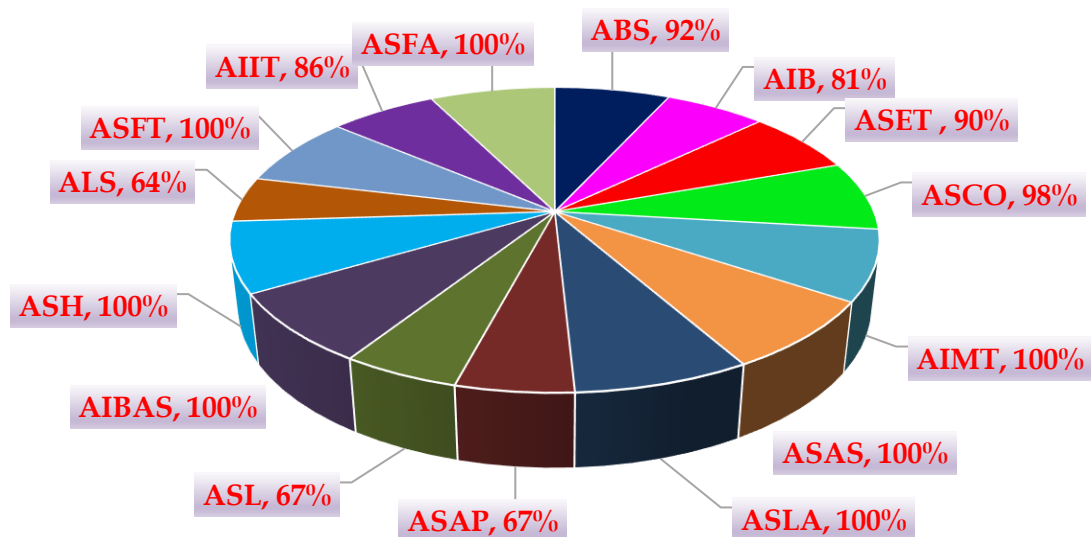
PLACEMENT STATISTICS SECTOR WISE, SCHOOL WISE, PACKAGE WISE

COVID-19 Pandemic:
Moving Forward



The Covid -19 pandemic has brought the life of all the people across the world in a standstill and has tremendously affected the educational sector also. The whole world especially the students and teachers are glued in front of the electronic devices. 2020-21 was a season for social distance and self-isolation – a time when we refrained from embracing each other. But at AUR, it was also a season when we came together to meet the many challenges of the COVID-19 pandemic. Drawing on wells of goodwill and spirit, we found new and creative ways to deliver our programs, extend our community, and pursue our mission.



Faculty came together and transitioned to online teaching, doing their very best to deliver learning experiences marked by care and personal connection. Despite the pandemic, academic enrolments increased, and our courses and instructors were highly rated and appreciated by students. Public lectures, concerts, and community education programs, all moved online with great success, deepening our commitment to reach beyond our campus to the community at large.

Staff came together to carry on their crucial work – some pivoted to working from home, while other front-line staff continued on campus. All demonstrated resilience, commitment, and creativity in the face of an enormous disruption to their normal work environment.

Our resident staff came together to build a community, despite protocols that suspended community suppers and restricted sports, dances, and other social activities. They were also impeccable public health citizens, embracing the idea that wearing masks and following other guidelines was the best way to care for each other during this crisis. However, some cases of COVID-19 were reported among our residence staff during the second lockdown in April-May 2021.

STRENGTHEN OF ONLINE LEARNING SYSTEM

The pandemic somewhat has hindered but could not stop the untiring efforts of AUR to achieve excellence in the fields of education and research. Amid the unavoidable restrictions the faculty members have also done their bit, classes have been held regularly in virtual mode. Since the hands-on practical classes could not be held, teachers and instructors made videos to make the students understand the practical part of the courses.



Amity University Rajasthan has been among the pioneers in country to implement an Online learning system to ensure continuous learning during COVID-19 pandemic. Prompt action from faculty and staff helped students save precious time and kept them engaged in productive work. Removing the barrier of geographical boundaries and location, an Online Learning system also helped to develop a sense of responsibility and discipline amongst students.

Faculty members were already using Learning Management System and blended teaching as part of their pedagogy and academic delivery. With very little effort, it was possible for them to switch to complete online teaching.

Amity University's proprietary Learning Management system 'Amizone' proved a great help as every student had access to course content and schedules after moving to their home. The portal is also easily accessible on any device including mobile phones.

HYBRID MODE CLASSES

In the month of March 2021, Government relaxed the restriction and allowed Higher Education Institutes for the hybrid mode education with standard protocols and precautions. Each classroom had students less than half the actual capacity and full social distancing was followed. Hybrid mode of lecturing was followed, and classes were running simultaneously for both, the students attending the class in- person and those attending in virtual mode from their home. The university devised a mechanism of holding its classes in hybrid mode, equipped all lecture rooms with required technical know-how & electronic gadgets for facilitating hybrid mode lecturing and realized the same very efficiently to the fullest satisfaction of students.



Due to exponential rise in numbers of COVID cases in Jaipur and across the country in the month of April 2021 and in accordance with new state govt. guidelines, it was decided by the management to allow 'Work Form Home' for all students, teaching/non-teaching staff from 12/04/2021 again and classes were again brought on online mode.



ONLINE FACULTY DEVELOPMENT PROGRAMS

All faculty of the university were trained in the methods of online teaching, evaluation, assessment and conduct of exams. Special programmes were conducted to help faculty make online classes more interesting, effective, and interactive, as well as to safeguard themselves from cyber-attacks while conducting online sessions. A number of FDPs were conducted this year to improve content, delivery, and execution of faculty development programs across domains of teaching-learning, research, health and well-being, new technologies, industry, IPR and innovation.

ONLINE EVENTS AND ACTIVITIES

AUR conducted above 100 online national and international webinars related to education and COVID-19 pandemic during the year through various schools and institutions. National and International Conferences, Seminars, and Workshops were also conducted online due to Covid-19 thus bringing International community together virtually on a common platform. All Co-Curriculum and Extra Curricular activities were also done online. Many competitions were held online to engage the students. The university celebrated many festivals and special days on online mode.

COVID-19 MANAGEMENT

Several thermal scanners have been procured to screen the temperature at all the gates of the AUR. Regular sanitization has been conducted in all the establishments, premises, road, and pathways at weekly intervals and also in a need-based manner in the AUR campus and hand sanitizers have been kept at all entry of the academic blocks.



VACCINATION STATUS

Nearly all of staff and faculty members of AUR are vaccinated against the novel coronavirus with the first dose and many have taken second dose too till the end of academic year. Vaccination is mandatory for anyone visiting campus and proof of vaccination is asked. Students have also been motivated for vaccination and without vaccination entry in campus was prohibited.

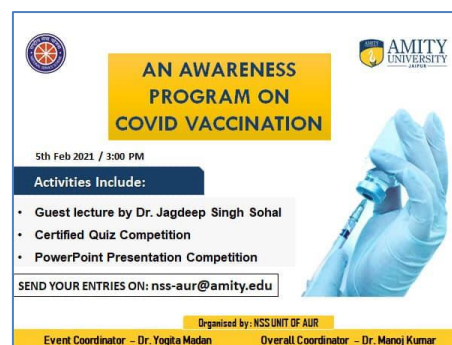

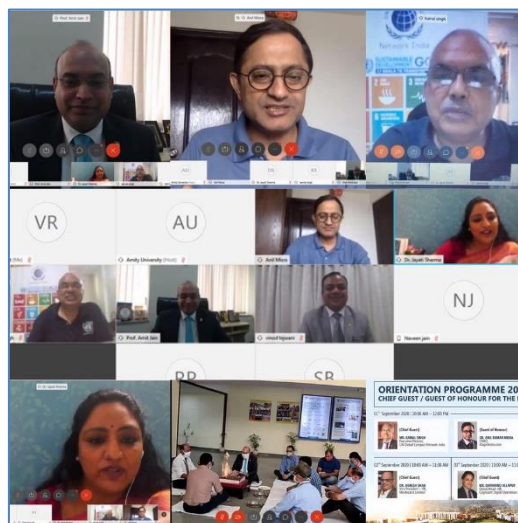
Day 1 - The first day was dedicated for online registrations.

Hostels, Discipline and Anti-ragging by respective heads. Post lunch, event- Talent Hunt was scheduled.

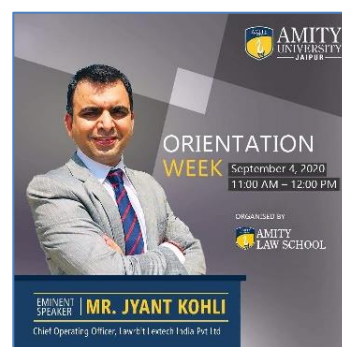

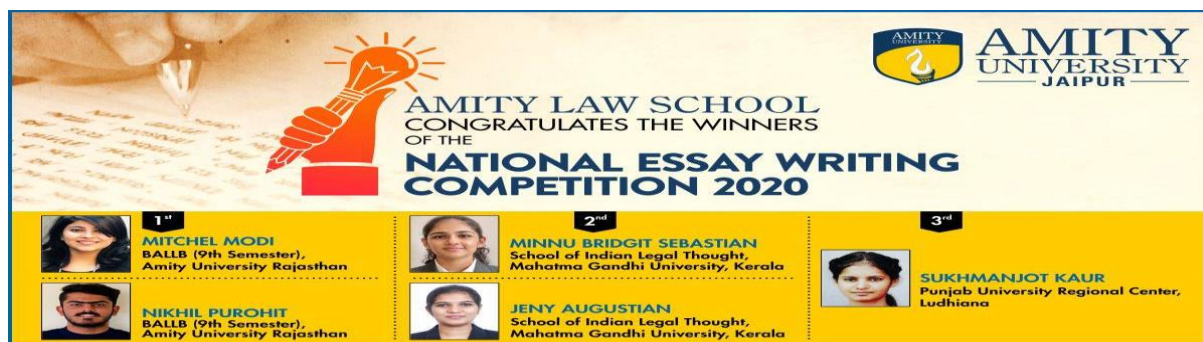
DECEMBER - 2020
