MINUTES OF 11TH BOARD OF STUDIES – POLITICAL SCIENCE

- 1. Introduction of new paper 'Political Ideologies' in first semester and removing 'Political Philosophy' from the structure.
- 2. Removing the term 'revolutionary terrorists' from Indian Nationalism and replacing it with 'revolutionary leaders of India'
- 3. Renaming 'Indian state and politics after independence' as 'government and politics in India'
- 4. Shifting 'state politics in India' from third semester to second semester
- 5. Introducing new paper 'major world constitutions' in place of 'Plato's political philosophy'
- 6. Shifting paper 'Indian constitution' to core paper category
- 7. Shifting 'feminism: theory and practice' to domain elective in second semester
- 8. 'Indian constitution' should be given the code bps 201 and 'government and politics in India' as bps 202
- 9. 'global themes in development and politics' to be shifted in domain elective in second semester
- 10. Code bps 203 should be given to 'state politics in India'
- 11. Code bps 204 should be given to 'major world constitutions'
- 12. Restructuring of syllabus of 'Indian political thought i' in third semester
- 13. Paper 'political philosophy ii' shifted from second semester to third semester with restructuring of syllabus and renaming as 'western political thought i with code bps 302. 'state politics in India' shifted to second semester
- 14. bps 306 shifted from domain elective to core paper renamed as 'local administration in india' as bps 303
- 15. Shifting 'public administration i' from fourth semester to third semester as bps 304
- 16. Shifting 'social movements in India' from third semester to sixth semester's domain elective bps 606
- 17. Shifting 'feminism: theory and practice' to second semester's domain elective bps 207
- 18. Shifting 'human rights in comparative perspective' to sixth semester as bps 602
- -19. Reshuffling 'Gandhi and his philosophy' and 'Ambedkar and Dalit movement' from sixth semester to third semester's domain elective as bps 305 and bps 306 respectively. Also restructuring the syllabus for both papers.
- 20. Shifting 'growth of communalism and politics from core paper to domain elective in sixth semester.
- 21. Restructuring of syllabus of 'Indian political thought ii' in fourth semester
- 22. Introducing 'western political thought ii' with restructured syllabus as bps 402. The western political thought paper has been divided between third semester and fourth semester with restructuring of syllabus.
- 23. Shifting 'international relations' from fifth semester to fourth semester and dividing in two parts 'international relations I' (bps 403) for fourth semester and 'international relations ii'
 - (bps 501) for fifth semester with restructuring of syllabus. Renaming of 'post-cold war world politics as 'international relations ii' and shifting it to fifth semester.

- 24. Shifting 'Vivekananda and Vedanta' from sixth semester to fourth semester's domain elective as bps 406. Also restructuring of syllabus
- 25. Renaming 'cinema and politics' as 'media and politics' and shifting from fourth semester to sixth semester's domain elective bps 607 and restructuring of the syllabus
- 26. shifting political violence: concepts and trends from sixth semester to fourth semester's domain elective bps 406
- 27. In place of 'traditions in western political philosophy' in fifth semester, 'dissertation (proposal and review of literature') should be introduced. Already the western political thought has been divided in two parts
- 28. A new paper 'modern political analysis' should be introduced in sixth semester as bps 602
- 29. 'growth of communalism and politics should be shifted to sixth semester domain elective
- 30. Second part of 'dissertation-final submission' should be restructured.
- 31. Papers 'environmental politics in India', 'social movements in India' as bps 605, 606
- 32. 'media and politics in India' should be placed in core papers of fifth semester
- 33. Shifting human rights in comparative perspective to core paper in sixth semester

MINUTES FOR THE BOARD OF STUDIES(POLITICAL SCIENCE) , HELD ON 23RD OCTOBER, 2018

The Board Of Studies meeting was held on 23rd October, 2018. The meeting was chaired by Dr.Gautam Kumar Sinha. The internal subject experts were Dr. Harshlika Khangarot, Assistant Professor and Dr. Prashant Mishra., Associate Professor. The external subject experts for industry and academia were Shri.S.S.Bissa (Retd.IAS) and Dr.Nidhi Lekha Sharma respectively. The Board of Studies resolved to forward the following suggestions to the Academic Council for the implementation in the next academic session (2019-2020):-

- a. The core paper of 'British Colonialism in India' should be replaced by a new paper 'Basic Principles of Political Science' in the first semester.

 Justification- British Colonialism is more history oriented and its syllabi is overlapping Indian Nationalism(First Semester). The most important justification given is that the student of Honors should first be made familiar with the basic fundamentals of the subject, which are incorporated in Basic Principles of Political Science. A proposed syllabus is attached.
- b. A new paper 'Indian Constitution' should be included in the second semester in place of 'Environmental Politics in India'. The honors course for Political Science is not complete if it does not have the Indian Constitution study. Such paper must be a core paper for the students so that they can understand the various aspects of the subject better. The paper shall not only give the knowledge of the articles but also about the political structure in India. 'Environmental Politics' is an advanced paper therefore should not be taught at the second semester level but later in programme. Proposed syllabus is attached.

- c. The core paper 'Plato's Political Philosophy' should be shifted to domain elective and Indian Constitution should be made a core paper. As already there is a core paper of Political Philosophy in the second semester.
- d. In the paper 'Indian Nationalism', module Four, should be renamed as Significance and Brief History of Revolts Against Oppressive British Rule. Topics to be added-Early Revolutions and Revolts like Sanyasi Andolan, Santhal Uprising, Barrackpur Mutiny and Revolutions which paved the way to Indian independence. Contribution of Vinayak Damodar Savarkar, Bhagat Singh, Chandra Shekhar Azad and their companions. The word revolutionary terrorist should be removed.
- e. In module sixth, The modifications proposed are to add the contribution of Lokmanya Balgangadhar Tilak and Swaraj Leaders, Morley Minto Reforms 1909, Montague Chelmsford Reforms 1919 and Government of India Act 1935 as the preview of Indian Constitution. Sardar Vallabh Bhai's contribution and a brief history of Integration of Princely States should be added.
- f. Sub titles should be added in Indian Political Thought with the main headings.
- g. Machiavelli should be removed from Greek Political Thought as he is not a Greek Thinker.
