


Fig. 1: Discipline-Wise Scopus Indexed Publications of AUM.

Collaboration with NGOs for SDGs

Amity Institute of Liberal Arts (AILA) at the Amity University Maharashtra collaborating with the various NGOs like Udan Foundation, YRG Care, Kotak Foundation, Wockhardt Foundation, Reliance Foundation, Shree Mukti Sanghatana, SWASTI, Childline 1098, Khula Asman, TISS CSR Hub, and Sanjeevani – Life beyond Cancer.

Through these collaborations, the Bachelor of Social Work (BSW) students actively participate in a field visits, social work, and community activities. The outcome of these activities is to provide awareness among the poor and deprived sections of society. The University's contribution is for the various Sustainable Development Goals such as Good Health and Wellbeings, Zero Hunger, No Poverty, and many more.

Amity Institute of Liberal Arts - AUM has communicated with the five schools from the Bhatan village near Amity University Maharashtra, and the Students have started the fieldwork. Faculty Ms. Meera Limaye, Faculty member AILA initiated the Activity with the woman group and trained them for bread making and selling and starting a shop at Bhatan Village.



GOAL 3: Good Health and Well-being


Webinar on World Cancer Day 04/02/2021


an understanding and importance of Biotechnology and its applications in the field of Cancer awareness, diagnosis and prevention.








National Level Programming Competition (NLPC 2020): 5th November & 7th November 2020

The norm of about 150 articles needed to conduct a good literature review and justified why was it needed. In the second part speaker spoke about the five core principles one should follow in conducting the literature review. The importance of identifying correct research problems, ways and means to formulate relevant research questions. These were the few topics covered well by the speaker.

The icing on the cake was the personal excelsheet/journal shared explaining, specific methods to follow while reading the articles to make notes as we conduct the literature review. This can be an effective tool, if maintained from the beginning, could enable one to identify the gap correctly.

Many questions were raised by the scholars and professors alike. The prominent one being how a scholar can guesstimate that when should one stop gathering articles and the speakers answer deserved a huge round of applause. Overall it was a fruitful learning session. The total Attendees are 39.


Woman Tracking Access : Graduation (Study Completion) Rate


E-Magazine "Parivartan" launch
