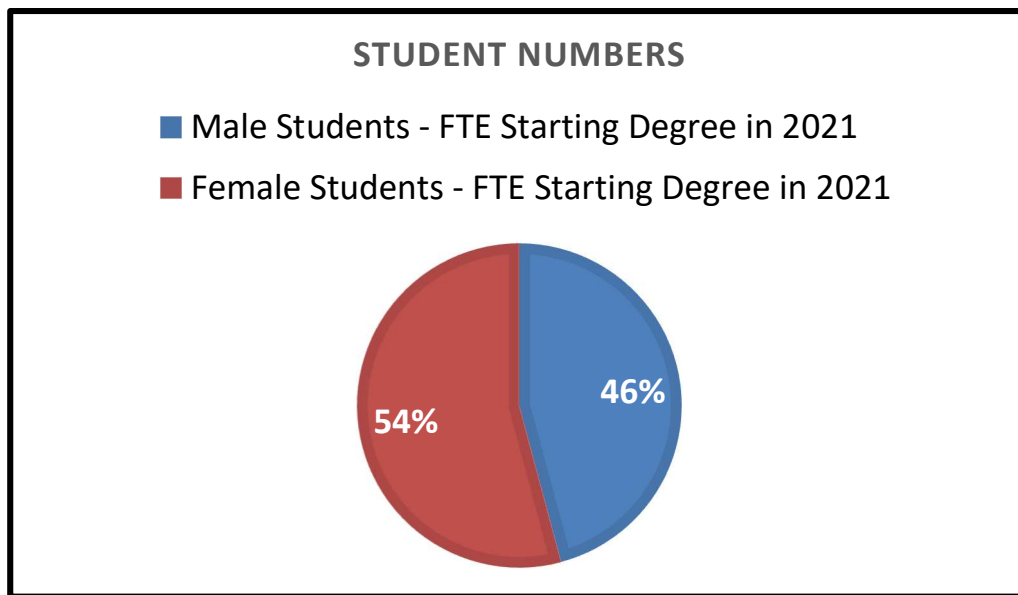

Tracking Woman Application Rate 2021

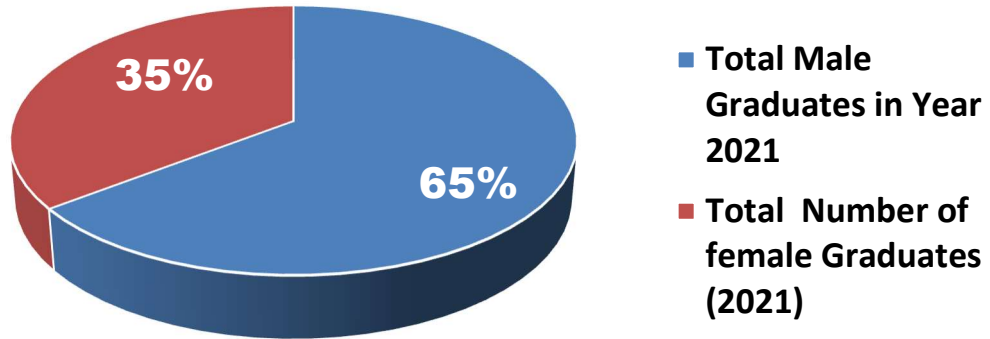

Woman Tracking Access : Graduation (Study Completion) Rate

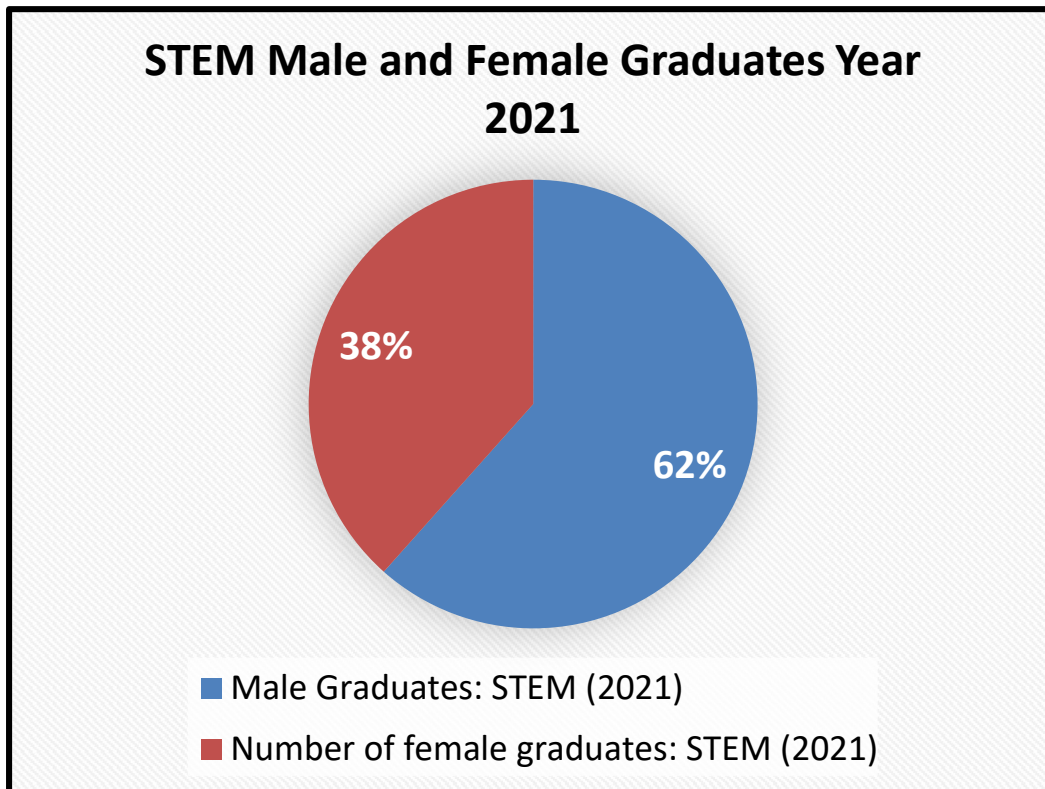

E-Magazine “Parivartan” launch

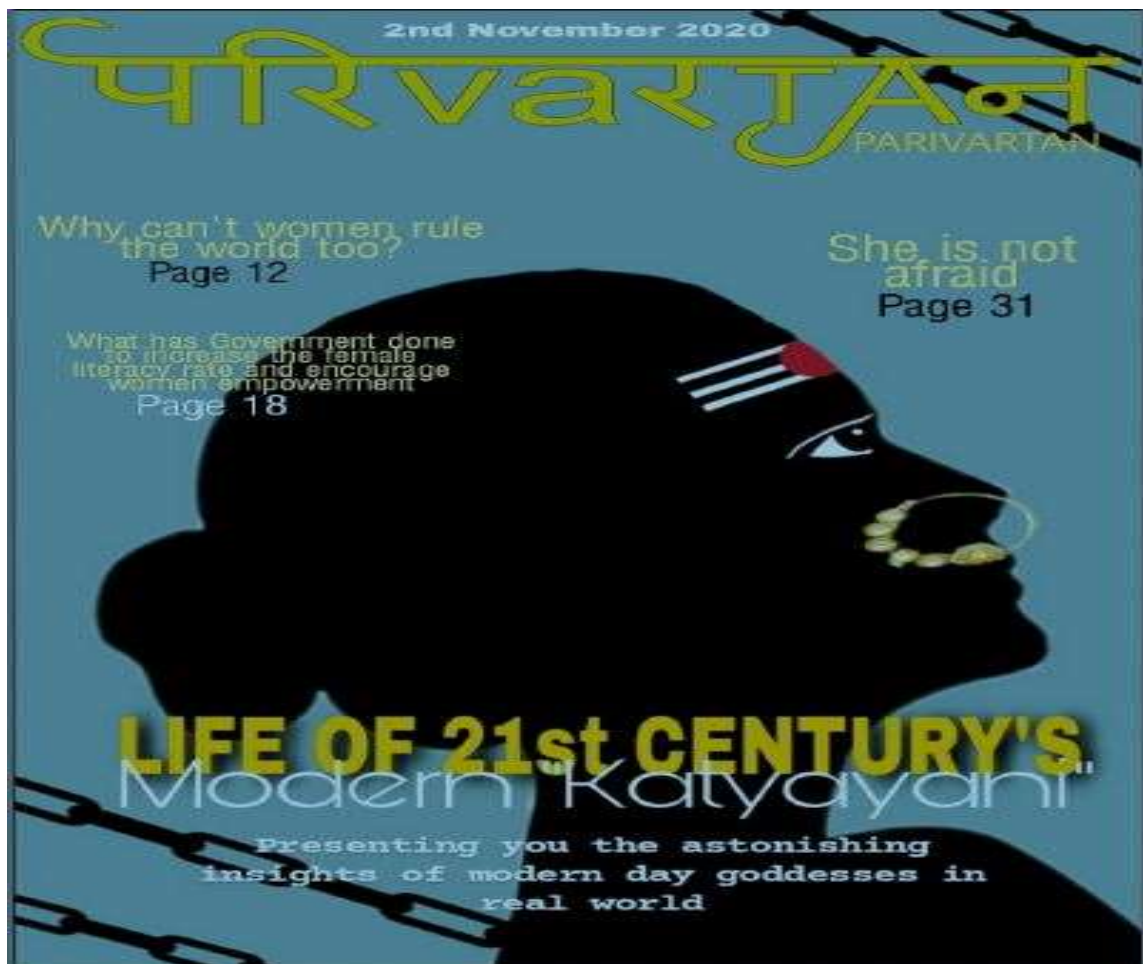

The practice of a patriarchal society in India leads to many cases of harassment that women still have to go through, as Indians in several areas all over the country, face a lack of awareness regarding basic humanity and rights as a citizen. This year, we witnessed many such cases, a recent one being the Hathras Gang Rape, in which the victim fought for her life for two weeks but failed to survive. Rape is a crime which causes many sexual disorders and infections, making the person emotionally and physically. This often leads to suicide by victims due to a feeling of extreme shame and overwhelming helplessness. There is a very small number of women, who have the courage to survive this ordeal and fight for justice. Family members and peers play an extremely important role in this. There are many areas, where the families do not even blame the victim to be their family member, who breaks her completely, and she loses courage and confidence to face the world. This is not the only issue that women have to face, but the after-effects of such an ordeal are extremely terrible, both on the woman, as well as on her family members. India needs to be much more vigilant and aware regarding this issue as far as possible.

The NGO "Men Against Violence and Abuse" works for women safety but not on women. The NGO works on the men! They work on creating awareness about women and their issues and they discuss such topics with the teenage

boys in order to make them aware about these problems in an effort to decrease the crime rate against women and teach them how to respect women. Such kind of efforts need to be taken by both men and women to make this world a better place to live. Women need to be safe at every place to expect complete utilisation of their potential. Statistics have shown that a safe environment for a woman makes her comfortable and thus she is able to contribute her best for the company thereby helping the economy to grow. There has also been a downward trend in violence against women – the number of women not facing physical and sexual violence has gone up from 62.6 percent to 70.5 percent between 2005-06 to 2015-16.
