Social Outreach Activity (Mask Distribution) by Amity University Chhattisgarh in Association with ITBP.

The ongoing novel coronavirus disease (COVID-19) pandemic has already infected millions worldwide and, with no vaccine available, interventions to mitigate transmission are urgently needed. While there is broad agreement that travel restrictions and social distancing are beneficial in limiting spread, recommendations around face mask use are inconsistent.

Some countries have seen an enormous demand for face masks from the public, with supplies being diminished and shortages reported. Even with lesser public demand, the United States reported mask shortages among healthcare workers. Recognizing the need for masks, several countries banned exportation of face masks, and the Central Epidemic Command Center in Taiwan made efforts to increase mask production in January. In facing such resource shortages, it is vital that limited supplies are used effectively. Clearly, protection of staff at healthcare facilities is of critical importance, but allocating additional resources optimally among the general population can offer further benefits.

Amity University Chhattisgarh in association with ITBP, manufactured the cotton masks and distributed to the people living in the villages near to Amity University Campus.

Social Outreach Activity (Food Distribution) by Amity University Chhattisgarh

Food insecurity is a serious social and public health problem which is exacerbated by the COVID-19 pandemic especially in slum/poor community. Food insecurity among low-income and disadvantaged families was found to be a serious problem during the COVID-19 pandemic. The study suggests that the relief support plan and policies should be focused on the implementation of immediate sustainable food security strategies to prevent hunger, malnutrition, and mental health problems among the most vulnerable groups in the community.

In addition, small farmers or vulnerable people should be supported financially. Facilities should change the working conditions and maintain the health and safety of employees by altering safety measures. Food protectionist policies should be avoided to prevent an increase in food prices

Amity University Chhattisgarh conducted various Food Distribution Activities under Social Outreach Activities for the people of Math Village and for the Covid Warriors (Police). AUC distributed food packets to all people living in the village and the police personnel's who were on duty during the lockdown period. Also, AUC requested Police Officers to do the honor of food distribution.

An assessment to determine the priority needs of those affected should be one of the first stages in planning the relief response. Assessments of the need for food assistance generally determine;

- Whether food assistance is needed,
- How much is needed and what types of food,
- Who needs food assistance and for how long,
- Locally available resources.
